VU Faces Fourth Consecutive Ranked SEC Foe in Auburn

The Vanderbilt Commodores play their fourth consecutive series against a ranked opponent from the Southeastern Conference this weekend when No. 8 Auburn visits Hawkins Field for a three game series beginning Friday at 7 p.m. The series continues Saturday at 4 p.m. and concludes Sunday at 1 p.m. Sunday's game will be televised live by Comcast Sports Southeast.

Vanderbilt (20-19, 8-10 SEC) has won two of its last three series, sweeping then No-13 Florida, losing two of three at then-No. 25 Arkansas and taking two of three from then-No. 7 LSU last weekend in Nashville. The Commodores are tied with Tennessee for third place in the SEC Eastern Division, a game behind division-leading South Carolina and a half game behind second-place Florida.

Auburn (31-11, 12-6) stands a half game behind first-place LSU in the SEC Western Division after losing its first SEC series of the season last weekend at home against Arkansas. The Tigers lost two of three games, including two in a row for the first time this season.

Both teams have played several close games in 2003. Vanderbilt has played in 28 games decided by three runs or less, winning 11 of 13 one-run games. Auburn is 12-5 in games decided by two runs or less, including a 7-2 mark in one-run games.

Vanderbilt has enjoyed recent success against the SEC at home, winning five of six. Auburn has won 13 of 16 games on the

Vanderbilt Head Coach Tim Corbin

After nine seasons as an assistant coach at baseball power Clemson, Tim Corbin moves into the role of Commodore head coach in 2003 and looks to construct similar success at Vanderbilt.

Corbin helped the Tiger program produce more victories than all but four programs in the nation from 1994-2002. Clemson won more than 71 percent (434 wins, 172 losses) of its games, captured two Atlantic Coast Conference regular season titles, made nine appearances in the NCAA Tournament and fought its way to the **College World Series four times** (1995, 1996, 2000, and 2002) while Corbin assisted head coach Jack Leggett. **The Tigers ended the 2002 season with their ninth consecutive top 25 finish and their sixth top 10 finish since 1994.**

Joining Clemson as an assistant coach in 1994, Corbin worked his way up the Tiger coaching staff. Earning two promotions, Corbin received the title of assistant head coach in 1998 before becoming the associate head coach and recruiting coordinator in September 2001.

Along the way the organized, focused and enthusiastic understudy earned a national reputation as one of the most respected assistant coaches in the country. **He worked intensely while collecting nine talented recruiting classes — all of which were recognized among the top 25 in the nation.** His on-field work developing outfielders and hitters helped 20 Clemson players earn All-America accolades while 34 Tigers were later drafted to play professional baseball.

Corbin's dedication and attention to detail caught the eye of the national baseball publication *Baseball America* on numerous occasions. In 1997, it touted the Clemson coaching staff as one of the top five "College Recruiting Staffs" in the country. It later tabbed the 1999 Tiger freshmen class as No. 1 nationally. **And in 2000, *Baseball America* and the American Baseball Coaches Association named Corbin its National Coach of the Year.**

In 2000, Southern California head coach Mike Gillespie served as skipper of the USA Baseball team and quickly chose Corbin as an assistant on his staff. The staff helped guide the Americans to a gold-medal finish at the World Championships in the Netherlands, setting a record for best winning percentage (.900).

Prior to his tenure at Clemson, Corbin served as head coach at Presbyterian College for six seasons beginning in 1988. Restarting a baseball program that laid dormant for several years, Corbin directed Presbyterian College from NAIA to Division II status, posting a 106-138 overall record. Along the way, Corbin guided the Blue Hose to three consecutive appearances in the South Atlantic playoffs (1991-93) while earning South Atlantic Coach of the Year honors in 1990.

"Coach Corbin is one of the most dedicated people I've ever met. Whether it's working out in the weightroom with the players or recruiting, once he decides to do something he goes full bore ahead."

"He helped me a lot with the hitting aspects of my game. He knows a lot of the intricacies of different players' swings. So anytime you go into a slump, he knows the little things to point out and says them in a way to motivate you and help you turn around your swing.

"I've enjoyed knowing him off the field and going to his house and hanging out. I consider him as much a friend as any of the players on my team. He's a great person."

Sophomore southpaw Jeremy Sowers (4-4, 2.58 ERA) will start for Vanderbilt on Friday against Auburn sophomore left-hander Arnold Hughey (4-3, 4.26 ERA). Sowers has won his last three SEC starts, allowing only 15 hits, seven runs (six earned) and five walks to go along with 21 strikeouts in 22.1 innings.

