#### **Vanderbilt Looks to Snap Losing Streak as No. 13 Florida Visits Hawkins Field**

Vanderbilt looks to snap a six-game losing streak this weekend when No. 13 Florida visits Hawkins Field for a three-game Southeastern Conference series beginning Friday at 7 p.m. CT. Game two is Saturday at 4 p.m., with the series finale set for Sunday at 1 p.m.

The Commodores (13-14, 2-7 SEC) have lost five league games in a row after being swept last weekend at South Carolina. Vanderbilt lost the second and third game of the Ole Miss the weekend prior in Nashville. Florida (23-6-1, 5-3-1 SEC) enters the series having won eight of its last nine overall and each of its last five SEC games. The Gators swept Tennessee in Gainesville last weekend and took the last two games against Alabama two weeks ago in Gainesville.

The series features Florida's SEC-leading offense facing up against a talented Vanderbilt pitching corps that ranks third-best in the league. The Gators' .338 batting average led all SEC teams entering the week. UF ranked first or second in every offensive category except triples. Meanwhile, Vanderbilt's 3.00 team ERA ranks behind only Mississippi State (2.25) and Ole Miss (2.42) for tops in the SEC.

Friday's matchup has a pair of sophomore left-handers facing off in Vanderbilt's Jeremy Sowers (0-4, 2.70 ERA) and Florida's Adam Sanabria (2-0, 5.40 ERA). Sowers entered the week tied with Alabama's Taylor Tankersley for the league lead in strikeouts with 59. A tough-luck pitcher this season, Sowers has pitched well but has received only 1.86 runs of support per game.

## Vanderbilt Head Coach Tim Corbin

After nine seasons as an assistant coach at baseball power Clemson, Tim Corbin moves into the role of Commodore head coach in 2003 and looks to construct similar success at Vanderbilt.

**Corbin helped the Tiger program produce more victories than all but four programs in the nation from 1994-2002.** Clemson won more than 71 percent (434 wins, 172 losses) of its games, captured two Atlantic Coast Conference regular season titles, made nine appearances in the NCAA Tournament and fought its way to the **College World Series four times** (1995, 1996, 2000, and 2002) while Corbin assisted head coach Jack Leggett. **The Tigers ended the 2002 season with their ninth consecutive top 25 finish and their sixth top 10 finish since 1994.**

Joining Clemson as an assistant coach in 1994, Corbin worked his way up the Tiger coaching staff. Earning two promotions, Corbin received the title of assistant head coach in 1998 before becoming the associate head coach and recruiting coordinator in September 2001.

Along the way the organized, focused and enthusiastic understudy earned a national reputation as one of the most respected assistant coaches in the country. **He worked intensely while collecting nine talented recruiting classes — all of which were recognized among the top 25 in the nation.** His on-field work developing outfielders and hitters helped 20 Clemson players earn All-America accolades while 34 Tigers were later drafted to play professional baseball.

Corbin's dedication and attention to detail caught the eye of the national baseball publication *Baseball America* on numerous occasions. In 1997, it touted the Clemson coaching staff as one of the top five "College Recruiting Staffs" in the country. It later tabbed the 1999 Tiger freshman class as No. 1 nationally. **And in 2000, *Baseball America* and the American Baseball Coaches Association named Corbin its National Coach of the Year.**

In 2000, Southern California head coach Mike Gillespie served as skipper of the USA Baseball team and quickly chose Corbin as an assistant on his staff. The staff helped guide the Americans to a gold-medal finish at the World Championships in the Netherlands, setting a record for best winning percentage (.900).

Prior to his tenure at Clemson, Corbin served as head coach at Presbyterian College for six seasons beginning in 1988. Restarting a baseball program that laid dormant for several years, Corbin directed Presbyterian College from NAIA to Division II status, posting a 106-138 overall record. Along the way, Corbin guided the Blue Hose to three consecutive appearances in the South Atlantic playoffs (1991-93) while earning South Atlantic Coach of the Year honors in 1990.

He's bright and can articulate what he knows and believes. Plus, he has an outstanding ability in establishing a rapport with his kids. He has a great sense of humor. Vanderbilt is very lucky to have him. He was very happy at Clemson and in order for him to leave he would have to come across a job that he perceived as a great opportunity."

"He's got a great recruiter's mentality, leaving no stone unturned. He has a tremendous work ethic and is the most organized person I have ever seen. He also possesses the ability to stay focused on the task at hand. When you combine those three things you have an outstanding recruiter. He's also very knowledgeable about the game of baseball and did a great job working with our hitters and outfielders the past several years at Clemson."

