Vanderbilt Begins Seven-Game Homestand with No. 7 LSU

Vanderbilt begins a seven-game homestand this weekend when No. 7 LSU comes to Hawkins Field for a three-game Southeastern Conference series beginning Friday at 7 p.m. The series continues Saturday at 4 p.m., and concludes Sunday at 1 p.m. Sunday's game will be telecast by Jumbo Sports Network for viewers in Louisiana. The contest will also appear on Comcast Sports Southeast on a delayed basis Sunday evening.

Vanderbilt (17-18, 6-9 SEC) finds itself battling for top honors in the SEC Eastern Division standings. Entering the weekend the Commodores are a game behind division leaders Tennessee (7-8) and South Carolina (7-8). Florida (6-8-1) is a half game in front of Vanderbilt.

The Commodores are in the middle of a brutal stretch of games against nationally ranked conference opponents. Vanderbilt has recorded a 4-2 mark against then-No.13 Florida and then-No. 25 Arkansas the past two weekends. After three contests with No. 7 LSU this weekend, the Commodores play host to top-10 ranked Auburn, April 25-27.

LSU (25-11-1, 11-3-1) has won nine consecutive SEC series dating back to last season. One more series win would tie the Tigers' school record of 10 set during the 1985 and 1986 seasons. LSU took two of three from Ole Miss (2-7, 14-6, 13-5) last weekend at Alex

Vanderbilt Head Coach Tim Corbin

After nine season as an assistant coach at baseball power Clemson, Tim Corbin moves into the role of Commodore head coach in 2003 and looks to construct similar success at Vanderbilt.

Corbin helped the Tiger program produce more victories than all but four programs in the nation from 1994-2002. Clemson won more than 71 percent (434 wins, 172 losses) of its games, captured two Atlantic Coast Conference regular season titles, made nine appearances in the NCAA Tournament and fought its way to the **College World Series four times** (1995, 1996, 2000, and 2002) while Corbin assisted head coach Jack Leggett. **The Tigers ended the 2002 season with their ninth consecutive top 25 finish and their sixth top 10 finish since 1994.**

Joining Clemson as an assistant coach in 1994, Corbin worked his way up the Tiger coaching staff. Earning two promotions, Corbin received the title of assistant head coach in 1998 before becoming the associate head coach and recruiting coordinator in September 2001.

Along the way the organized, focused and enthusiastic understudy earned a national reputation as one of the most respected assistant coaches in the country. **He worked intensely while collecting nine talented recruiting classes — all of which were recognized among the top 25 in the nation.** His on-field work developing outfielders and hitters helped 20 Clemson players earn All-America accolades while 34 Tigers were later drafted to play professional baseball.

Corbin's dedication and attention to detail caught the eye of the national baseball publication *Baseball America* on numerous occasions. In 1997, it touted the Clemson coaching staff as one of the top five "College Recruiting Staffs" in the country. It later tabbed the 1999 Tiger freshmen class as No. 1 nationally. **And in 2000, *Baseball America* and the American Baseball Coaches Association named Corbin its National Coach of the Year.**

In 2000, Southern California head coach Mike Gillespie served as skipper of the USA Baseball team and quickly chose Corbin as an assistant on his staff. The staff helped guide the Americans to a gold-medal finish at the World Championships in the Netherlands, setting a record for best winning percentage (.900).

Prior to his tenure at Clemson, Corbin served as head coach at Presbyterian College for six seasons beginning in 1988. Restarting a baseball program that laid dormant for several years, Corbin directed Presbyterian College from NAIA to Division II status, posting a 106-138 overall record. Along the way, Corbin guided the Blue Hose to three consecutive appearances in the South Atlantic playoffs (1991-93) while earning South Atlantic Coach of the Year honors in 1990.

"He's on my short list of best coaches I've come across. He's spectacular. He's a young guy with knowledge beyond his years. It's vast. He's a great student of all phases of the game. He's bright and can articulate what he knows and believes. Plus, he has an outstanding ability in establishing a rapport with his kids. He has a great sense of humor. Vanderbilt is very lucky to have him. He was very happy at Clemson and in order for him to leave he would have to come across a job that he perceived as a great opportunity."

