WALKER TO GET FIRST QB START; CUTLER, BRIGHAM TO MISS GAME

Benji Walker is expected to make his first start at quarterback when the Commodores face Middle Tennessee Saturday night.

Walker, a junior from Brentwood, Tenn., will replace Jay Cutler, who will miss the Middle Tennessee game following a suspen-

sion by Coach Bobby Johnson for violation of team rules.

Walker and Cutler battled for the starting job through Spring Practice and much of the preseason before Cutler earned the role. Walker played in the Commodores' first three games.

This year, Walker has completed six of nine passes for 48 yards and rushed for 28 yards on five attempts.

Coach Johnson announced the suspensions of Cutler and receiver Grant Brigham on Sept. 30.

VANDERBILT TEAM SUPERLATIVES ENTERING MIDDLE TENNESSEE GAME

★ Through five games, Vanderbilt has rushed for 1009 yards, averaging 201.8 yards per game (5th best in the SEC). At the same time last season, the Commodores were averaging 144.8 yards rushing. The VU rushing offense currently ranks 28th in

the NCAA.

★ Vanderbilt's kicking game, a big question mark entering the season, has been superb due to true freshman Greg Johnson. Johnson has converted on all 14 extra point attempts and four of six field goals. Johnson's punting has been outstanding: he currently ranks 13th in the NCAA with a 43.5-yard average.

★ The Commodores have committed the fewest penalties (29) in the SEC. Their 213 yards in penalties also is the fewest in the conference.

★ Vanderbilt has outscored its opponents 38-23 in the fourth quarter. The +15 margin ranks fifth in the SEC. In 2001, the Commodores were outscored 100-37 in the final stanza, worst in the SEC. The Commodores have not fared so well in the third quarter, being outscored 62-24 on the season.

★ Vanderbilt has converted on 85% of its possessions in the red zone (eight TDs/four FGs). Only Kentucky, Mississippi State and LSU have converted more frequently.

★ Though the Commodores committed just one turnover against South Carolina (a last-minute interception), the squad must improve its season turnover margin of minus-7.

INDIVIDUAL SUPERLATIVES FROM VANDERBILT-SOUTH CAROLINA GAME

★ Linebacker **Hunter Hillenmeyer** enters the Middle Tennessee game off a career performance against South Carolina that enabled him to become one of the nation's leading tacklers.

Hillenmeyer earned 18 tackles against USC, five more than his previous high of 15 at Auburn earlier this season. The total also included 12 solo stops - another career high.

Entering the bye week, Hillenmeyer ranked second nationally - and first in the SEC - with 49 solo tackles, averaging 9.8 primary stops per game. The NCAA leader, Lawrence Flugence of Texas Tech, had 55 solo tackles entering last weekend. Hillenmeyer's total of 68 tackles ranked fifth in the NCAA. His average of 13.6 total tackles was second in the SEC only to Bradie James of LSU (14.0 per game).

The performance comes as Hillenmeyer continues to learn a new position. A former outside linebacker, Hillenmeyer was moved inside last spring as the new Commodore coaching staff switched from a 3-4 alignment to a 4-3 look.

Hillenmeyer also has a team-high five tackles for loss, and a sack through five games.

★ The 11-yard TD reception by **M.J. Garrett** was the second time he has posted TD catches in consecutive games. He accomplished the feat previously in the 2000 season finale versus Tennessee and the 2001 opener against Middle Tennessee.

In the 2001 game against Middle Tennessee, Garrett had one of the best games ever by a VU receiver. He caught eight passes for 219 yards (second highest yardage total in VU history). He also had a 73-yard TD catch (longest for the Commodores last season).

★ Sophomore tailback **Norval McKenzie** topped the Commodores with 70 yards rushing against USC. He is on pace to become the Commodores' top rusher since Jermaine gained 1,072 yards in

THE LAST VU-MTSU MEETING: VANDERBILT 28, MTSU 37

AUGUST 30, 2001, VANDERBILT STADIUM

Nashville, Tenn. - Vanderbilt's most productive quarter in nearly two years wasn't enough to stop Middle Tennessee from pulling an opening-season 37-28 upset in front of 39,885 fans. The Commodores lost despite one of the greatest receiving games in Vanderbilt history by junior wideout M.J. Garrett. The Old Hickory, Tenn. native, who entered the game with 12 career catches, had eight receptions for 219 yards, including a 73-yarder in the second quarter that put Vanderbilt ahead 28-24 at the half. The 219-yard effort was the second highest single-game accumulation ever by a VU receiver. After two touchdowns by halfback Dwone Hicks gave Middle Tennessee an early 14-0 lead, Vanderbilt scored 28 points in the second quarter to gain the four-point halftime margin. The points were provided on runs by Rodney Williams and Lew Thomas, and touchdown passes from Greg Zolman to Dan Stricker and Garrett. The 28-point outburst was Vanderbilt's highest since Oct. 9, 1999 against The Citadel.

