#### Vanderbilt Closes Out Month at No. 17 South Carolina

Vanderbilt concludes the month of March at No. 17 South Carolina this weekend in a three-game Southeastern Conference series. The Commodores (13-10, 2-4 SEC) sit in third place in the Eastern Division standings, one game ahead of the fourth-place Gamecocks (16-9, 1-5 SEC). Game times are 7 p.m. ET on Friday, 4 p.m., on Saturday and 1:30 p.m., on Sunday.

Vanderbilt has managed to win one of three games against each of its first two league opponents at then-No. 10 Mississippi State and at home against Ole Miss. South Carolina has lost five consecutive league games after winning the first game in the Arkansas series two weeks ago. Last weekend the Gamecocks were swept at Tennessee. Overall, Vanderbilt enters the weekend having won four of its last eight while South Carolina has dropped six of its last seven.

South Carolina holds a significant advantage in the series, winning 29 of the 35 games since the series began in 1992. The Gamecocks have won 17 games in a row against the Commodores and have never lost a series in Columbia.

Friday's game pits two of the SEC's top strikeout pitchers against one another in Vanderbilt's Jeremy Sowers (0-3, 2.98 ERA) and South Carolina's Steven Bondurant (2-1, 4.50 ERA). Sowers leads the league with 51 strikeouts while Bondurant ranks third with 41.

Saturday will see a pair of right-handers face off in Vanderbilt junior Robert Ransom (2-0, 3.05 ERA) and USC freshman Conor Lalor (4-0, 1.33 ERA). The series finale on Sunday has Vanderbilt freshman left-hander

## Vanderbilt Head Coach Tim Corbin

After nine seasons as an assistant coach at baseball power Clemson, Tim Corbin moves into the role of Commodore head coach in 2003 and looks to construct similar success at Vanderbilt.

**Corbin helped the Tiger program produce more victories than all but four programs in the nation from 1994-2002.** Clemson won more than 71 percent (434 wins, 172 losses) of its games, captured two Atlantic Coast Conference regular season titles, made nine appearances in the NCAA Tournament and fought its way to the **College World Series four times** (1995, 1996, 2000, and 2002) while Corbin assisted head coach Jack Leggett. **The Tigers ended the 2002 season with their ninth consecutive top 25 finish and their sixth top 10 finish since 1994.**

Joining Clemson as an assistant coach in 1994, Corbin worked his way up the Tiger coaching staff. Earning two promotions, Corbin received the title of assistant head coach in 1998 before becoming the associate head coach and recruiting coordinator in September 2001.

Along the way the organized, focused and enthusiastic understudy earned a national reputation as one of the most respected assistant coaches in the country. **He worked intensely while collecting nine talented recruiting classes — all of which were recognized among the top 25 in the nation.** His on-field work developing outfielders and hitters helped 20 Clemson players earn All-America accolades while 34 Tigers were later drafted to play professional baseball.

Corbin's dedication and attention to detail caught the eye of the national baseball publication *Baseball America* on numerous occasions. In 1997, it touted the Clemson coaching staff as one of the top five "College Recruiting Staffs" in the country. It later tabbed the 1999 Tiger freshman class as No. 1 nationally. **And in 2000, *Baseball America* and the American Baseball Coaches Association named Corbin its National Coach of the Year.**

In 2000, Southern California head coach Mike Gillespie served as skipper of the USA Baseball team and quickly chose Corbin as an assistant on his staff. The staff helped guide the Americans to a gold-medal finish at the World Championships in the Netherlands, setting a record for best winning percentage (.900).

Prior to his tenure at Clemson, Corbin served as head coach at Presbyterian College for six seasons beginning in 1988. Restarting a baseball program that laid dormant for several years, Corbin directed Presbyterian College from NAIA to Division II status, posting a 106-138 overall record. Along the way, Corbin guided the Blue Hose to three consecutive appearances in the South Atlantic playoffs (1991-93) while earning South Atlantic Coach of the Year honors in 1990.

"He's on my short list of best coaches I've come across. He's spectacular. He's a young guy with knowledge beyond his years. It's vast. He's a great student of all phases of the game. He's bright and can articulate what he knows and believes. Plus, he has an outstanding ability in establishing a rapport with his kids. He has a great sense of humor. Vanderbilt is very lucky to have him. He was very happy at Clemson and in order for him to leave he would have to come across a job that he perceived as a great opportunity."

