THE VU-UGA SERIES

Georgia has captured the last seven games played between the schools, and nine of the last 10. Vanderbilt's last victory in the series (43-30 in 1994) came in Athens. The Commodores won eight of the

first 10 games played between the schools. Vanderbilt was 13-7-1 in the series before 1958; and just 4-36-1 afterward.

JOHNSON REINSTATES CUTLER, BRIGHAM, WALTHOUR

Head Coach Bobby Johnson said Monday that three Commodores - quarterback **Jay Cutler**, WR **Grant Brigham** and OLB **Brandon Walthour** - have been reinstated after one-game suspensions.

Johnson refused to dress Cutler, Brigham and Walthour during the Commodores' 21-20 loss against MTSU. The coach said the disciplinary action was due to team rules violations.

Cutler, a redshirt freshman, started the first five games at quarterback for Vanderbilt. He is the team leader in nearly every aerial category and remains the Commodores' single-game rushing leader

with 107 yards against Furman. He was replaced by junior Benji Walker against Middle Tennessee.

Brigham, a freshman, is Vanderbilt's top punt returner and has three receptions for 39 yards. Walthour has started three games at outside linebacker and was the team's fifth leading tackler entering the MTSU game.

The players were reinstated prior to practice Sunday.

JOHNSON LOOKING FOR FIRST WIN OVER BULLDOGS

Like his players, Vanderbilt Head Coach Bobby Johnson is seeking his victory against the Bulldogs. Johnson faced Georgia twice as a Clemson Tiger player, losing games in 1970 and 1971.

This is Johnson's first opportunity to coach against the Bulldogs.

FOUR VU STARTERS, TEN PLAYERS ARE GEORGIA RESIDENTS

The Vanderbilt roster includes 10 residents of Georgia, including four players likely to start Saturday in Athens.

The likely starters include senior OG **Jim May** and freshman P/K **Greg Johnson**, both graduates of Parkview High in Lilburn; sophomore DT **Matt Clay** of McEachern High in Powder Springs, and red-shirt freshman CB **Cheron Thompson** of Douglass High in Atlanta. Two other Commodores, sophomore TB **Norval McKenzie** of Powder Springs and freshman OG **Mac Pyle** of Adairsville, also have appeared in the VU starting lineup.

Other Commodores from Georgia include redshirt freshmen **Keith Williams** (North Clayton High in Riverdale) and Ronnie Swoopes (Clarke Central High in Athens), freshman **Herdley Harrison** (Marietta High) and freshman **Funtaine Hunter** (Lowndes County High near Valdosta).

BROTHERS, FRIENDS COULD MEET SATURDAY ON FIELD

The VU-UGA game matches a pair of offensive linemen who were best friends in high school and brothers who could be wearing different uniforms Saturday.

Senior VU LG **Jim May** and UGA OT Jon Stinchcomb were close friends, classmates and fellow linemen at Parkview High School in Lilburn. Both May and Stinchcomb were named as preseason All-conference offensive line selections. Also hailing from Parkview High is Vanderbilt's standout freshman kicking specialist Greg Johnson.

Commodore backup CB **Ronnie Swoopes** could face his younger brother, UGA freshman OL Randall Swoopes, this Saturday. Ronnie and his brother were raised in Athens, the sons of a former standout UGA defensive lineman. Ronnie Swoopes has not played this season for the Commodores.

Second-team VU WR **Keith Williams** knows plenty about UGA quarterback D.J. Shockley. Williams caught many of Shockley's passes as teammates and classmates at North Clayton High in Riverdale.

THE LAST VANDERBILT-GEORGIA MEETING

VANDERBILT 14, GEORGIA 30

OCT. 13, 2001, VANDERBILT STADIUM

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - The Commodores played hard in front of a homecoming audience, but fell to the talented Bulldogs 30-14. The final score easily could have been different. The Commodores' first and last drives of the game ended unsuccessfully at the UGA 1. Another fourth quarter drive resulted in a missed 38-yard field goal. Vanderbilt managed 23 first downs and 436 total yards on the Georgia defense, and controlled the clock, 34:40-25:20, by running a season-high 88 offensive plays. Greg Zolman passed for 316 yards, completing 24 of 50 attempts. Lew Thomas gained 75 yards on 23 carries. Dan Stricker had an outstanding game, catching eight passes for 137 yards. Linebacker Antuan Bradford led the defensive effort with 11 total tackles. He was supported by safety Justin Giboney (eight tackles) and linebacker Pat Brunner (six tackles).

COMMODORE TEAM SUPERLATIVES ENTERING GEORGIA GAME

★ Two of Vanderbilt's scoring drives last Saturday exceeded seven minutes in possession. The Commodores drew within one point of MTSU early in the fourth quarter, 14-13, following a 19-play, 58-yard drive culminated in Greg Johnson's 25-yard field goal. The 8:47 drive was the Commodores' longest - in terms of time of possession and total plays. Vanderbilt's first score, a 18-yard Johnson field goal, came after a 15-play, 83-yard drive.