Jack Leggett, Head Coach at Clemson

"He's got a great recruiter's mentality, leaving no stone unturned. He has a tremendous work ethic and is the most organized person I have ever seen. He also possesses the ability to stay focused on the task at hand. When you combine those three things you have an outstanding recruiter. He's also very knowledgeable about the game of baseball and did a great job working with our hitters and outfielders the past several years at Clemson."

Khalil Greene, 2002 National Player of the Year and former Clemson infielder recruited by Corbin. Greene was drafted by San Diego in first round (13th pick) of 2002 Draft.

"Coach Corbin is one of the most dedicated people I've ever met. Whether it's working out in the weightroom with the players or recruiting, once he decides to do something he goes full bore ahead."

"He helped me a lot with the hitting aspects of my game. He knows a lot of the intricacies of different players' swings. So anytime you go into a slump, he knows the little things to point out and says them in a way to motivate you and help you turn around your swing.

"I've enjoyed knowing him off the field and going to his house and hanging out. I consider him as much a friend as any of the players on my team. He's a great person."

Box Stadium. The Tigers bring in a powerful offense that leads all conference teams in home runs (45).

Vanderbilt pitchers, who have been masterful at times this season, have surrendered 10 home runs in their past four games after allowing only 13 long balls in the first 31 games.

Jeremy Sowers (2-4, 2.63 ERA) takes the hill for Vanderbilt on Friday. The sophomore southpaw has won in each of his last two outings, allowing 10 hits, five runs (four earned) and four walks to go along with 15 strikeouts in 15.0 innings. LSU will counter with freshman right-hander Justin Meier (4-1, 2.18). Meier leads the Tigers in ERA and has 39 strikeouts compared to eight walks in 45.1 innings this season.

Junior right-hander Robert Ransom (3-1, 5.00 ERA) will start for Vanderbilt on Saturday. Ransom leads all VU weekend starters in victories. LSU will counter with senior right-hander Bo Pettit (6-1, 4.41 ERA) whose win total also leads the team.

Sunday pits VU freshman left-hander Ryan Mullins (2-5, 3.29 ERA) against LSU junior right-hander Nate Bumstead (5-1, 4.66 ERA). Mullins has struck out 47 batters and walked 13 in 54.2 innings this season. Bumstead has sat down 42 batters and walked 12 in 48.1 innings of work.

Both teams are playing well defensively. Vanderbilt ranks third nationally with a .980 fielding percentage. Meanwhile, LSU has not committed an error in five games, the longest streak in Tigers' modern history.

Noting the LSU Series

LSU owns a 42-22 advantage in the all-time series dating back to 1943. However, the Commodores won last year's series two games to one (0-6, 9-2, 8-7) and have split the last six meetings. With a win Friday, Vanderbilt could record its first three-game win streak in series history.

Last year Vanderbilt claimed its first series win in Baton Rouge since 1957 and the first series win since 1988. In doing so, the Commodores joined Georgia as being the only squads from the SEC East to win a series at Alex Box Stadium since the league went to a round-robin format in 1986.

The Tigers took game one of the series 6-0, as Bo Pettit struck out 12 and threw a complete-game four-hit shut out. Jeremy Sowers took the loss in his first SEC start, allowing nine hits, six runs (all earned) two walks and eight strikeouts in 7.2 innings. LSU right fielder Sean Barker went 3-for-4 with three RBI and a run scored.

Vanderbilt answered in game two when Jeff Little tossed a complete-game six hitter in the Commodores' 9-2 win. Tony Mansolino and Sean

Luellwitz had three hits apiece and John Kaye was 2-for-4 with three RBI. Lane Mestepey took the loss, allowing nine hits and five runs (four earned) in 6.0 innings.

The Commodores took the series on Sunday, rallying for three runs in the ninth inning to win 8-7. John Kaye doubled down the right-field line to bring in pinch runner Eric Billings and Karl Nonemaker in the ninth. Sean Luellwitz was 3-for-5 with a three-run home run and a solo homer.