**Khalil Greene, 2002 National Player of the Year and former Clemson infielder recruited by Corbin. Greene was drafted by San Diego in first round (13th pick) of 2002 Draft.**

"Coach Corbin is one of the most dedicated people I've ever met. Whether it's working out in the weightroom with the players or recruiting, once he decides to do something he goes full bore ahead."

"He helped me a lot with the hitting aspects of my game. He knows a lot of the intricacies of different players' swings. So anytime you go into a slump, he knows the little things to point out and says them in a way to motivate you and help you turn around your swing.

"I've enjoyed knowing him off the field and going to his house and hanging out. I consider him as much a friend as any of the players on my team. He's a great person."

Vanderbilt junior right-hander Robert Ransom (2-0, 3.05 ERA) will start Saturday. Florida will counter with sophomore right-hander Justin Hoyman (5-1, 2.29 ERA). Ransom is enjoying his best season as a Commodore with a career-low 3.05 ERA. He owns a 2-to-1 strikeout-to-walk ratio in 44.1 innings pitched. Hoyman's ERA ranked 10th best in the SEC heading into the week.

Freshman left-hander Ryan Mullins (1-4, 2.59 ERA) will get the nod on Sunday for Vanderbilt. Mullins struck out a career-high eight batters and allowed only one earned run in six innings but took the loss last Sunday at South Carolina. Florida has not announced its starter for Sunday.

### Noting the Series

Florida holds a 103-48-1 advantage in the all-time series that dates back to 1927. The Gators have won eight consecutive games in the series dating back to Vanderbilt's 7-4 victory in game one of the 2000 series in Gainesville. The last time the Commodores took a series from Florida was in 1997, a three-game sweep in Nashville.

Last year Florida swept the series in Gainesville. The Gators took game one, 13-7 after rallying from a five-run deficit. Vanderbilt built a 5-0 lead through the middle of the third inning before Florida roughed up VU starter Jeremy Sowers for 10 hits and six earned runs. Sowers took the loss in five innings of work, his shortest collegiate start to date. UF reliever David Bartlett earned the win.

Five different Gators recorded two RBI apiece. Mark Kiger went 3-for-3 with three runs scored. Karl Nonemaker, Tony Mansolino and Jonathan Douillard had three hits apiece for the Commodores.

Game two saw Florida hold off Vanderbilt, 8-7. Florida built leads of 3-0 and 8-3 before the Commodores scored four times in the eighth yet fell short. UF starter Alex Hart earned the win, striking out five and allowing three earned runs in 7.1 innings. VU starter Chris Maultsby took the loss. He gave up eight hits, seven runs (all earned) and three walks to go along with five strikeouts in 5.0 innings.

John Kaye led VU with three RBI. Mansolino and Sean Luellwitz had two hits apiece. Three Gators had two hits apiece and Ryan Shealy and Pat Osborn knocked in two runs each.

Florida swept the series with a 7-3 win on Sunday. Kiger went 3-for-4 with two RBI and Jonathan Tucker went 4-for-5 with one RBI to carry the Gators. Keith Ramsey earned the win, striking out six and scattering four hits and three earned runs in 5.2 innings. Jeff Little took the loss, allowing 11 hits, five runs (two earned) and

six walks in 6.0 innings. Chris Broadus and Douillard recorded two hits each for Vanderbilt.

## Scouting Florida

Florida comes to Nashville having won five straight SEC games and eight of its last nine overall. The SEC East leaders swept Tennessee last weekend at home after winning two of three from Alabama in Gainesville the weekend prior.

The 13th-ranked Gators led all conference teams entering the week with a .338 average. In fact, Florida ranked first or second in every major offensive category except triples. Florida's pitching staff ranks 10th in the SEC with a 4.17 team ERA. It's defense is fourth with a .972 fielding percentage.

Several Gators are enjoying successful campaigns, including their top hitter, Brett Dowdy. He leads all UF hitters with a .426 average and currently own a 12-game hit streak. C.J. Smith, leads the team with nine home runs. Mario Garza has a team-best 42 RBI.

Sophomore right-hander Justin Hoyman leads all UF pitchers with a 5-1 record and 32 strikeouts in 51.0 innings. He is limiting opponents to a .199 batting average.

Four Gators already have earned SEC Player of the Week honors, including position players Stephen Barton (2/10) and C.J. Smith (2/24) and pitchers Adam Sanabria (3/10) and Justin Hoyman (3/24).

