VANDERBILT-UConn RIVALRY

This is the first football meeting between Vanderbilt and the University of Connecticut.

This is the third time in less than a year that teams representing the universities have met. Last November, Vanderbilt's men's and women's basketball faced outstanding UConn teams. The Commodore women fell in the NIT Finals to the eventual national champion Huskies on Nov. 18. The next day, the Vanderbilt men lost by 12 in Storrs, UConn's hometown.

The Vanderbilt men's basketball team is scheduled to host UConn on campus Dec. 1 in one of team's most anticipated early-season meetings.

The women's basketball programs at both universities - two of the most respected in America - have split four meetings.

Vanderbilt did win the only baseball game played between the schools, 8-2, in 2000.

HOMECOMING AT VANDERBILT

The first-ever football game between Vanderbilt and UConn serves as homecoming for the Commodores. UConn is just Vanderbilt's fourth non-Southeastern Conference homecoming foe (The Citadel in 1998, Rutgers in 1987 and Memphis State in 1983) in the last 20 years. Game Notes

VANDERBILT VS. EASTERN SCHOOLS

The UConn football team will become a full-fledged member of the Big East Conference in 2005.

Vanderbilt is 10-16 all-time versus current Big East members. The last game against a Big East foe came in 1991 (37-10 opening-season loss at Syracuse).

Vanderbilt is 1-0-1 vs. teams from Connecticut. The Commodores have played the Yale Bulldogs twice - winning 35-0 in 1948 and tying 0-0 at New Haven in 1910.

The Commodores are 1-3-1 all-time against teams located in New England (1-0-1 vs. Yale, 0-1 vs Harvard and 0-2 vs. Boston College).

JOHNSON HAS FACED UCONN

Coach Johnson has faced the Huskies once previously - as an assistant head coach and defensive coordinator at Furman in 1991. Johnson's Paladins prevailed 35-24 over UConn in Storrs.

VANDERBILT AD TURNER SERVED IN SAME CAPACITY AT UCONN

Vanderbilt Director of Athletics Todd Turner also worked in the same capacity at Connecticut.

From 1987-1990, Turner directed the UConn athletic department. He is remembered for supervising the construction of Gampel Pavilion. The facility has served as an imposing on-campus gymnasium for Huskie athletic teams.

VANDERBILT COACH WAS AN ASSISTANT AT CONNECTICUT

Vanderbilt wide receivers coach J.D. Hall joined the Commodore staff after serving on Coach Randy Edsall's Huskie staff. Hall, a graduate of Bethune-Cookman College in Florida, also worked with wide receivers during his stint at Connecticut.

COMMODORE RESERVE PUNTER HAS CONNECTICUT TIES

Matt Weiss, a sophomore walk-on punter, hails from Cheshire, Conn., and has close ties to Tim Lassen, a Huskie redshirt freshman tight end.

Lassen and Weiss are childhood friends from Cheshire. Occasionally, Weiss even worked on the Lassen's former dairy farm.

Their friendship grew closer during Weiss' senior year of high school. Lassen lived with the Weiss family for much of the year as he concluded his prep career at Cheshire High School. Weiss attended the nearby Hopkins School.

COMMODORE TEAM SUPERLATIVES ENTERING CONNECTICUT GAME

★ Vanderbilt rushed for 234 yards against the vaunted Georgia defense, averaging 5.3 yards per carry.

Vanderbilt's rushing total is the most allowed by Georgia this season.

The Commodores are 24th in the NCAA with a 203.3-yard rushing average.

★ After committing 14 penalties in a 21-20 loss to Middle Tennessee on Oct. 12, the Commodores were flagged for just two five-yard infractions against Georgia.

It was the second time this season that Vanderbilt has committed just two penalties in a SEC game.

The Commodores once again lead the SEC in fewest penalty yards (364).

★ Due to injuries and inexperience, 38 different position players have started for the Commodores. The starters include 12 seniors, five juniors, nine sophomores, eight redshirt freshmen and four true freshmen.

Twelve Commodores - center Jamie Byrum, DT Aaron Carter, DT Matt Clay, WR M.J. Garrett, OT Justin Geisinger, FS Justin Giboney, MLB Hunter Hillenmeyer, CB Rushen Jones, DE Chuck Losey, OG Jim May, SS Jonathan Shaub and WR Dan Stricker - have started every game this season.

STRICKER CONTINUES UP SEC, VANDERBILT RECEIVING MARKS

Senior WR **Dan Stricker** moved up two all-time SEC charts with his sparkling performance against Georgia Saturday.

Stricker, a native of Cincinnati, Ohio, had a season-high five catches for 109 yards against Georgia, including a 50-yarder that led to Vanderbilt's first TD.

Stricker moved to seventh all-time among

SEC receivers with 2,662 yards. He passed former Florida Gator Carlos Alvarez and Eric Martin of LSU on the list. Stricker needs 47 yards receiving to surpass former LSU great Wendell Davis for sixth all-time, and 340 yards to become the SEC's all-time leader. Former LSU All-American Josh Reed set the SEC mark last year with 3,001 yards. Former Vanderbilt receiver Boo Mitchell (1985-88) is second on the list with 2,964 yards.

Stricker is expected to challenge the SEC mark of 208 career receptions by former Kentucky WR Craig Yeast. Stricker must average nine receptions during the Commodores' final five games to reach the record.