Junior right-hander Robert Ransom (3-1, 4.95 ERA) will take the mound on Saturday for the Commodores. Ransom limited LSU to four hits and three earned runs in a six-inning no-decision effort last Saturday. He has surrendered five or fewer hits in three of his last five starts. Junior right-hander Colby Paxton (4-1, 3.71 ERA) starts for Auburn.

Freshman left-hander Ryan Mullins (2-6, 3.82 ERA) gets the nod on Sunday for Vanderbilt. He has 48 strikeouts compared to 13 walks in 61.1 innings. The Tigers will go with junior right-hander Cory Dueitt (6-1, 2.06 ERA).

Noting the Auburn Series

Auburn leads the all-time series 84-36-1 dating back to 1912... The Tigers have won 13 of the last 15 meetings and 22 of 25 since 1990. Vanderbilt's last series win over Auburn came in 1973 in Nashville... Vanderbilt also took two of three in Auburn in 1972... Vanderbilt last won back-to-back games against the Tigers in 1980 at the SEC Tournament.

Last year, Auburn won three one-run contests with last-inning heroics. The Tigers took game one 6-5 in the bottom of the ninth when Trent Pratt's walk-off single through the left side of the infield scored Javon Moran with the deciding run. Vanderbilt had rallied from a 4-0 third-inning deficit before losing.

Vanderbilt blew a 5-0 sixth-inning lead in game two to lose in the bottom of the ninth 6-5. This time it was Chuck Jeroloman's walk-off double to deep center field brought in Tug Hulett with the game winner.

The series finale saw Vanderbilt rally from a 6-0 deficit with a three-run sixth and a three-run eighth that forced extra innings. But again Auburn pulled out the dramatic win when Doug Vines smacked a 10th-inning walk off single that scored Tug Hulett to give Auburn a 7-6 series sweep.

Scouting Auburn

Auburn comes into Hawkins Field this weekend a half game out of first place in the SEC Western Division with a 12-6 conference record. The Tigers have won five of their six SEC series this season and 10 of 11 series overall in 2003. Last weekend, Auburn won one of three games at home against Arkansas (L 9-7, L 11-6, W 5-2).

Auburn ranks fourth in the SEC with a .312 batting average. The Tigers are led offensively by Tug Hulett's .400 batting average, 68 hits and 20 doubles. Bobby Huddleston has a team-best nine home runs and 43 RBI.

The Tiger pitching staff ranks ninth in the league with a 4.03 ERA. Levale Speigner (7-0) is undefeated this season. He has struck out 37 batters and allowed 17 runs (14 earned) in 44.2 innings. Arnold Hughey leads the staff with 47 strikeouts in 61.1 innings. Cory Dueitt has made a team-high 23 appearances, 21 out of the bullpen.

Dore Data Heading into the Weekend

- With 20 wins this season, Tim Corbin is one victory shy of tying the school record for wins by a first-year head coach. Roy Mewbourne won 21 games in his inaugural season at Vanderbilt in 1979.
- The Commodores have played 17 games against ranked opponents this season second only to Auburn (20) among SEC teams. Vanderbilt owns a 7-10 record in those games while Auburn is 13-7.
- Vanderbilt leads all SEC East teams with five wins against teams from the SEC West.
- Vanderbilt looks to win its third series in a season for only the second time since 1997. Vanderbilt won four series (Ole Miss, Florida, Tennessee and Kentucky) in 1997.
- Vanderbilt edged Austin Peay 3-2 in 11 innings on Tuesday. It marked the 28th game this season decided by three runs or less and the eighth decided in extra innings. Vanderbilt is 11-2 in one-run games and 5-3 in extra innings.
- Vanderbilt set a Hawkins Field three-game series attendance record of 4,475 last weekend in the LSU series.
- Vanderbilt's two-games-to-one series win over LSU marked the Tigers first series loss of the league season.
- The Commodores have won six of their last nine games against ranked league opponents.
- VU's series win over LSU was its second in a row against the Tigers. Vanderbilt won its first two games against the Tigers last weekend to stretch its win streak over LSU to a series-record four games. The series win was VU's first over LSU in Nashville since 1988.
- The Commodores 5-4 win Saturday against LSU marked their eighth league win of the year, surpassing last year's total of seven.

Klosterman Ranks 10th Nationally in Stolen Bases; Among Best in VU History

Ryan Klosterman's mischief on the base paths continues to cause headaches for opposing pitchers. And now his number of stolen bases per game rank among the nation's best. NCAA statistics (through 4/13) list the Vanderbilt shortstop tied for eighth, averaging 0.71 stolen bases a game. The mark is tied with Prairie View's Michael Willis, Florida State's Stephen Drew and UAB's Steve Martin.