1995. McKenzie's 7.8-yard per carry average is tied with Shaud Williams of Alabama for best in the SEC's top ten rushers.

★ **SS Jonathan Shaub** followed up an excellent game at Ole Miss with one of the best performances of his career versus USC.

The junior had nine tackles, an interception, forced fumble and two tackles for loss in the narrow USC loss.

Only two teammates - Hillenmeyer and free safety Justin Giboney - have more total tackles than the 46 stops achieved by Shaub.

★ Freshman TB/KR **Kwane Doster** is second in the SEC (and 13th nationally) in all-purpose yardage, averaging 157.8 per game. He also ranks 19th nationally with a 26.7-yard kickoff return average. The VU record for kickoff return average (minimum of 15 attempts) is held by Tony Jackson (24.8 yards in 1992).

★ Redshirt freshman CB **Cheron Thompson** earned his first start in the Commodore secondary, subbing for Dominique Morris, who sat out the USC game with a foot injury.

Thompson was in on a pair of tackles while playing 69 of 74 defensive snaps.

★ True freshman **Mac Pyle** played every down at offensive guard for the Commodores, allowing regular starter Brian Kovolisky to heal an ankle injury.

It was Pyle's second consecutive start versus an SEC opponent.

WALKER TO FACE FORMER PREP TEAMMATES IN MTSU GAME

Benji Walker will face some familiar faces as he makes his first career start versus Middle Tennessee.

Two starters for the Blue Raiders - DT Jerry Vanderpool and OG Josh Willoughby - were Walker's prep teammates at powerful Brentwood Academy just south of Nashville.

★ Sophomore DE **Robert Dinwiddie** and MTSU's Gary Sanders were teammates at Hendersonville (Tenn.) High School.

★ Freshman LB **Fontaine Hunter** and MTSU starting safety Michael Woods played in the same secondary for Lowndes County

High School near Valdosta, Ga.

★ Another VU freshman LB, **Herdley Harrison**, was a teammate of MTSU FB Nick McAfee at Marietta (Ga.) High.

★ Junior FB **Zeke Brandon** and MTSU DT Kai Zeigler played on the same Copperas Cove (Texas) team.

★ Freshman WR **Erik Davis** and MTSU QB J.P. Shelly were teammates at Ezell-Harding High in Nashville.

RECRUITING

Tennessee and Georgia are the most common residences for players on both Vanderbilt and Middle Tennessee. The Commodores have 24 players from the two states, while MTSU has more than 60 players from the two states.

STRICKER CONTINUES UP SEC, VANDERBILT RECEIVING MARKS

Senior WR **Dan Stricker** will tie the Vanderbilt record for all-time TD receptions with his next catch in the end zone.

Stricker, a native of Cincinnati, Ohio, took over sole possession of second place in the VU record books with his 19th career TD catch against USC - a three-yarder from Jay Cutler in the second quarter.

Stricker continued to move up the SEC all-time lists for receptions and receiving yards with a five-catch, 43-yard performance against the Gamecocks. He is ninth and 16th in career yardage and receptions, respectively.

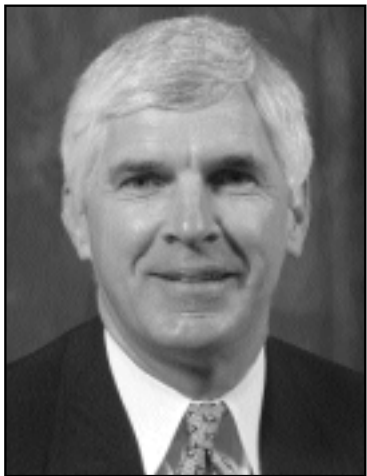