★ Seven Commodores who started at least once in the first five games did not dress against Middle Tennessee. They include OG **Jordan Pettit**, TB **Ronald Hatcher**, RB **Norval McKenzie**, OLB **Moses Osemwegie**, QB **Jay Cutler**, DB **Dominique Morris** and OLB **Brandon Walthour**.

★ After leading the SEC in fewest penalties and penalty yardage entering the week-end, Vanderbilt dropped to seventh after being flagged for 14 infractions against MTSU, resulting in 141 yards in penalties. Among the infractions were five personal fouls, an illegal block on punt coverage and an unsportsmanlike conduct call.

Vanderbilt easily witnessed its worst performance of the year in both categories. The previous high was nine penalties (vs. Auburn) and 63 penalty yards (vs. South Carolina).

★ Vanderbilt's conversion rate inside the red zone - 88.9% - leads the SEC. They have scored on 16 of 18 possessions inside the opponents' 20 - 10 TDs and six FGs.

STRICKER CONTINUES UP SEC, VANDERBILT RECEIVING MARKS

Senior WR **Dan Stricker** jumped to 14th on the all-time SEC receptions list with four catches against Middle Tennessee.

Stricker, a native of Cincinnati, Ohio, has 160 career receptions, tied with former South Carolina Gamecock Zola Davis for 14th. He is 12 catches shy of entering the career Top Ten.

Stricker also needs 11 yards receiving to pass former Gator All-American Carlos Alvarez into 8th place all-time in the SEC.

Stricker will oppose the SEC's other top

active career receiver in Athens Saturday. Bulldog WR Terrence Edwards enters the game ninth all-time with 173 receptions.

TOP INDIVIDUAL SUPERLATIVES FOLLOWING MTSU GAME

★ Freshman **Greg Johnson** was remarkable, handling all of Vanderbilt's kicking chores in superb fashion. Johnson, a gradu-

ate of Parkview High in Lilburn, Ga., averaged 53 yards on six punts, including efforts of 65, 62, 58, 54 and 52 yards. Johnson's three longest punts all surpassed his previous collegiate best of 55 yards. Johnson's sixth effort - a 27-yarder - touched the foot of a Middle Tennessee returner and was recovered by VU's Andrew Pace on the MTSU 3. Vanderbilt scored seconds later to take the lead, 20-14.

Johnson took control of the SEC lead for punting with a 45.45-yard average, and ranks fourth in the NCAA.

Johnson also converted on both field goal attempts (18 & 25 yards), making him six of eight on the season. In 2001, the Commodores were successful on just four FGs the entire season.

★ Three Commodores - **Kwane Doster**, **Marty Morgan** and **Benji Walker** - earned their first career starts against Middle Tennessee.

Doster started at tailback replacing **Norval McKenzie**, a sophomore who sustained a broken lower leg in practice just three days before the MTSU game. Morgan started for injured OLB Moses Osemwegie while Walker gained his first start at quarterback in place of Jay Cutler.

★ Morgan and redshirt freshman DE **Jovan Haye** each recorded their first collegiate sacks against Middle Tennessee.

Morgan also added six additional tackles in addition to the sack in his finest performance of the season.

★ **Walker** also set several individual and season marks while starting at quarterback.

The junior completed 12 of 23 passes for 107 yards. He had two passes intercepted.

The 12 completions is a team high for the Commodores in 2002. The 23 attempts matches Cutler's team high against Georgia Tech.

Walker also set career highs for yards rushing (79) and carries (15) in the MTSU loss.

★ The Commodore starting safeties, senior FS **Justin Giboney** and SS **Jonathan Shaub**, both notched double-digit tackles against the Blue Raiders. Giboney had eight solo tackles and four assists for his highest total since the season opener at Georgia

Tech. Shaub put together his third consecutive strong showing, also contributing a dozen tackles for the Commodores. Giboney and Shaub are among the team leaders in tackles with 60 and 58, respectively.

★ The stats do not serve senior CB **Rushen Jones** well. Though credited with just a lone tackle, Jones limited standout Blue Raider WR Tyrone Calico for much of the game. Calico finished the game with just three receptions.

★ The bye week before the Middle Tennessee game helped sophomore **Brian Kovolisky**. The right guard played every offensive snap after missing the Commodores last outing against South Carolina due to an ankle injury.

★ The alert play of freshman safety **Andrew Pace** resulted in his first fumble recovery as a Commodore. After seeing that Greg Johnson's punt inadvertently touched the foot of a MTSU returner, Pace made the recovery inside the Blue Raider 5. The turnover led to a Commodore touchdown.

★ Senior CB **Aaron McWhorter** made his first interception of the year, with just 4:53 left, to end a Blue Raider threat. It was his second career interception.

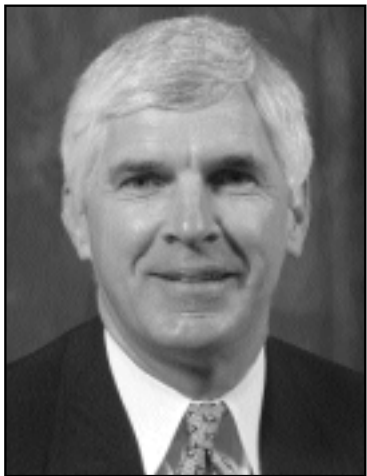