**Jack Leggett, Head Coach at Clemson**

"He's got a great recruiter's mentality, leaving no stone unturned. He has a tremendous work ethic and is the most organized person I have ever seen. He also possesses the ability to stay focused on the task at hand. When you combine those three things you have an outstanding recruiter. He's also very knowledgeable about the game of baseball and did a great job working with our hitters and outfielders the past several years at Clemson."

**Khalil Greene, 2002 National Player of the Year and former Clemson infielder recruited by Corbin. Greene was drafted by San Diego in first round (13th pick) of 2002 Draft.**

"Coach Corbin is one of the most dedicated people I've ever met. Whether it's working out in the weightroom with the players or recruiting, once he decides to do something he goes full bore ahead."

"He helped me a lot with the hitting aspects of my game. He knows a lot of the intricacies of different players' swings. So anytime you go into a slump, he knows the little things to point out and says them in a way to motivate you and help you turn around your swing.

"I've enjoyed knowing him off the field and going to his house and hanging out. I consider him as much a friend as any of the players on my team. He's a great person."

The series also marks the return of Vanderbilt head coach Tim Corbin to the state of South Carolina. Corbin served nine seasons as an assistant on Jack Leggett's staff at Clemson before taking the vacant Commodore head coaching position last June.

### Noting the Series

South Carolina holds a 29-6 lead in the all-time series that dates back to the Gamecocks entry into the SEC in 1992. USC has won 17 straight in the series. Vanderbilt's last win (15-9) came in the first game of a three-game set in Columbia in 1997. The Commodore last series win came in Nashville in 1996 (10-6, 16-10, 7-8). Vanderbilt has never won a series at South Carolina.

### Last Year vs. South Carolina

Last season the Gamecocks swept the Commodores in Nashville (4/12-4/14/03).

USC won game one, 7-5. Tony Mansolino and Sean Luellwitz hit solo homers but the Gamecocks managed 12 hits - including 11 singles- off VU starter Jeremy Sowers who took the loss. Sowers gave up three earned runs and two walks to go along with three strikeouts.

Garris Gonce went 3-for-4 with a home run and three RBI and third baseman Brian Buscher went 3-for-5 with a RBI for USC.

South Carolina took game two of the series 10-1 when Yaron Peters hit a two-run homer and Justin Harris smashed a bases-loaded three-RBI triple. Steven Boudurant scattered five hits over 7.1 innings of work VU's Jeff Little took the loss.

The Gamecocks completed the sweep on Sunday with a 20-13 victory over the Commodores. Brian Buscher homered twice and Garris Gonce recorded four RBI in the win. Commodore starter Steven Faulkner lasted 1.0 inning, allowing six earned runs. VU's Scott Shapiro homered twice and registered six RBI.

### Scouting South Carolina

The South Carolina Gamecocks are led offensively by one of the top hitters in the SEC in Brian Buscher. Entering the week, Buscher's .429 average ranked second in the conference behind only Arkansas' Clay Goodwin (.444). His six home runs were tied for fifth-most in the league.

Landon Powell leads all Gamecock hitters with 25 RBI.

In all, five USC players are hitting .324 or better compared with only one for Vanderbilt (Cesar Nicolas - .369). As a team, USC is hitting .305 which ranks ninth in the SEC.

However, South Carolina's 3.17 team ERA ranks second only to Vanderbilt's 2.73 among SEC East teams. One of USC's top pitchers, Aaron Rawl (4-2, 3.49 ERA), suffered an injury last weekend and will not see action in the Vanderbilt series.

The Gamecocks are returning four starters and 22 lettermen from last year's team that posted a 57-18 overall record and 21-8 SEC mark while reaching the national title game at the College World Series.

**Pitching and Defense Among Nation's Best**

Vanderbilt has managed to stay close in most of its contests this season thanks to outstanding pitching and defense.

When compared with teams in last week's Top 25, the Commodores rank second nationally in fielding percentage (.984) and seventh in team ERA (2.73 ERA). Official NCAA statistics are released April 8.

The Commodores enter the week first in the SEC in team defense and third in team ERA. Only three Commodores have made errors this season - second baseman Rucker Taylor (4), shortstop Ryan Klosterman (4) and third baseman Tony Mansolino (5).

Jeremy Sowers is tied for first in the SEC with 51 strikeouts. The VU pitching staff ranks second in the league with 195 punchouts on the season. Its .227 opponent batting average is third-best in the conference.