The sophomore has 25 stolen bases in 32 attempts entering the week. Heading into the week, Klosterman ranked second in the SEC in stolen bases (24), one behind Tennessee's Jordan Czarniecki. His 32 steal attempts lead the league.

Klosterman's stolen base total entering the week (25) is tied for 11th most in Vanderbilt history for a single season. See chart below:

Nicolas Named Southeastern Conference Player of the Week

VU junior first baseman Cesar Nicolas was named the Southeastern Conference Player of the Week announced Monday by the league office.

Nicolas was instrumental in the Commodores series win last weekend over then-No. 7 LSU at Hawkins Field. Nicolas hit a team-best .462 (6-for-13) against the Tigers, and provided the series-clinching, walk-off single Saturday in Vanderbilt's 5-4, 10-inning victory over LSU. The series win was Vanderbilt's second consecutive over the Tigers and first at home since 1988.

The Miami, Fla., native went 2-for-4 Sunday against LSU to extend his current hit streak to a career-high eight games. During the stretch, Nicolas has tallied five multi-hit games while batting .438 (14-for-32) with a home run, two doubles, nine RBI and five runs scored.

Nicolas leads all Commodores with a .366 average, five home runs and 23 RBI. He also leads the team with 19 multi-hit games and six multi-RBI contests this season. He has a team-best .371 average, two home runs and 13 RBI in league games.

Nicolas becomes the second Commodore to receive the weekly SEC honor. Jeremy Sowers was named the league's pitcher of the week on April 7 after leading Vanderbilt to a series sweep of then-No. 13 Florida.

Nicolas becomes the 14th Vanderbilt position player to earn the accolade since the SEC began naming a player of the week in 1985. The last Vanderbilt position player to receive the recognition was Ulises Cabrea in 2001.

The Commodores (19-19 overall, 8-10 SEC) are tied with Tennessee for third place in the SEC Eastern Division standings. Vanderbilt is a game behind division-leading South Carolina and a half game behind second-place Florida.

Offensive Turnaround Continues

Since falling to a season-low .239 batting average following a 2-0 loss at South Carolina on March 28, Vanderbilt's offense has turned the corner and has helped contribute to the Commodores recent successes. VU is currently hitting .263 on the season, its highest average since March 6.

Over the past 15 games Commodore hitters are batting .298 (159-for-533) with 29 doubles, six home runs and 64 runs driven in. During the streak, Vanderbilt has posted 10 or more hits 11 times, including nine of its last 11 games.

Several Commodores have keyed the resurgence including:

• **Cesar Nicolas** is hitting .400 (14-for-35) with a home run, two doubles, nine RBI and five runs in his last nine games. Nicolas' walk-off single Saturday against LSU clinched the series win over then-No. 7 LSU.

• **Tony Mansolino** is hitting at a .381 clip (16-for-42) during his current 11-game hit streak. He has four doubles, a triple, nine RBI, two home runs and five runs scored during his streak. Over his last 17 games the sophomore third baseman is batting .339 (21-for-62) with five doubles, a triple, two home runs, 10 RBI and five runs scored. Mansolino opened

the season with a .037 average (1-for-27) during the month of February.

• **Ryan Klosterman** is hitting .377 with six doubles a home run, five RBI and 14 runs scored over his last 15 games. The sophomore shortstop saw his career-long 12-game hit streak end Saturday.

• **Warner Jones** is hitting .410 (25-for-61) with eight RBI, four doubles, a triple, a home run and nine runs scored over his last 17 games. He tied a career-high with three hits while adding a home run Friday against LSU.

• **John Kaye** is hitting .368 (14-for-38) with six RBI, and nine runs scored during his last 11 games. His career-long nine-game hit streak ended Sunday.

Zeller's Walk-Off Single in 11th Gives Vanderbilt 3-2 Win Over Austin Peay

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Matt Zeller went 2-for-5 with two RBI, including a 11th-inning walk-off single to left center field that scored Jonathan Douillard from second base as Vanderbilt edged Austin Peay 3-2, Tuesday, April 22 at Hawkins Field.

The win snaps the Commodores' three-game non-conference losing streak and improves their record to 20-19 overall. Austin Peay drops to 16-20-1 on the season.

