DOSTER'S HUGE PERFORMANCE:

344 ALL-PURPOSE YARDS

ESTABLISHES VANDERBILT RECORDS

True freshman **tailback Kwane Doster** compiled one of the finest games in Vanderbilt history during the Commodores' narrow 45-38 loss at Ole Miss.

The Tampa, Florida native accounted for 344 yards of total offense - 243 yards as a kickoff returner and 101 yards as a tailback.

Doster's 243 return yards is the highest single-game total in the SEC this season and propelled him to the top of the league's all-purpose performers - and ninth nationally - with 684 total yards (225 yards rushing, three yards receiving and 456 yards on kickoff returns). It also smashed the team's single-game record set in 1969 by Doug Mathews (168 yards on 10 returns). His 95-yard kickoff return in the fourth quarter tied for the fifth-longest in team history and ignited the VU comeback.

Doster also established personal highs in

rushing yards (101), rushing attempts (15) and longest carry (25 yards). He also scored his first collegiate TD on a 24-yard run.

Doster's 344 all-purpose yards is believed to be the most productive game ever by a Commodore, surpassing the 321-yard rushing performance by Frank Mordica against Air Force in 1978.

VANDERBILT COACH JOHNSON NATIVE OF SOUTH CAROLINA

Commodore Head Coach Bobby Johnson knows plenty about the University of South Carolina.

He is a native of Columbia - home of the Gamecocks, and was a three-sport prep star in the city at Eau Claire HS. He played collegiately at Clemson, then served 26 years on football staffs at two universities in the state - 24 with Furman and two at Clemson.

Johnson has faced the Gamecocks on six occasions, though never as a head coach. During Johnson's playing career at Clemson,

the Tigers were 2-1 vs. USC. As a coach - both at Furman and Clemson - Johnson also is 2-1. The last time Johnson faced the Gamecocks, he was the Clemson defensive coordinator during a 16-13 Tiger win in 1993. He accepted the Furman head coaching position later that year.

VANDERBILT TEAM SUPERLATIVES

★ The Commodores have shown vast improvement on all phases of the game since opening the season with a 45-3 loss at Georgia Tech.

In the three games since the opener, the Commodores are averaging 31 points per game and 437 yards in total offense, 212 yards more than the team gained at GT. The unit has averaged 254.7 yards rushing after getting 109 against in the opener, and 191.3 yards passing after garnering 116 passing yards vs. Tech. The Commodores' two-back set has averaged an impressive 6.8 yards per play since averaging 3.8 yards in Atlanta. The Commodores have also controlled time of possession in the last three games (33:04-26:56).

Defensively, the Commodores have allowed 31.3 points in the games since GT scored 45 points, and have limited opponents to 143.7 yards rushing (Tech gained 279 yards on the ground). The defense has given up more passing yardage (264.3 yards) in the last three games than Tech achieved (182 yards).

Turnovers remains an area of concern for the coaching staff. Vanderbilt has committed nine turnovers since the opener, while forcing just four fumbles. Seven turnovers against Auburn and Ole Miss have resulted in 31 points by SEC opponents.

★ The balanced Vanderbilt offense posted one of its finest efforts against an SEC foe during the Ole Miss encounter. The unit had 464 yards of total offense (257 yards rushing and 207 yards). Aside from an 542-yard outburst vs. Kentucky last year, it was the Commodores biggest production against an SEC opponent since Oct. 15, 1994 when the team compiled 480 yards in a 43-30 road win at Georgia.

The team's 257 rushing yards also is the most against an SEC foe since the 1994 Georgia contest, a game which also featured a pair of VU running backs (Jermaine Johnson and Ronnie Gordon) surpassing 100 yards as Norval McKenzie (101) and Kwane Doster (101) achieved against Ole Miss.

★ The 38-point total against Ole Miss is the most scored by the Commodores since a 42-38 win over Duke (10/27/01). It was the most points scored against an SEC opponent since the 43-30 win over

THE LAST VU-SOUTH CAROLINA MEETING:

VANDERBILT 14, SOUTH CAROLINA 46

OCT. 20, 2001, WILLIAMS-BRICE STADIUM

COLUMBIA, S.C. - Moments into the second half, hopes for victory in the first road game of the 2001 season looked excellent after tight end Tom Simone scored on a 19-yard reception from quarterback Greg Zolman, pulling the Commodores within five at 19-14.

Vanderbilt would get no closer as South Carolina used a punishing ground attack and Commodore mistakes to score 27 unanswered points enroute to a 46-14 homecoming victory at Williams-Brice Stadium.

The game was Vanderbilt's first road contest of the year, due to the postponement of a home game against Ole Miss originally scheduled in mid-September. The scheduling quark resulted in the Commodores' latest road opener in 76 years.

In the game, the Commodores suffered a key injury, losing fifth-year senior offensive guard Duncan Cave to a broken ankle. Inside linebacker Antuan Bradford achieved one of his finest games for the Commodores with a career-high 16 tackles.

★ Vanderbilt's three-TD rally in the fourth quarter at Ole Miss was the first time in 11 years that the Commodores scored 21 points against an SEC opponent in the final stanza (59-28 loss at Alabama, Sept. 29, 1990).

★ Vanderbilt committed just two penalties (for 20 yards) against the Rebels. The last time Vanderbilt was flagged just twice came in a 40-16 win over TCU on Sept. 18, 1997.