**Quick Hits**

Vanderbilt defeated Lipscomb (5-2) and won one of three games at home against Ole Miss (2-1 [11], 0-3, 1-3) last week... In its series loss to Ole Miss Vanderbilt pitchers posted a 2.17 ERA and only allowed seven earned runs and 11 walks while striking out 20 in 29.0 innings. However, the Commodores managed only three runs and 15 hits in the series and batted .161 against Rebel hurlers... Robert Ransom struck out a career-high seven batters in a no-decision effort against Ole Miss on Friday night... VU's 2-1, 11-inning win against Ole Miss on Friday moved the Commodores to 8-2 in one-run games this season and 3-2 in extra inning games... Cesar Nicolas went 2-for-4 Saturday to post his team-high 12th multi-hit game of the year.

**Commodore Comparison**

The 2003 VU baseball team continues to show improvement from a year ago. The most significant upgrades have come on the pitching staff where Commodore hurlers are allowing three fewer earned runs a game in 2003. Hits and walks allowed are down and strikeouts are up.

After a 1 hour and 26 minute delay, repairs could not be made and the game was postponed. A make-up date has not been scheduled.

## A Look Back at Vanderbilt's Last Game Ole Miss Scores Two Early, Holds On For 3-1 Win Over Vanderbilt

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Jonathan Swearingen led off the game with a home run to left field and Brian Pettway hit a RBI double down the third-base line as Ole Miss scored twice in the first inning then held on to win 3-1, Sunday, March 23, at Hawkins Field. The win gives the Rebels the series win and improves their record to 15-7 overall, 5-1 in the Southeastern Conference. Vanderbilt drops to 13-10 overall and 2-4 in league play.

Ole Miss starter Eric Fowler (1-1) struck out four and scattered five hits and a walk in 5.2 innings of work to get the win. Rebel reliever Jeremy Zick worked the final 2.1 innings, walking three but not allowing a hit to post his third save of the season.

Vanderbilt starter Jeremy Sowers (0-3) allowed four hits in the first inning, but settled

down and gave up only one other hit during his six innings pitched. He surrendered five hits, two earned runs and two walks to go along with two strikeouts.

Vanderbilt managed to out-hit the Rebels 7-6. The Commodores' best chances to score came in the sixth and seventh innings. Back-to-back two-out singles by Warner Jones and Matt McGraner and a wild-pitch by UM reliever Brae Wright put runners on second and third base. But John Kaye grounded out to short to end the threat.

In the bottom of the seventh the Commodores pulled to with in a 2-1 score when Cesar Nicolas drew a bases-loaded walk off Zick. But Jones followed by hitting into an inning-ending fielder's choice putout at second base.

The Rebels added an insurance run in the ninth inning when Matt Mossberg drew a bases-load walk off Commodore reliever Nick Pilkington.

Mickey Kropf made his first start as a Commodore in the designated hitter's slot. He went 2-for-3 with two singles through the middle of the infield. Tony Mansolino also went 2-for-3 for Vanderbilt with a double down the third-base line and a single to right field.

## Next Up For VU

The Commodores return home for four games next week. Western Kentucky visits Hawkins Field, Tuesday, for a 7 p.m. contest. Florida comes to Nashville for a three-game SEC series beginning Friday at 7 p.m. Game two is Saturday at 4 p.m., while the series finale is Sunday at 1 p.m.

**Klosterman Sets Single-Game Assists Record**

Sophomore shortstop Ryan Klosterman set the Vanderbilt single-game record for assists with 11 against East Tennessee State in the Commodores' 5-4 win (2/18). The previous record was nine held by four former Commodores, including Terry Geshke (vs. Georgia [4/21/62]), Joey Jackson (vs. Rollins [3/4/86]), Dede Malmo (vs. Lipscomb [3/30/88]) and Brad Reese (vs. Memphis [3/11/90]).

While the Southeastern Conference does not have records for most assists, the NCAA record book lists only eight other players in collegiate baseball history to register more than 11 assists in a nine-inning game. The NCAA record is 14 set by Florida's Kevin Polcovich against Tennessee (4/27/91).

Klosterman recorded at least one assist in seven different innings. He was busiest in the second inning, when he made all three assists, and in the seventh and eighth innings when he lent a hand in two of the three outs.