Douillard led off the bottom of the 10th with a single to left field off Governors' reliever Jeff Mault (1-2). He moved to second base on a sacrifice bunt by Zach Simpson. Ryan Klosterman followed with a walk that put run-

Commodore starter Blake Owen pitched well. He allowed only three hits, two runs (both earned) and two walks to go along with three strikeouts in seven-plus innings of work. He retired 13 consecutive batters from the second inning into the sixth.

Vanderbilt built a 2-0 lead only to see Austin Peay rally for two runs, on no hits, in the top of the eighth inning. James Ray walked and scored on a balk by VU reliever Matt Buschmann to trim Vanderbilt's lead to 2-1. Mitchell Turriglio tied the game at 2-2 when he scored two batters later on Ron Bethke's fielder's choice ground ball to Simpson at second base.

Tony Mansolino stretched his current hit streak to a career-high 11 games when his fourth-inning triple down the right-field line scored John Kaye from first base to give Vanderbilt a 1-0 lead.

The lead grew to 2-0 in the seventh when Zeller singled to left field to bring in Klosterman from second base.

Warner Jones, Klosterman and Kaye joined Zeller with two hits apiece against Austin Peay pitching. Klosterman has hit safely in 14 of his last 15 games. Cesar Nicolas, the Southeastern Conference Player of the Week, went 0-for-3 with a pair of walks. Mickey Kropf made his first start as a Commodore at third base, but was hitless at the plate.

Vanderbilt does not play a mid-week game this coming week. The Commodores return to action next weekend when they begin a seven-game road trip at Georgia (May 2-4).

Sowers Earns SEC Pitcher of the Week

Vanderbilt sophomore left-hander Jeremy Sowers was named Southeastern Conference Pitcher of the Week announced April 7 by the league office.

Sowers scattered five hits, struck out 11 batters and allowed one earned run in seven innings in Vanderbilt's 2-1 victory over then-No. 13 Florida on April 4. The Commodores went on to sweep the three-game series from Florida and pulled into a three-way tie for second place in the SEC Eastern Division.

The victory was Sowers' first of the season in eight starts. All of his five hits allowed were singles with the exception of a C.J. Smith solo home run in the sixth inning. He has allowed two earned runs or fewer in each of

his last five starts. Sowers' double-digit strike-out total was the third of the season and sixth of his career (24 appearances with 21 starts).

It marks the second time that Sowers has earned the SEC's weekly pitching award. He grabbed SEC Pitcher of the Week honors on February 25, 2001 after he struck out 10 batters and scattered four hits in his college debut, a 6-5 victory at Louisville.

The award is Vanderbilt's fifth since 1987 when the conference started honoring both a position player and pitcher each week. Last year, Sowers was the first Commodore pitcher to garner recognition since Phillips Hailer earned the award for the week of April 29, 1996. Mike McLochlin (April 24, 1989) and Scott Newell (April 13, 1992) were Vanderbilt's first recipients.

Klosterman Sets Single-Game Assists Record

Sophomore shortstop Ryan Klosterman set the Vanderbilt single-game record for assists with 11 against East Tennessee State in the Commodores' 5-4 win (2/18). The previous record was nine held by four former Commodores, including Terry Geshke (vs. Georgia [4/21/62]), Joey Jackson (vs. Rollins [3/4/86]), Dede Malmo (vs. Lipscomb [3/30/88])

and Brad Reese (vs. Memphis [3/11/90]).

While the Southeastern Conference does not have records for most assists, the NCAA record book lists only eight other players in collegiate baseball history to register more than 11 assists in a nine-inning game. The NCAA record is 14 set by Florida's Kevin Polcovich against Tennessee (4/27/91).

Klosterman recorded at least one assist in seven different innings. He was busiest in the second inning, when he made all three assists, and in the seventh and eighth innings when he lent a hand in two of the three outs.

Nicolas' Comeback Complete

Cesar Nicolas completed an amazing comeback when he made his first start of the season against East Tennessee State (2/18). The Vanderbilt junior infielder was inadvertently hit in the head with a swung bat, Jan. 18, in the batting cages adjacent to Hawkins Field. Nicolas suffered a mild concussion and broken temporal bones on the right side of his head.

Originally expected to miss the first two to three weeks of the season, Nicolas made his first appearance as a pinch hitter in both the season opener against Old Dominion and the following game against The Citadel.

Commodore Comparison

The 2003 VU baseball team continues to show improvement from a year ago. The most significant upgrades have come on the pitching staff where Commodore hurlers are allowing two fewer earned runs a game in 2003. Hits and walks allowed are down and strikeouts are up.