Following the series, Vanderbilt earned its first national ranking since 1998, when Collegiate Baseball tabbed the Commodores No. 29 and the NCBWA ranked VU at No. 30.

Scouting LSU

LSU (24-11-1, 11-3-1) comes to Hawkins Field in first place in the SEC Western Division, a half game ahead of Auburn (11-4). The Tigers have won eight of their last 10 and six of their last eight conference games.

The Bayou Bengals won their ninth consecutive league series last weekend at home against Ole Miss, pulling them within one series of tying the school record. LSU won 10 consecutive SEC series, starting with the final series of 1985 at Auburn and continuing through all nine series of 1986.

The Tigers entered the week ranked sixth in the league with a .309 batting average. LSU leads the SEC in home runs with 45 and ranks second with 624 total bases. Aaron Hill leads all Tiger hitters with a .388 average. He owns 52 hits, 14 doubles, four home runs and 33 RBI in 134 at bats. Jon Zeringue and Clay Harris lead the team with eight home runs. Ivan Naccarata has a team-best 32 RBI.

LSU has posted a 3.58 team ERA to rank third in the SEC. Jake Thompkins (1-3, 4.37 ERA) leads all Tigers with 54 strikeouts in 47.1 innings. He has walked only 16 and allowed 26 runs (23 earned). Bo Pettit has a team-best six wins in seven starts.

LSU received eight of 12 first place votes in the SEC Western Division preseason coaches' poll. The Tigers are returning six starters and 14 lettermen from their 2002 squad that finished 44-22 overall, 19-10 (second) in the SEC West and advanced to the NCAA Super Regional, losing twice to Rice in Houston.

Sowers Tough Against the SEC

Jeremy Sowers (2-4, 2.63 ERA) has pitched well all season, but has taken it to another level against SEC opponents. In SEC games only, the sophomore left-hander leads all league pitchers with 38 strikeouts while his 2.25 ERA is second only to MSU's Paul Maholm (1.71). Sowers is tied for fourth with UT's Derek Tharpe in innings pitched with 36.0. He also ranks ninth with a .234 opposing batting average. Overall, Sowers' numbers in 2003 are even lower than those he posted a year ago while being named a freshman all-american.

Klosterman Owns Team-Best 11-Game Hit Streak

Ryan Klosterman brings a team-best 11-game hit streak into this weekend's series with LSU. Klosterman is hitting .365 (19-for-52) during the stretch with five doubles, five RBI, five stolen bases, a home run, and 10 runs scored. Klosterman has hit safely in 25 of Vanderbilt 35 games this season.

Offense Showing Signs of Improvement

Commodore hitting continues to improve. Vanderbilt has recorded 10 or more hits in each of its past five games and seven of its last nine contests. Over the last 11 games Vanderbilt is hitting .304 (119-for-391) with 23 doubles, three home runs, 50 RBI and 11 stolen bases. Vanderbilt had struggled in the previous 12 games prior to March 29, hitting .176 (72-for-409) and tallying 10 hits or more in a game only once.

Several Commodores, in addition to Klosterman, have keyed the resurgence including:

- Warner Jones - Hitting .333 (18-for-54) with seven RBI, three doubles a triple and six runs scored over his last 13 games... Has posted five multi-hit games in his last 13 contests.
- John Kaye - Hitting .375 (15-for-40) with eight runs and seven RBI over his last 11 games... Hitting .350 (9-for-24) with four RBI and seven runs scored during current seven-game hit streak.
- Tony Mansolino - Hitting .318 (10-for-26) with three doubles, five RBI a home run and four

runs scored during his current seven game hit streak... Batting .326 (15-for-46) with four doubles, a home run, six RBI and four runs scored since March 23 (last 13 games).

- Cesar Nicolas - Has hit safely in six of last seven games, batting .407 (11-for-27) with three doubles, five RBI and five runs scored.

