



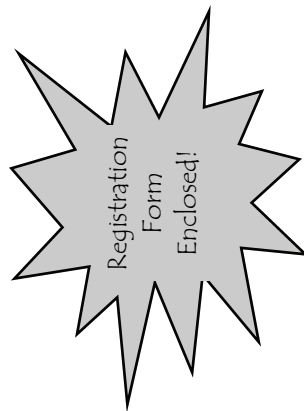

SUMMER 2009 REGISTRATION POLICIES

Step One: Lesson times, lengths and number of lessons to be given are scheduled with the teacher *first*. To accommodate schedules, the summer lesson period can be as short as 4 weeks or as long as 10 weeks, determined by teacher and student together. Classes and ensembles (Nashville Youth Orchestra Program, Kindermusik, Theory) cannot be prorated. Lessons missed by students are not made up; lessons missed by teachers will be rescheduled.

Step Two: Complete the registration process and let the music begin! Register by completing the form on the attached page. To calculate summer tuition for lessons, multiply the rate times the number of lessons. To pay: Pay via cash or check (credit cards are not accepted) or sign the deferred payment agreement on the registration form. Billing fees are applied to deferred balances. (Complete Deferment Policy is available in the Main Office.)
