COMMODORES & REBELS PLAYED IN 2001 SEASON FINALE

Due to the tragic events of September 11, 2001, Vanderbilt and Ole Miss last played a little more than 10 months ago. Last year, the teams were matched up in

the season finale on Dec. 1 after the SEC cancelled the game from its original Sept. 15, 2001 date. The Rebels used a 28-point fourth quarter to overcome the Commodores, 38-27.

In another scheduling oddity, the Vanderbilt-Ole Miss meeting will be held on the same field (Vaught-Hemingway Stadium in Oxford) for the second consecutive year. The Commodores also traveled to Oxford last year for the season finale.

The last time it happened in the series, Vanderbilt topped Ole Miss in Nashville in 1959 and 1960.

Later this season, the schedule also allows Vanderbilt to host the Alabama Crimson Tide for a second straight year.

Vanderbilt has experienced limited success in its recent journeys to the Ole Miss campus. The team has won two of its last six appearances at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium (37-34 in 1999 and 30-27 in 1991).

VANDERBILT-AUBURN GAME NOTES

The Commodores showed vast improvement in the two weeks between the opener at Georgia Tech and the road trip to Auburn. Midway through the third quarter, the Commodores were driving against Auburn, down by just eight (14-6) before a pair of costly penalties slowed the possession. Later in the quarter, a turnover ended another drive as the Commodores sought to erase Auburn's 17-6 lead.

Though matching the Tigers in several statistical categories (19-19 in first downs, 31:24-28:36 time of possession edge), the Commodores also committed a season-high four turnovers (two fumbles, two interceptions). Auburn recovered both fumbles for TDs and scored on a three-play drive after the second interception.

A season-high nine penalties - for 60 yards - also affected the Commodores' chances.

★ The Commodores youth was apparent through much of the third quarter when the Vanderbilt offensive backfield consisted of two redshirt freshmen (**QB Jay Cutler** and **FB Matt Tant**) and a true freshman (**TB Kwane Doster**). The trio were Vanderbilt's leading rushers against Auburn.

★ Through much of the first half against Auburn, defensive line coach David Turner freely substituted a second unit consisting of **DE Robert Dinwiddie**, **DT Brett Beard**, **DT Ralph McKenzie** and **DE Chris Booker**.

VANDERBILT-AUBURN INDIVIDUAL SUPERLATIVES

★ Senior **Hunter Hillenmeyer** continues to do an outstanding job at middle linebacker after playing outside linebacker in the 3-4 set last two years. Hillenmeyer posted career highs in solo tackles (11), total tackles (15) and tackles for loss (3) against Auburn. His performance also included a six-yard QB sack.

Hillenmeyer's previous high of 13 total tackles came in the season opener at Georgia Tech. One of the SEC's leading tacklers, Hillenmeyer has posted double digit tackles in all three games this season.

★ Senior **OLB Brandon Walthour** made the first start of his Commodore career against Auburn in place of redshirt freshman Moses Osemwegie. Walthour started while playing with a broken thumb.

Late in the second quarter, Walthour recovered a Ronnie Brown fumble deep in Vanderbilt territory to stop an Auburn threat. The fumble was forced by sophomore **DT Aaron Carter**.

★ Though he didn't start, **Osemwegie** made his presence felt immediately after entering the game, sacking Auburn QB Daniel Cobb for a 12-yard loss on his first defensive play. Osemwegie also added another tackle for a loss and forced a fumble by Cobb while playing on a sore knee.

★ Vanderbilt had its first blocked field goal in nearly four years when senior **SS Justin Giboney** knocked down an attempt by Damon Duval early in the first quarter. It was VU's first block since Oct. 3, 1998 when Alphonso Harvey achieved the feat in overtime against Texas Christian.

Giboney also performed well in the defensive secondary, recording nine total tackles. He is the Commodores' second leading tackler behind Hillenmeyer.

★ **Sophomore WR Brandon Smith** achieved a career high with four catches against Auburn, good for 58 yards. Three of Smith's receptions resulted in first downs for the Commodores. Smith's previous high for receptions in a game came last year against Alabama. His 28-yard

THE LAST VU-OLE MISS MEETING: VANDERBILT 27, OLE MISS 38

DEC. 1, 2001, VAUGHT-HEMINGWAY STADIUM

OXFORD, Miss. - For three quarters, the Commodores played some of their finest football of the year. In the final quarter, Ole Miss QB Eli Manning took over, leading the Rebels to a 38-27 victory over a spirited Vanderbilt team playing for the last time under Woody Widenhofer.

The Commodores, playing before a regional television audience, shocked Ole Miss with 14 unanswered points in the third quarter to open a 20-3 lead late in the third quarter as the defense limited the Rebels to 265 total yards. Zolman threw for 286 yards, tying a career high with three touchdown passes, 26 yards to M.J. Garrett, 50 yards to Dan Stricker, and 28 yards to Jason Mathenia. Down 27-17, Manning guided Ole Miss to three TDs in the final eight minutes.

Several Commodore offensive players sparkled. Stricker caught 11 passes for 169 yards. His season total of 1,079 yards receiving is the third highest in VU history. Rodney Williams ran for 96 yards, becoming just the seventh 'Dore to surpass 2,000 career rushing yards.

catch was the Commodores' longest offensive play of the game Saturday.

★ Redshirt freshman **RB Matthew Tant** achieved career highs for rushing yards and attempts against Auburn. Tant, playing both TB and FB, gained 43 yards on nine carries.

★ **QB Jay Cutler** had 16 rushing attempts Saturday, the most of his brief career. He netted 32 rushing yards.