**Nicolas' Comeback Complete**

Cesar Nicolas completed an amazing comeback when he made his first start of the season against East Tennessee State (2/18). The Vanderbilt junior infielder was inadvertently hit in the head with a swung bat, Jan. 18, in the batting cages adjacent to Hawkins Field. Nicolas suffered a mild concussion and broken temporal bones on the right side of his head.

Originally expected to miss the first two to three weeks of the season, Nicolas made his first appearance as a pinch hitter in both the season opener against Old Dominion and the following game against The Citadel.

**Sowers Garners Preseason Attention**

Jeremy Sowers has earned second team All-America honors from *Baseball America* and third team All-America accolades from Louisville Slugger and "Collegiate Baseball" newspaper entering the 2003 season. *Baseball America* also tabbed him as the third-best sophomore in the country (at any position).

Sowers and Oklahoma left-hander David Purcey, who also earned second-team honors, were the only two sophomore hurlers to receive recognition from the *Baseball America* listing that included three All-America teams, honoring 15 pitchers. Sowers and Mississippi State junior left-hander Paul Maholm were the only pitchers from the Southeastern Conference represented.

Sowers was one of nine sophomore pitchers and 63 players overall chosen to the three teams selected by Louisville Slugger and "Collegiate Baseball." Sowers, Maholm and LSU senior right-hander Jake Tompkins were the three SEC pitchers honored.

Last year, Sowers was one of 19 starting pitchers nationwide to earn Freshman All-America honors from Louisville Slugger and "Collegiate Baseball." As the Commodores' top pitcher, Sowers went 6-5 while leading Vanderbilt in wins (six), ERA (4.37), innings pitched (101.0), strikeouts (85) and pickoffs (12). His 85 strikeouts tied for sixth-most by

SEC pitchers and first among all freshmen hurlers in the league. His strikeout total also ranked third all-time among freshmen pitchers at Vanderbilt. His 101.0 innings pitched set a Vanderbilt record for freshmen pitchers.

**Young 'Dores**

The 2003 Vanderbilt Commodore baseball team is mostly young and unproven. Twenty players on the 27-man roster are underclassmen, including nine of the staff's 10 pitchers and six of the nine position players penciled into the lineup. The roster includes only six juniors and one senior.

Just how young are the Commodores? VU tops the SEC in the percentage of underclassmen on its roster.

**Young Coaching Staff**

Not to be outdone, the Commodore coaching staff ranks as one of the youngest in the conference. With an average age of 31.50 years old, the VU coaching staff is the second youngest in the SEC as the 2003 season starts. Only Georgia has a younger staff with an average age of 31.25.

The Commodore staff includes head coach Tim Corbin (42 years old), assistant coaches Derek Johnson (32) and Erik Bakich (25) and volunteer assistant Michael Holder (27).

In comparison, Georgia includes head coach David Perno (35), assistants Butch Thompson (32) and David Eckstein (29) and volunteer coach Jason Eller (29).

**Three Players Join Team in January**

Three Commodores joined the squad in January and are not listed in the 2003 edition of the Vanderbilt media guide.

Sophomore infielder **Gil Kim** set the single-season record for assists (75) last season at Middlebury (Vermont) while starting all 28 games and hitting .310 with three doubles 12

RBI and 10 stolen bases. At The Lawrenceville School, Kim was named a 2001 Prep School honorable mention and 2000 second team All-State Prep School by the *Trentonian*. He helped guide his high school to the New Jersey Prep "A" championship as a junior and to a runner up finish as a sophomore. In high school he batted .210 as a senior with a double, five RBI and five stolen bases and hit .367 as a junior with three doubles, 10 RBI and 16 stolen bases.

Junior catcher/infielder **Mickey Kropf** started 33 of 40 games for the 2002 Ivy League Champion Harvard Crimson. Last season as a sophomore, Kropf batted .263 with seven doubles and nine RBI. He made three errors in 235 chances. Mickey is the younger brother of former Commodore catcher Andy Kropf (1997-2000) who now plays in the Detroit Tigers organization.

Sophomore right-hander **Giovanni Seretti** went through fall practice as a freshman member of the Duke Blue Devils last season. After sitting out the spring season, he transferred to Vanderbilt. Seretti joined the VU football team prior to 2002 season and was a defensive back on the scout team. As a senior at Loyola High School (Calif.), Seretti posted a 6-3 mark with a 3.02 ERA and 68 strikeouts in 56 innings pitched.
