Vanderbilt Plays Host to Lipscomb

After playing seven of its last eight games away from home, the Vanderbilt baseball team returns to Hawkins Field for four consecutive games this week, beginning Wednesday against Lipscomb at 3 p.m. The Commodores (11-8) dropped their Southeastern Conference series opener last weekend in Starkville, Miss, losing two of three games to No. 10 Mississippi State. Lipscomb (6-10) swept a two-game series from Austin Peay last weekend to snap a five-game losing streak.

Wednesday's game marks the second meeting between the two schools in the last eight days. Vanderbilt defeated the Bisons 6-5, last Tuesday, March 11. Tony Mansolino knocked in three runs and John Kaye went 2-for-4 with two RBI as Vanderbilt built a 6-0 lead over Lipscomb through sixth innings. But the Commodores had to withstand a four-run ninth-inning rally by the Bisons.

Commodore freshman right-hander Jensen Lewis (1-3, 2.81 ERA) will start against Lipscomb. Used mostly in late-game situations, Lewis has only one other collegiate start under his belt. Lewis threw four innings of three-hit, six-strikeout ball against Belmont on Feb. 26. Lipscomb has not yet announced its starter.

Vanderbilt leads the all-time series with Lipscomb, 33-8.

Vanderbilt Outlasts Lipscomb's Four-Run Ninth For 6-5 Win

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Tony Mansolino knocked in three runs and John Kaye went 2-for-4 with two RBI as Vanderbilt built a 6-0 lead over Lipscomb through sixth innings, but the Commodores had to withstand a four-run ninth-inning rally by the Bisons before winning, 6-5, Tuesday, March 10 at Hawkins Field. With the victory Vanderbilt records its sixth win in its last nine games to move to 10-6. Lipscomb drops to 4-10 on the season.

In his first collegiate start Commodore freshman right-hander Matt Buschmann (2-1) pitched five perfect innings and recorded five strikeouts in the win. Lipscomb starter Logan Good (1-3) allowed three hits, three walks and four runs (all earned) in the loss.

Vanderbilt scored the game's first two runs in the second inning on Mansolino's two-out two-RBI double down the left-field line that scored Worth Scott and Jeff Boutwell.

The Commodores pushed the lead to 3-0 in the third when Rucker Taylor scored from third base on a sacrifice fly by Cesar Nicolas.

Vanderbilt Head Coach Tim Corbin

After nine seasons as an assistant coach at baseball power Clemson, Tim Corbin moves into the role of Commodore head coach in 2003 and looks to construct similar success at Vanderbilt.

Corbin helped the Tiger program produce more victories than all but four programs in the nation from 1994-2002. Clemson won more than 71 percent (434 wins, 172 losses) of its games, captured two Atlantic Coast Conference regular season titles, made nine appearances in the NCAA Tournament and fought its way to the **College World Series four times** (1995, 1996, 2000, and 2002) while Corbin assisted head coach Jack Leggett. **The Tigers ended the 2002 season with their ninth consecutive top 25 finish and their sixth top 10 finish since 1994.**

Joining Clemson as an assistant coach in 1994, Corbin worked his way up the Tiger coaching staff. Earning two promotions, Corbin received the title of assistant head coach in 1998 before becoming the associate head coach and recruiting coordinator in September 2001.

Along the way the organized, focused and enthusiastic understudy earned a national reputation as one of the most respected assistant coaches in the country. **He worked intensely while collecting nine talented recruiting classes — all of which were recognized among the top 25 in the nation.** His on-field work developing outfielders and hitters helped 20 Clemson players earn All-America accolades while 34 Tigers were later drafted to play professional baseball.

Corbin's dedication and attention to detail caught the eye of the national baseball publication *Baseball America* on numerous occasions. In 1997, it touted the Clemson coaching staff as one of the top five "College Recruiting Staffs" in the country. It later tabbed the 1999 Tiger freshman class as No. 1 nationally. **And in 2000, *Baseball America* and the American Baseball Coaches Association named Corbin its National Coach of the Year.**

In 2000, Southern California head coach Mike Gillespie served as skipper of the USA Baseball team and quickly chose Corbin as an assistant on his staff. The staff helped guide the Americans to a gold-medal finish at the World Championships in the Netherlands, setting a record for best winning percentage (.900).

Prior to his tenure at Clemson, Corbin served as head coach at Presbyterian College for six seasons beginning in 1988. Restarting a baseball program that laid dormant for several years, Corbin directed Presbyterian College from NAIA to Division II status, posting a 106-138 overall record. Along the way, Corbin guided the Blue Hose to three consecutive appearances in the South Atlantic playoffs (1991-93) while earning South Atlantic Coach of the Year honors in 1990.

He's also very knowledgeable about the game of baseball and did a great job working with our hitters and outfielders the past several years at Clemson."

Khalil Greene, 2002 National Player of the Year and former Clemson infielder recruited by Corbin. Greene was drafted by San Diego in first round (13th pick) of 2002 Draft.

"Coach Corbin is one of the most dedicated people I've ever met. Whether it's working out in the weightroom with the players or recruiting, once he decides to do something he goes full bore ahead."