Sowers Garners Preseason Attention

Jeremy Sowers has earned second team All-America honors from *Baseball America* and third team All-America accolades from Louisville Slugger and "Collegiate Baseball" newspaper entering the 2003 season. *Baseball America* also tabbed him as the third-best sophomore in the country (at any position).

Sowers and Oklahoma left-hander David Purcey, who also earned second-team honors, were the only two sophomore hurlers to receive recognition from the *Baseball America* listing that included three All-America teams, honoring 15 pitchers. Sowers and Mississippi State junior left-hander Paul Maholm were the only pitchers from the Southeastern Conference represented.

Sowers was one of nine sophomore pitchers and 63 players overall chosen to the three teams selected by Louisville Slugger and "Collegiate Baseball." Sowers, Maholm and LSU senior right-hander Jake Tompkins were the three SEC pitchers honored.

Last year, Sowers was one of 19 starting pitchers nationwide to earn Freshman All-America honors from Louisville Slugger and "Collegiate Baseball." As the Commodores' top pitcher, Sowers went 6-5 while leading Vanderbilt in wins (six), ERA (4.37), innings pitched (101.0), strikeouts (85) and pickoffs (12). His 85 strikeouts tied for sixth-most by SEC pitchers and first among all freshmen hurlers in the league. His strikeout total also ranked third all-time among freshmen pitchers at Vanderbilt. His 101.0 innings pitched set a Vanderbilt record for freshmen pitchers.

Young 'Dores

The 2003 Vanderbilt Commodore baseball team is mostly young and unproven. Twenty players on the 27-man roster are underclassmen, including nine of the staff's 10 pitchers and six of the nine position players penciled into the lineup. The roster includes only six juniors and one senior.

Young Coaching Staff

Not to be outdone, the Commodore coaching staff ranks as one of the youngest in the conference. With an average age of 31.50 years old, the VU coaching staff is the second youngest in the SEC as the 2003 season starts. Only Georgia has a younger staff with an average age of 31.25.

The Commodore staff includes head coach

Tim Corbin (42 years old), assistant coaches Derek Johnson (32) and Erik Bakich (25) and volunteer assistant Michael Holder (27).

In comparison, Georgia includes head coach David Perno (35), assistants Butch Thompson (32) and David Eckstein (29) and volunteer coach Jason Eller (29).

Three Players Join Team in January

Three Commodores joined the squad in January and are not listed in the 2003 edition of the Vanderbilt media guide.

Sophomore infielder **Gil Kim** set the single-season record for assists (75) last season at Middlebury (Vermont) while starting all 28 games and hitting .310 with three doubles 12 RBI and 10 stolen bases. At The Lawrenceville School, Kim was named a 2001 Prep School honorable mention and 2000 second team All-State Prep School by the *Trentonian*. He helped guide his high school to the New Jersey Prep "A" championship as a junior and to a runner up finish as a sophomore. In high school he batted .210 as a senior with a double, five RBI and five stolen bases and hit .367 as a junior with three doubles, 10 RBI and 16 stolen bases.

Junior catcher/infielder **Mickey Kropf** started 33 of 40 games for the 2002 Ivy League Champion Harvard Crimson. Last season as a

sophomore, Kropf batted .263 with seven doubles and nine RBI. He made three errors in 235 chances. Mickey is the younger brother of former Commodore catcher Andy Kropf (1997-2000) who now plays in the Detroit Tigers organization.

Sophomore right-hander **Giovanni Seretti** went through fall practice as a freshman member of the Duke Blue Devils last season. After sitting out the spring season, he transferred to Vanderbilt. Seretti joined the VU football team prior to 2002 season and was a defensive back on the scout team. As a senior at Loyola High School (Calif.), Seretti posted a 6-3 mark with a 3.02 ERA and 68 strikeouts in 56 innings pitched.

Post-game interviews with head coach Tim Corbin and requested players may be conducted after a mandatory 10-minute cooling off period.

Practice Policy

Vanderbilt baseball practices are open to the media and the public. Practice starts at 3 p.m. Media are encouraged to arrive at Hawkins Field by 2:00 p.m. to conduct interviews between 2-2:30 p.m. Members of the media are asked to notify the Media Relations office in advance if they play to attend practice.

Parking

Media parking is available inside Gate 2 of the Vanderbilt Football stadium. The entrance to Gate 2 is on Natchez Trace near the corner of Natchez Trace and Jess Neely Drive. Gate 2 is within a short walk along the football stadium concourse to Hawkins Field. Requests to park in this area must be arranged through Vanderbilt Media Relations.