Klosterman Ranks 10th Nationally in Stolen Bases; Among Best in VU History

Ryan Klosterman's mischief on the base paths continues to cause headaches for opposing pitchers. And now his number of stolen bases per game rank among the nation's best. NCAA statistics (through 4/13) list the Vanderbilt shortstop tied for eighth, averaging 0.71 stolen bases a game. The mark is tied with Prairie View's Michael Willis, Florida State's Stephen Drew and UAB's Steve Martin.

The sophomore has 25 stolen bases in 31 attempts entering the weekend. Heading into the week, Klosterman ranked second in the SEC in stolen bases (24), one behind Tennessee's Jordan Czarniecki. His 29 attempts tied Czarniecki for first in the league.

Klosterman's stolen base total entering the weekend (25) is tied for 11th most in Vanderbilt history for a single season. See chart below:

Dore Data From Last Weekend

- Vanderbilt's 6-4 win over Arkansas on Friday marked the Commodores' fourth straight SEC win. VU swept Florida in three games last week in Nashville. It marked the first time VU had won four straight league games since 1997 when the Commodores won five in a row.
- In the Commodores' 6-4 win, Vanderbilt rallied for three runs in the eighth inning to pull out the victory. It marked the first time in 12 tries this season that VU won a game where it trailed after seven innings.
- The 17 runs allowed by Vanderbilt in Saturday's 17-7 loss to Arkansas were the most runs given up by the Commodores since a 19-7 set back to Kentucky (5/11/02) last season in Nashville.
- Arkansas' eight-run first inning were the most runs allowed by Vanderbilt in an inning since the Commodores gave up 12 in the first inning against Kentucky (5/11/02) in a 19-7 defeat.
- Vanderbilt allowed five home runs to Arkansas on Saturday and seven in the three-game series. The Commodores entered the weekend ranked third in the league for fewest home runs allowed with 13.
- Twenty-five of Vanderbilt's 34 games this year have been decided by three runs or less. The Commodores are 9-2 in one-run games.
- Vanderbilt leads all SEC East teams with three victories against the SEC West.
- The Commodores are in the midst of 12 consecutive contests against ranked SEC opponents. Vanderbilt is currently 4-2 in those games after sweeping then-No. 13 Florida before taking one of three games at No. 25 Arkansas last weekend. VU plays host to No. 7 LSU this weekend before entertaining No. 10 Auburn next weekend at Hawkins Field.

A Look Back at Vanderbilt's Last Game Knox Homers Twice as Middle Tennessee Hands Vanderbilt 9-5 Defeat

MURFREESBORO, Tenn. - Middle Tennessee designated hitter Jerry Knox went 4-for-5 with two home runs and three RBI to send the Blue Raiders past Vanderbilt, 9-5, Tuesday, April 15 at Reese Smith Field. The win improves Middle Tennessee's record to 17-19 overall while Vanderbilt drops to 17-18 on the season.

Knox sparked an eventual MTSU come-

back in the fourth inning. With the Blue Raiders trailing 3-0, Knox led off the frame with a solo home run to left center field to trim Vanderbilt's lead to 3-1. Shane Kemp followed with a single and scored three batters later on a fielding error by Tony Mansolino to make the score 3-2.

Middle Tennessee completed the comeback in the fifth inning off Commodore reliever Jonathan Douillard (0-1). Brett Carroll's RBI single to center scored Josh Archer and tied the game at 3-3. Shane Kemp brought in Carroll two batters later with a run scoring triple into the alley in right center. Derek Phillips followed with a double to center field that scored Kemp and gave MTSU a 5-3 advantage.

Vanderbilt climbed to within a 5-4 score in the sixth inning, but Middle Tennessee put the game away, scoring four times in the ninth on a pair of two-run home runs off Commodore reliever Matt Buschmann. Nate Jagers was hit by a pitch to lead off the inning. Archer followed with a two-run shot over the center field wall. After Carroll doubled to center field, Knox connected again for his second home run of the night, a two-run homer that cleared the wall in right field.

MTSU reliever Travis Horschel (2-2) earned the win. He gave up four hits and an unearned run while walking one and striking out one in 3.1 innings. Teammate Chase Swing picked up his third save of the year. He tossed 2.1 innings, allowing one hit a run (earned) while striking out three without a walk.