"He helped me a lot with the hitting aspects of my game. He knows a lot of the intricacies of different players' swings. So anytime you go into a slump, he knows the little things to point out and says them in a way to motivate you and help you turn around your swing."

"I've enjoyed knowing him off the field and going to his house and hanging out. I consider him as much a friend as any of the players on my team. He's a great person."

An inning later, Kaye doubled to left-center field and scored two batters later on a sacrifice fly by Mansolino to give Vanderbilt a 4-0 advantage after four innings.

The Commodores' lead grew to 6-0 in the fifth when Kaye's one-out two-RBI single to center field scored Nicolas and Worth Scott.

Vanderbilt reliever John Scott took over for Buschmann in the sixth and carried the perfect game into the seventh before Lipscomb's Brian Passons pushed a bunt over the head of John Scott on the mound for an infield single. Nathan McCorkle brought in Passons three batters later on a double into left-center field to make the score 6-1.

That was the score of the game entering the ninth when VU reliever Blake Owen gave up four runs (three earned) on two hits. Passons, who led off the inning with a walk, scored the Bisons first run of the inning when he came home from third base on a RBI single through the left side of the infield by McCorkle. With one out, Chris Parker was hit by a pitch and later came home on RBI single by Todd Boucher. Lipscomb continued the rally on the next play when McCorkle came home on a wild pitch by Owen. One out later Lipscomb pulled to within a 6-5 score when Brett Pack, pinch running for Boucher, scored after VU short-stop Ryan Klosterman's throw to first base short hopped Cesar Nicolas, allowing Patrick O'Rourke to reach base.

Commodore reliever Jonathan Douillard then entered the game and recorded his first collegiate save, throwing three consecutive strikes to retire Ryan Royer with the game-ending strikeout.

Scouting Lipscomb

Lipscomb returns 17 lettermen and five starters from its 2002 squad that finished 24-24 overall. Chris Parker leads the Bison with a .327 average. His 18 hits are tied for most on the team with Nathan McCorkle. McCorkle leads all Bisons with 15 RBI.

Seth Kuwik has been strong out of the bullpen, registering a team-high 22 strikeouts to go along with a 1.40 ERA and 2-1 record in 19.1 innings.

Bisons' hitters own a .230 average. The pitching staff has a 5.47 team ERA.

A Look Back at Vanderbilt's Last Game Grand Slam Sparks 9-1 Victory, Series Win for Mississippi State Over Vanderbilt

STARKVILLE, Miss. — Brent Lewis' pinch-hit grand slam in the bottom of the fifth blew open a scoreless game and No. 10 Mississippi State cruised to a 9-1 win in the rubber match of its three-game Southeastern Conference series with Vanderbilt, Sunday, March 16, at Dudy Noble Field.

MSU starter Todd Nicholas (2-0), who carried a no hitter into the fifth inning, scattered four hits and recorded four strikeouts while walking three in 6.1 innings to earn the win. Freshman left-hander Ryan Mullins (1-2) took the loss.

Mullins pitched out of jams in the second, third and fourth inning before the Bulldogs scored in the fifth. A lead off single by Matthew Maniscalco, walk to Steve Gendron and infield single by Matthew Brinson loaded the bases for Brad Corley. Corley hit a sacrifice fly to right field that scored Maniscalco to give MSU a 1-0. Mullins was pulled for reliever Matt Buschmann who gave up a walk to Craig Tatum that reloaded the bases for Lewis.

The Bulldogs scored four more times in the

seventh on three consecutive RBI doubles off Commodore reliever John Scott. Jon Mungle's RBI double to right field scored Lewis. Maniscalco's double along the right-field line scored Thomas Berkery and Gendron's double off the left-field wall plated Mungle and Maniscalco.

The Commodores had their chances to get back in the game, trailing 5-0. In the fifth inning Matt McGraner was thrown out at home attempting to score on a passed ball with the bases loaded. After Rucker Taylor walked to reload the bases, Ryan Klosterman popped out to shallow right field and Cesar Nicolas flew out to center to end the inning.

In the sixth inning, Zach Simpson hit a one-out bases-loaded chopper to first base and legged out a single to score Ryan Godfrey from third to bring

Vanderbilt within a 5-1 score. But Warner Jones popped out to second and Rucker Taylor ground out to first to end the Commodore threat.

Next Up For VU

The Commodores play their SEC home opening series this weekend when Ole Miss comes to Hawkins Field. Game times are 7 p.m., on Friday, 4 p.m., on Saturday, and 1 p.m., on Sunday. Admission and concessions are \$1 on Saturday.

Klosterman Sets Single-Game Assists Record

Sophomore shortstop Ryan Klosterman set the Vanderbilt single-game record for assists with 11 against East Tennessee State in the Commodores' 5-4 win (2/18). The previous record was nine held by four former Commodores, including Terry Geshke (vs. Georgia [4/21/62]), Joey Jackson (vs. Rollins [3/4/86]), Dede Malmo (vs. Lipscomb [3/30/88]) and Brad Reese (vs. Memphis [3/11/90]).