Cutler is also rising up VU's charts for freshman QBs. After throwing for 120 yards at Auburn, Cutler passed the freshman passing achievements of former Commodore signal callers - Kurt Page (1981),

Ronnie Gordon (1993) and Ardell Fuller (1981). The record for passing yards by a Commodore freshman is held by Vanderbilt radio network color analyst John Gromos, who threw for 1,483 yards in 1985.

Entering the Ole Miss game, Cutler is also the team leader in rushing attempts (31) and rushing yards (163).

★ Senior **TE Tom Simone** caught both passes thrown his way in his first start of the season. Simone started 10 of 11 games last year, and has alternated with junior **Nick Getter** for playing time.

★ Freshman **TB Kwane Doster**, who rushed for 33 yards, also returned three kickoffs for 84 yards, including a career-long 34-yarder.

★ Freshman **kicker Greg Johnson** made both of his field goal attempts - 28 and 32 yards - and has hit three of four on the season. Johnson also averaged 44.8 yards on four punts.

STRICKER CLIMBING SEC AND VANDERBILT RECEIVING MARKS

Senior WR **Dan Stricker** moved into the all-time Top 10 among Southeastern Conference receivers in career receiving yardage with his performance against Auburn.

Stricker caught three passes for 33 yards in the first half against Auburn, but went without a reception in the second half.

The 33-yard total pushed his career receiving yardage to 2,448, up to 10th all-time in the SEC. Next on the list is former Auburn great Terry Beasley (2,507).

Stricker also moved into sole possession as the third leading Vanderbilt receiver with 148 career catches. He will move into the SEC Top 20 in the category after two more receptions.

COACHING TIES TO BOTH SCHOOLS

Charlie Fisher, the running backs coach at Vanderbilt, served as a graduate assistant coach at Ole Miss in 1983 and 1984 under former Rebel Head Coach Billy Brewer. The 1983 Ole Miss squad appeared in the Independence Bowl.

Ole Miss recruiting coordinator and secondary coach Mike MacIntyre is well known to Coach Johnson and many Commodore fans. He played two years at Vanderbilt (1984-1985) for his father, former Commodore Head Coach George MacIntyre, who worked as the defensive coordinator at Ole Miss for seven years before accepting the Vanderbilt head job.

Earlier in his coaching career, George MacIntyre was the defensive back coach at Clemson, mentoring none other than Bobby Johnson with the Tigers.

PETTIT, HATCHER OUT FOR YEAR

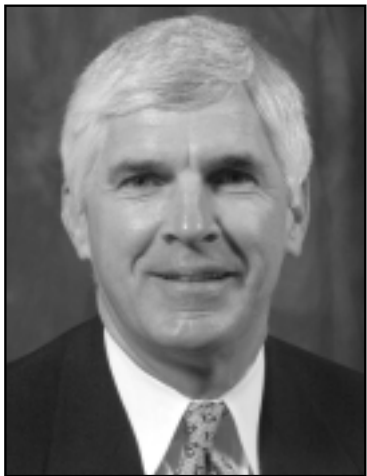

COMMODORE PLAYER POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

The Vanderbilt Player Locker Room is closed to media representatives this year, a change of policy from recent years. Upon request, the Media Relations Staff will provide players needed for post-game interviews in the media room after Coach Johnson concludes his remarks.

During Commodore home games at Vanderbilt Stadium, the visiting coach's press conference will be held at the stadium, taking place in the interview room located off the south endzone field tunnel.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS (DURING WEEK OF PRACTICE)

Media wishing to interview players during the week should contact the Media Relations Office in advance. In general, practice interviews will take place from 2:45 to 2:45 p.m. on Tuesdays through Thursdays. The first 30 minutes of practice is open to media photographers and videographers. The coaching staff may close practice without notice. Out of town media can arrange phone interviews through the Vanderbilt Media Relations Office. For such requests, please allow 24-hour notice, if possible.

CREDENTIAL REQUESTS FOR VANDERBILT HOME GAMES

To request season or single-game credentials, please fax your request on company letterhead to Football SID Larry Leathers or Assistant Football SID Andre Foushee.

When time allows, credentials will be mailed. However, they can also be picked up in advance at the Vanderbilt Media Relations Office, located on the second floor of McGugin Center (across from stadium) or at Media Will Call on game day located at Gate 2 (near intersection of Jess Neely Drive and Natchez Trace Drive). Media Will Call is staffed two hours before each home game.

PRESS BOX ACCESS AT VANDERBILT HOME GAMES

Media must wear their press or photo credentials to gain access to the stadium press box, which is located on the third level. Seating arrangements are posted in various press box locations.

Field access is restricted to working photojournalists from kickoff until five minutes remaining in the game. To gain field access, photojournalists must pick up an arm band at Media Will Call at Gate 2 (near intersection of Jess Neely Drive and Natchez Trace Drive) before the game.

NOTE REGARDING MEDIA PARKING AT VANDERBILT HOME GAMES

A limited number of parking passes are available for media use. All media representatives with a season parking permit will use the 25th Avenue Parking Garage, located one block south of the stadium across from the Hawkins Baseball Field (*for easy access to the parking garage, take Blakemore Avenue to 25th Avenue*). All media representatives receiving single-game credentials will receive a parking pass which allows access to Lot 3, located across Natchez Trace from the football practice field (*for easy access to Lot 3, take Blakemore Avenue to Natchez Trace or Vanderbilt Place*).

Note On Parking: *Depending on your arrival time, certain roads around Vanderbilt Stadium will be closed, including Jess Neely Drive and a section of Natchez Trace between the stadium and West End Avenue. To prevent delays, please use Blakemore Avenue to access both the 25th Avenue Parking Garage and Lot 3.*