The Commodores built a 3-0 lead after four innings. Zach Simpson gave Vanderbilt a 1-0 lead in the third inning when he singled through the middle of the infield to bring in Tony Mansolino. An inning later, John Kaye singled to center field to score Cesar Nicolas. After Kaye went to third base on a single by Warner Jones, Worth Scott hit a sacrifice fly to right center field that brought home Kaye to give Vanderbilt a 3-0 lead.

After MTSU rallied for a 5-3 lead, Vanderbilt attempted a comeback in the sixth frame. Kaye and Jones began the inning with singles and took second and third base respectively on a passed ball by MTSU catcher Derek Phillips. Scott followed with a blooper along the right field line that was ruled a catch after Cliff Thomas made a diving attempt. Kaye ran back to third base, tagged up and came home to make the score 5-4. However, Jones was doubled up on second base for the second out of the inning. Tony Mansolino then bunted out to the pitcher to end the inning.

Mansolino went a team-best 3-for-4 at the plate, including a ninth-inning solo home run to left field. Kaye recorded two hits while Scott posted two RBI.

The Commodores registered 11 hits against Middle Tennessee. It marked the fifth consecutive game Vanderbilt has posted 10 or

more hits in a contest. Commodore starter Jensen Lewis pitched four innings, striking out five and surrendering six hits, two runs (one earned) and a walk.

Next Up For VU

Vanderbilt continues its seven-game homestand to complete the month of April. Game four of the homestand is Tuesday against Austin Peay at 7 p.m. Nationally ranked Auburn visits Hawkins Field next weekend for a three-game SEC series beginning Friday at 7 p.m. Game two is Saturday at 4 p.m. The series finale is Sunday at 1 p.m.

- SEASON NOTES -

Sowers Earns SEC Pitcher of the Week

Vanderbilt sophomore left-hander Jeremy Sowers was named Southeastern Conference Pitcher of the Week announced April 7 by the league office.

Sowers scattered five hits, struck out 11 batters and allowed one earned run in seven innings in Vanderbilt's 2-1 victory over then-No. 13 Florida on April 4. The Commodores went on to sweep the three-game series from Florida and pulled into a three-way tie for second place in the SEC Eastern Division.

The victory was Sowers' first of the season in eight starts. All of his five hits allowed were singles with the exception of a C.J. Smith solo home run in the sixth inning. He has allowed two earned runs or fewer in each of his last five starts. Sowers' double-digit strike-out total was the third of the season and sixth of his career (24 appearances with 21 starts).

It marks the second time that Sowers has earned the SEC's weekly pitching award. He grabbed SEC Pitcher of the Week honors on February 25, 2001 after he struck out 10 batters and scattered four hits in his college debut, a 6-5 victory at Louisville.

The award is Vanderbilt's fifth since 1987 when the conference started honoring both a position player and pitcher each week. Last year, Sowers was the first Commodore pitcher to garner recognition since Phillips Hailer earned the award for the week of April 29, 1996. Mike McLochlin (April 24, 1989) and Scott Newell (April 13, 1992) were Vanderbilt's first recipients.

Klosterman Sets Single-Game Assists Record

Sophomore shortstop Ryan Klosterman set the Vanderbilt single-game record for assists with 11 against East Tennessee State in the Commodores' 5-4 win (2/18). The previous record was nine held by four former Commodores, including Terry Geshke (vs. Georgia [4/21/62]), Joey Jackson (vs. Rollins [3/4/86]), Dede Malmo (vs. Lipscomb [3/30/88]) and Brad Reese (vs. Memphis [3/11/90]).

While the Southeastern Conference does not have records for most assists, the NCAA record book lists only eight other players in collegiate baseball history to register more than 11 assists in a nine-inning game. The NCAA record is 14 set by Florida's Kevin Polcovich against Tennessee (4/27/91).

Klosterman recorded at least one assist in seven different innings. He was busiest in the second inning, when he made all three assists, and in the seventh and eighth innings when he lent a hand in two of the three outs.