Florida was picked to finish second behind South Carolina in the SEC Eastern Division in the preseason coaches' poll. The Gators did receive one first-place vote. Florida returns four starters and 19 lettermen from its 2002 squad that finished with a 46-19 overall record and took second in the SEC East with a 20-10 mark. Florida ended its season by losing to in-state rival Miami in the NCAA Regional in Gainesville.

## VU Weekend Starters Impress

Jeremy Sowers, Ryan Mullins and Robert Ransom each rank among the SEC leaders in strikeouts against league competition. Sowers ranks first in the league with 23 strikeouts, Mullins is ninth with 18 and Ransom is 11th with 17. Vanderbilt is the only team to have all three of its weekend starters listed among the conference leaders.

The unit owns a 2.47 cumulative ERA in nine SEC starts. Despite a 0-9 record, the trio has combined for 58 strikeouts compared with 19 walks, 56 hits and 22 runs (16 earned) in 58.1 innings. Opponents are hitting .251. (See Commodore Starters and Relievers chart on page 6.)

## Dore Data

The 13th-ranked Florida Gators are only the second ranked team to play at Hawkins Field this season. Then-No. 17 Kansas defeated Vanderbilt, 4-2 (3/2)...The Commodores are 1-7 this year against ranked opponents with the lone win coming at then-No. 17 Mississippi State, 4-3 (3/15)... Last weekend against South Carolina, Vanderbilt starters went 0-2 but registered a 1.80 ERA with 21 strikeouts to go along with 21 hits, 10 runs (four earned) and six walks... Vanderbilt's 2-0 loss on Friday marked the 20th game this season decided by three runs or less... USC's rally from four down Saturday was the largest lead lost by Vanderbilt this season... Saturday, VU suffered only its second loss in 11 games when it lead after the eighth inning. The Commodores also suffered their first loss of the year in eight games when they scored five or more runs... Ryan Klosterman swiped his SEC-leading 20th stolen base Saturday against South Carolina... The Commodores play 11 of their 16 games at home during the month of April.

## Commodore Comparison

The 2003 VU baseball team continues to show improvement from a year ago. The most significant upgrades have come on the pitching staff where Commodore hurlers are allowing nearly two and a half fewer earned runs a game in 2003. Hits and walks allowed are down and strikeouts are up.

### Offense Showing Signs of Improvement

Vanderbilt has shown recent signs of an improving offense. The Commodores are averaging 4.6 runs and 11.7 hits a game over their past three contests. VU posted 14 hits in game two vs. South Carolina (3/29) and 14 hits against Western Kentucky (4/1). In the 11 games leading up to Saturday's USC game, Vanderbilt managed only one game in which it posted 10 or more hits in a game (10 hits vs. Lipscomb [3/19]). During the same stretch, the Commodores were averaging 2.2 runs and 5.8 hits a game.

Current Commodores on the upward slope including outfielder John Kaye who is hitting .500 (6-for-12) with three RBI and a run scored over the last three games. The senior has hit safely 12 of the last 15 games. Shortstop Ryan Klosterman has hit safely in seven of the last eight games... Third baseman Tony Mansolino has recorded hits in nine of 16 games since the end of February (when he batted 1-for-27)... First baseman Cesar Nicolas leads all Commodores with 13 multi-hit games. He has posted at least one hit in 15 of the last 19 games.

### A Look Back at Vanderbilt's Last Game Western Ky. Surges Past Vanderbilt, 11-4

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — Nine Hilltopper batters recorded hits and seven registered at least one RBI as Western Kentucky surged past Vanderbilt 11-4, Tuesday, April 1, at Hawkins Field. The win was Western Kentucky's eighth

in its last 12 games and improved its overall record to 15-10. Vanderbilt fell short for the sixth game in a row to slip to 13-14 overall.

WKU starter J.C. Faircloth (5-0) remained perfect on the season. He scattered four hits, a walk and one earned run while striking out two in 5.0 innings of work. Grady Hinchman pitched the remaining four innings to post his first save of the season.

Matt Johnston led all Hilltoppers with a 3-for-4 effort. Antone Towns knocked in a game-high two RBI.

After taking a 1-0 lead in the first inning, the Hilltoppers grabbed a commanding 6-0 lead in the third innings, scoring five times. WKU tallied six hits in the frame, including four straight hits to start the inning off VU starter Blake Owen (1-1). Antone Towns sparked the inning with a two-run double into the alley in left-center field. Run scoring singles by Brent Miller and Kevin Bearden added to the lead before David Lower's sacrifice fly ended the Hilltopper scoring.

Vanderbilt managed to trim the deficit to 6-1 in the fifth. Ryan Klosterman's ground out scored Jonathan Douillard who reached on a single to right field.