While the Southeastern Conference does not have records for most assists, the NCAA record book lists only eight other players in collegiate baseball history to register more than 11 assists in a nine-inning game. The NCAA record is 14 set by Florida's Kevin Polcovich against Tennessee (4/27/91).

Klosterman recorded at least one assist in seven different innings. He was busiest in the second inning, when he made all three assists, and in the seventh and eighth innings when he lent a hand in two of the three outs.

Nicolas' Comeback Complete

Cesar Nicolas completed an amazing comeback when he made his first start of the season against East Tennessee State (2/18). The Vanderbilt junior infielder was inadvertently hit in the head with a swung bat, Jan.

18, in the batting cages adjacent to Hawkins Field. Nicolas suffered a mild concussion and broken temporal bones on the right side of his head.

Originally expected to miss the first two to three weeks of the season, Nicolas made his first appearance as a pinch hitter in both the season opener against Old Dominion and the following game against The Citadel.

Sowers Garners Preseason Attention

Jeremy Sowers has earned second team All-America honors from *Baseball America* and third team All-America accolades from Louisville Slugger and "Collegiate Baseball" newspaper entering the 2003 season. *Baseball America* also tabbed him as the third-best sophomore in the country (at any position).

Sowers and Oklahoma left-hander David Purcey, who also earned second-team honors, were the only two sophomore hurlers to receive recognition from the *Baseball America* listing that included three All-America teams, honoring 15 pitchers. Sowers and Mississippi State junior left-hander Paul Maholm were the only pitchers from the Southeastern Conference represented.

Sowers was one of nine sophomore pitchers and 63 players overall chosen to the three teams selected by Louisville Slugger and "Collegiate Baseball." Sowers, Maholm and LSU senior right-hander Jake Tompkins were the three SEC pitchers honored.

pitchers nationwide to earn Freshman All-America honors from Louisville Slugger and "Collegiate Baseball." As the Commodores' top pitcher, Sowers went 6-5 while leading Vanderbilt in wins (six), ERA (4.37), innings pitched (101.0), strikeouts (85) and pickoffs (12). His 85 strikeouts tied for sixth-most by SEC pitchers and first among all freshmen hurlers in the league. His strikeout total also ranked third all-time among freshmen pitchers at Vanderbilt. His 101.0 innings pitched set a Vanderbilt record for freshmen pitchers.

Young 'Dores

The 2003 Vanderbilt Commodore baseball team is mostly young and unproven. Twenty players on the 27-man roster are underclassmen, including nine of the staff's 10 pitchers and six of the nine position players penciled into the lineup. The roster includes only six juniors and one senior.

Young Coaching Staff

Not to be outdone, the Commodore coaching staff ranks as one of the youngest in the conference. With an average age of 31.50 years old, the VU coaching staff is the second youngest in the SEC as the 2003 season starts. Only Georgia has a younger staff with an average age of 31.25.

The Commodore staff includes head coach Tim Corbin (42 years old), assistant coaches Derek Johnson (32) and Erik Bakich (25) and volunteer assistant Michael Holder (27).

In comparison, Georgia includes head coach David Perno (35), assistants Butch Thompson (32) and David Eckstein (29) and volunteer coach Jason Eller (29).

Three Players Join Team in January

Three Commodores joined the squad in January and are not listed in the 2003 edition of the Vanderbilt media guide.

Sophomore infielder **Gil Kim** set the single-season record for assists (75) last season at Middlebury (Vermont) while starting all 28 games and hitting .310 with three doubles 12 RBI and 10 stolen bases. At The Lawrenceville School, Kim was named a 2001 Prep School honorable mention and 2000 second team All-State Prep School by the *Trentonian*. He helped guide his high school to the New Jersey Prep "A" championship as a junior and to a runner up finish as a sophomore. In high school he batted .210 as a senior with a double, five RBI and five stolen bases and hit .367 as a junior with three dou-

bles, 10 RBI and 16 stolen bases.

Junior catcher/infielder **Mickey Kropf** started 33 of 40 games for the 2002 Ivy League Champion Harvard Crimson. Last season as a sophomore, Kropf batted .263 with seven doubles and nine RBI. He made three errors in 235 chances. Mickey is the younger brother of former Commodore catcher Andy Kropf (1997-2000) who now plays in the Detroit Tigers organization.

Sophomore right-hander **Giovanni Seretti** went through fall practice as a freshman member of the Duke Blue Devils last season. After sitting out the spring season, he transferred to Vanderbilt. Seretti joined the VU football team prior to 2002 season and was a defensive back on the scout team. As a senior at Loyola High School (Calif.), Seretti posted a 6-3 mark with a 3.02 ERA and 68 strikeouts in 56 innings pitched.

Tough Schedule Awaits Vanderbilt

Thirty-six games against 18 opponents with recent NCAA Tournament berths highlight the 2003 Vanderbilt baseball schedule. More than 65 percent of the Commodores' 55-game schedule consists of opponents that reached either the 2001 or 2002 NCAA Tournament, including four games against 2002 College World Series participants Notre Dame and South Carolina. Six games are

scheduled against 2001 CWS participants Georgia and Tennessee. In all, Vanderbilt plays 13 games against teams that finished 2002 ranked among the top 25 in the country.