Nicolas' Comeback Complete

Cesar Nicolas completed an amazing comeback when he made his first start of the season against East Tennessee State (2/18). The Vanderbilt junior infielder was inadvertently hit in the head with a swung bat, Jan. 18, in the batting cages adjacent to Hawkins Field. Nicolas suffered a mild concussion and broken temporal bones on the right side of his head.

Originally expected to miss the first two to three weeks of the season, Nicolas made his first appearance as a pinch hitter in both the season opener against Old Dominion and the following game against The Citadel.

- PRESEASON NOTES -

Sowers Garners Preseason Attention

Jeremy Sowers has earned second team All-America honors from *Baseball America* and third team All-America accolades from Louisville Slugger and "Collegiate Baseball" newspaper entering the 2003 season. *Baseball America* also tabbed him as the third-best sophomore in the country (at any position).

Sowers and Oklahoma left-hander David Purcey, who also earned second-team honors, were the only two sophomore hurlers to receive recognition from the *Baseball America* listing that included three All-America teams, honoring 15 pitchers. Sowers and Mississippi State junior left-hander Paul Maholm were the only pitchers from the Southeastern Conference represented.

Sowers was one of nine sophomore pitchers and 63 players overall chosen to the three teams selected by Louisville Slugger and "Collegiate Baseball." Sowers, Maholm and LSU senior right-hander Jake Tompkins were the three SEC pitchers honored.

Last year, Sowers was one of 19 starting pitchers nationwide to earn Freshman All-America honors from Louisville Slugger and "Collegiate Baseball." As the Commodores' top pitcher, Sowers went 6-5 while leading Vanderbilt in wins (six), ERA (4.37), innings pitched (101.0), strikeouts (85) and pickoffs (12). His 85 strikeouts tied for sixth-most by SEC pitchers and first among all freshmen hurlers in the league. His strikeout total also ranked third all-time among freshmen pitchers at Vanderbilt. His 101.0 innings pitched set a Vanderbilt record for freshmen pitchers.

Young 'Dores

The 2003 Vanderbilt Commodore baseball team is mostly young and unproven. Twenty players on the 27-man roster are underclassmen, including nine of the staff's 10 pitchers and six of the nine position players penciled into the lineup. The roster includes only six juniors and one senior.

Just how young are the Commodores? VU tops the SEC in the percentage of underclassmen on its roster.

Young Coaching Staff

Not to be outdone, the Commodore coaching staff ranks as one of the youngest in the conference. With an average age of 31.50 years old, the VU coaching staff is the second youngest in the SEC as the 2003 season starts. Only Georgia has a younger staff with an average age of 31.25.

Three Players Join Team in January

Three Commodores joined the squad in January and are not listed in the 2003 edition of the Vanderbilt media guide.

Sophomore infielder **Gil Kim** set the single-season record for assists (75) last season at Middlebury (Vermont) while starting all 28 games and hitting .310 with three doubles 12 RBI and 10 stolen bases. At The Lawrenceville School, Kim was named a 2001 Prep School honorable mention and 2000 second team All-State Prep School by the *Trentonian*. He helped guide his high school to the New Jersey Prep "A" championship as a junior and to a runner up finish as a sophomore. In high school he batted .210 as a senior with a double, five RBI and five stolen bases and hit .367 as a junior with three doubles, 10 RBI and 16 stolen bases.

Junior catcher/infielder **Mickey Kropf** started 33 of 40 games for the 2002 Ivy League Champion Harvard Crimson. Last season as a

sophomore, Kropf batted .263 with seven doubles and nine RBI. He made three errors in 235 chances. Mickey is the younger brother of former Commodore catcher Andy Kropf (1997-2000) who now plays in the Detroit Tigers organization.

Sophomore right-hander **Giovanni Seretti** went through fall practice as a freshman member of the Duke Blue Devils last season. After sitting out the spring season, he transferred to Vanderbilt. Seretti joined the VU football team prior to 2002 season and was a defensive back on the scout team. As a senior at Loyola High School (Calif.), Seretti posted a 6-3 mark with a 3.02 ERA and 68 strikeouts in 56 innings pitched.