WKU extended its lead to 8-1 in the seventh inning on a RBI single by Johnson and a RBI ground out by Tim Grogan.

Commodore pinch hitter Ryan Godfrey singled in Warner Jones in the eighth inning to make the score 8-2.

But Western added three more runs in the ninth on a RBI double by Matt Robinson, a RBI

#### Klosterman Sets Single-Game Assists Record

Sophomore shortstop Ryan Klosterman set the Vanderbilt single-game record for assists with 11 against East Tennessee State in the Commodores' 5-4 win (2/18). The previous record was nine held by four former Commodores, including Terry Geshke (vs. Georgia [4/21/62]), Joey Jackson (vs. Rollins [3/4/86]), Dede Malmo (vs. Lipscomb [3/30/88]) and Brad Reese (vs. Memphis [3/11/90]).

While the Southeastern Conference does not have records for most assists, the NCAA record book lists only eight other players in collegiate baseball history to register more than 11 assists in a nine-inning game. The NCAA record is 14 set by Florida's Kevin Polcovich against Tennessee (4/27/91).

Klosterman recorded at least one assist in seven different innings. He was busiest in the second inning, when he made all three assists, and in the seventh and eighth innings when he lent a hand in two of the three outs.

#### Nicolas' Comeback Complete

Cesar Nicolas completed an amazing comeback when he made his first start of the season against East Tennessee State (2/18). The Vanderbilt junior infielder was inadvertently hit in the head with a swung bat, Jan. 18, in the batting cages adjacent to Hawkins Field. Nicolas suffered a mild concussion and broken temporal bones on the right side of his head.

Originally expected to miss the first two to three weeks of the season, Nicolas made his first appearance as a pinch hitter in both the season opener against Old Dominion and the following game against The Citadel.

### - PRESEASON NOTES -

#### Sowers Garners Preseason Attention

Jeremy Sowers has earned second team All-America honors from *Baseball America* and third team All-America accolades from Louisville Slugger and "Collegiate Baseball" newspaper entering the 2003 season. *Baseball America* also tabbed him as the third-best sophomore in the country (at any position).

Sowers and Oklahoma left-hander David Purcey, who also earned second-team hon-

ors, were the only two sophomore hurlers to receive recognition from the *Baseball America* listing that included three All-America teams, honoring 15 pitchers. Sowers and Mississippi State junior left-hander Paul Maholm were the only pitchers from the Southeastern Conference represented.

Sowers was one of nine sophomore pitchers and 63 players overall chosen to the three teams selected by Louisville Slugger and "Collegiate Baseball." Sowers, Maholm and LSU senior right-hander Jake Tompkins were the three SEC pitchers honored.

Last year, Sowers was one of 19 starting pitchers nationwide to earn Freshman All-America honors from Louisville Slugger and "Collegiate Baseball." As the Commodores' top pitcher, Sowers went 6-5 while leading

**Young Coaching Staff**

Not to be outdone, the Commodore coaching staff ranks as one of the youngest in the conference. With an average age of 31.50 years old, the VU coaching staff is the second youngest in the SEC as the 2003 season starts. Only Georgia has a younger staff with an average age of 31.25.

The Commodore staff includes head coach Tim Corbin (42 years old), assistant coaches Derek Johnson (32) and Erik Bakich (25) and volunteer assistant Michael Holder (27).

In comparison, Georgia includes head coach David Perno (35), assistants Butch Thompson (32) and David Eckstein (29) and volunteer coach Jason Eller (29).

**Three Players Join Team in January**

Three Commodores joined the squad in January and are not listed in the 2003 edition of the Vanderbilt media guide.

Sophomore infielder **Gil Kim** set the single-season record for assists (75) last season at Middlebury (Vermont) while starting all 28 games and hitting .310 with three doubles 12 RBI and 10 stolen bases. At The Lawrenceville School, Kim was named a 2001 Prep School honorable mention and 2000 second team All-State Prep School by the *Trentonian*. He helped guide his high school to the New Jersey Prep "A" championship as a junior and to a runner up finish as a sophomore. In high school he batted .210 as a senior with a double, five RBI and five stolen bases and hit .367 as a junior with three doubles, 10 RBI and 16 stolen bases.

Junior catcher/infielder **Mickey Kropf** started 33 of 40 games for the 2002 Ivy League Champion Harvard Crimson. Last season as a

sophomore, Kropf batted .263 with seven doubles and nine RBI. He made three errors in 235 chances. Mickey is the younger brother of former Commodore catcher Andy Kropf (1997-2000) who now plays in the Detroit Tigers organization.