He faces close competition from a receiver Vanderbilt faced last Saturday. Georgia WR Terrence Edwards currently has 180 catches for 2,613 career yards.

TOP INDIVIDUAL SUPERLATIVES

FOLLOWING GEORGIA GAME

★ Freshman TB **Kwane Doster** continues to impress with his elusive running style. Doster, a resident of Tampa, Fla., rushed for 118 yards on 15 carries (7.8-yard average) against the Bulldog defense that is one of the SEC's best against the run. He also produced the longest rush of his brief career - 31 yards - and a nine-yard TD carry in the game.

Doster's performance was the finest against Georgia this season, surpassing the 101-yard effort by South Carolina QB Corey Jenkins earlier in the season.

The effort was a career high for Doster. His previous high, 101 yards against Ole Miss, also came in a road game before a regional television audience.

Doster enters the Connecticut game eighth in the SEC with 473 yards rushing. He is currently sixth all-time among Vanderbilt freshmen running backs, just 172 yards shy of the school record (644 yards by Carl Woods in 1983).

Doster also remains second in the SEC with 1,076 all-purpose yards. His all-purpose average of 153.4 yards is second to Domanick Davis of LSU.

★ Three Commodores, including true freshman linebacker **Herdley Harrison**, made their first collegiate starts against Georgia.

Harrison, a native of Marietta, Ga., started at outside linebacker in place of Eric Byrum, who sat out to rest a leg injury. He made five solo tackles, including a 3-yard loss, in his starting debut.

Also starting for the first time were sophomore DE **Robert Dinwiddie** and redshirt freshman WR **Keith Williams**.

Game Notes

★ MLB **Hunter Hillenmeyer** posted his seventh consecutive double-digit tackle total against Georgia, and is expected to retain the SEC lead in both solo tackles and total stops. Hillenmeyer ranks among the nation's best in both categories.

★ QB **Jay Cutler** amassed 221 yards in total offense in his return to the starting lineup, and had the Commodores in scoring position in three of its first four drives.

Cutler was particularly effective running the option, gaining 63 yards on 13 carries.

★ **Greg Johnson**, Vanderbilt's sensational punter/kicker from Lilburn, Ga., had both good and bad experiences in his second trip to the Peach State this year.

Johnson averaged 39.8 yards on five punts and had one punt blocked by Georgia standout DL David Pollack, but converted on a career-long 46-yard field goal to close the first half. It was the Commodores' longest field goal since John Markham made a 47-yard attempt against Florida on Nov. 4, 2000.

Johnson has made all 18 of his extra point attempts and is tied for third in the SEC with

a 70% success rate on field goals. His average of 5.9 points per game is fifth best among SEC kickers.

★ Starting free safety **Justin Giboney** had 13 tackles, just three shy of his career high. He is second on the team with 73 total tackles, a season high for the senior.

★ Two Vanderbilt defenders, redshirt freshman SS **Ronnie Swoopes Jr.**, and freshman DE **Antoine Morgan**, saw their first collegiate action.

Swoopes saw action on kickoff coverage squads, playing in front of a hometown crowd and a younger brother, Randall, who dressed on the Georgia sideline. His brother is a highly touted freshman lineman. Swoopes' father was an All-SEC defensive lineman for the Bulldogs in the mid-1970s.

Morgan, from Bennettsville, S.C., was pressed into duty when freshman DE Chris Booker suffered a season-ending knee injury against Middle Tennessee. His lone tackle resulted in a four-yard quarterback sack.

★ Senior CB and co-captain **Rushen Jones** contributed 10 total tackles - a career high - against the Bulldogs. A three-year starter

and preseason All-SEC pick, Jones has 43 total tackles on the season, just one below his previous high for a single season.

BUS CARRYING VU COACHES, PLAYERS INVOLVED IN WRECK TRAVELLING TO GEORGIA GAME

Defensive coaches and players escaped serious injury when the charter bus they were passengers in was hit by a tractor-trailer truck last Saturday morning as the Commodores were travelling to Athens under state police escort.

Though medical personnel travelling with the team treated several players and coaches immediately following the accident, no player or coach was held out of the game.

The charter bus was the third of a five-vehicle caravan travelling south on GA 129/11 at 8:40 a.m., CST, when it was hit by a tractor-trailer that apparently swerved to avoid another vehicle. Passengers in the front rows - primarily assistant defensive coaches - were sprayed with scattered glass from the wreckage. The tractor-trailer was a total loss.

The bus contained 25 members of the Vanderbilt team, including coaches, defensive linemen, linebackers and support personnel. The passengers were transferred to the team's four other buses for the 25-mile journey to Sanford Stadium.

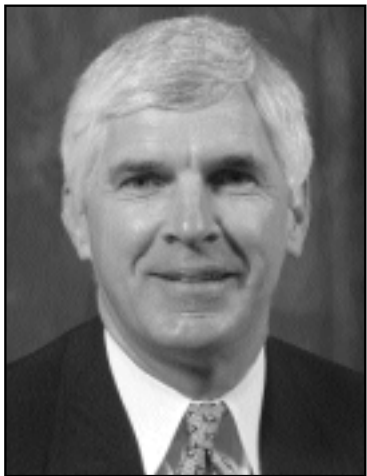