INDIVIDUAL SUPERLATIVES FROM VANDERBILT-OLE MISS GAME

★ The maturity of redshirt freshman **QB Jay Cutler** continues to show, as the signal caller directed arguably his finest game in a Commodore uniform at Ole Miss. Cutler completed 11 of 21 passes for 207 yards and no interceptions. He also threw TD passes of 49 yards to Garrett and seven yards to Stricker. Cutler was under constant pressure and was sacked three times. Cutler's lone turnover came on the Commodores' final offensive play when he fumbled after being blindsided by a Rebel defender.

Cutler also effectively ran the option, gaining 34-net yards on a team-high 19 carries. His rushing attempts included a one-yard TD carry.

★ Senior **WR M.J. Garrett** had his finest game in more than a year, catching four passes for 128 yards. The effort included a 49-yard TD reception from Cutler.

Garrett entered the game with just two catches for nine yards through three games. He was held without a catch in the two previous games.

★ **Sophomore TB Norval McKenzie** also accomplished a career high for rushing yards, joining Doster with 101 yards on just nine carries.

Through four games, McKenzie leads Commodore rushers with 256 yards on 30 attempts, averaging an impressive 8.5 yards per carry.

★ Junior **SS Jonathan Shaub** set a career high with 13 tackles, including seven solo stops, against the Rebels. His previous single-game high was eight tackles earlier this season against Auburn.

★ Freshman **Greg Johnson** continues to impress with his overall kicking performance. Johnson averaged 47.7 yards on three punts against Ole Miss, raising his season average to 44.2 on 15 efforts. He ranks seventh among SEC. He also made a short 20-yard field goal - his fourth of the season - versus Ole Miss, and watched as a 47-yard effort was unsuccessful after hitting high on the goalpost upright.

Johnson also provided Vanderbilt with excellent field position, booting four of seven kickoffs for touchbacks.

★ Redshirt freshman **CB Dominique Morris** broke up three passes, a career high and team high on the season. Two other defenders, **OLB Eric Byrum** and **DE Jovan Haye**, set single-game highs in tackles with six and four, respectively.

★ Two true freshmen for the Commodores - **DE**

Chris Booker and OG Mac Pyle - earned their first career starts against Ole Miss. Booker, a native of Brandon, Miss., contributed a big play in Vanderbilt's rally, knocking down an Eli Manning third-down pass attempt.

Eight freshmen- **Booker, Pyle, Doster, Johnson, PR/WR Grant Brigham, SS Andrew Pace, OLB Herdley Harrison and DB Kelechi Ohanaja** - played crucial roles against Ole Miss.

STRICKER CONTINUES UP SEC, VANDERBILT RECEIVING MARKS

Senior WR **Dan Stricker** moved into the Top 20 among Southeastern Conference receivers in career catches with his performance against Ole Miss.

Strickers' three receptions against the Rebels - good for 29 yards and a TD - rises his Commodore career total to 151 catches, good for 19th all-time among SEC receivers. He passed Karsten Bailey, Auburn and South Carolina Jermale Kelly (each with 150) during the Ole Miss game. Stricker needs 17 catches to move into the SEC's all-time Top 10 in the category.

Stricker enters the South Carolina game 31 yards shy of surpassing former Auburn great Terry Beasley into ninth place in career yards among SEC receivers. caught three passes for 33 yards in the first half against Auburn, but went without a reception in the second half.

Stricker's seven-yard catch off a fade route in the fourth quarter was his 18th career TD reception, equalling Allama Matthews (1981-82) for second among Vanderbilt receivers. The school record for career touchdown catches - 20 TDs - is held by Chuck Scott (1981-84).

THREE COMMODORES HAIL FROM SOUTH CAROLINA

Three Commodores, including starting guard Jim May, hail from South Carolina.

May, a graduate of ParkviewHS near Atlanta, was a huge Gamecock fan while being raised in Columbia. His father, Dr. John May, is a long-time business professor at the university.

Two Commodore freshmen - **QB Steven Bright** of Greer and **DE Antoine Morgan** of Bennettsville - also are residents of the state. Bright's older brother, Tim, is a South Carolina student and member of the Gamecock baseball squad. Morgan helped powerful Marlboro County HS to 4A state championships in football and basketball. Neither Bright or Morgan have played this season.

COMMODORE OFF. GUARD JIM MAY ALSO FAMILIAR WITH USC

A three-year starter on the Commodore offensive line - senior guard Jim May - also has close ties to the Gamecocks. He is another Columbia native whose father is a long-time business professor and former vice chancellor at USC.

NUMEROUS VANDERBILT COACHES HAVE TIES TO PALMETTO STATE

Six first-year members of the Vanderbilt coaching staff, including Head Coach Johnson, have close ties to the Palmetto state.

Three coaches are natives of the state, including Johnson (Columbia), Offensive Coordinator Ted Cain (Aiken) and Assistant Head Coach/Offensive Line Coach Robbie Caldwell (Pageland). Johnson, Cain, Caldwell and four others - Defensive Coordinator Bruce Fowler, Quarterback Coach Jimmy Kiser, Director of Strength & Conditioning John Sisk and assistant strength coach John Moore - have coached in SC at Furman.

PETTIT, HATCHER OUT FOR YEAR

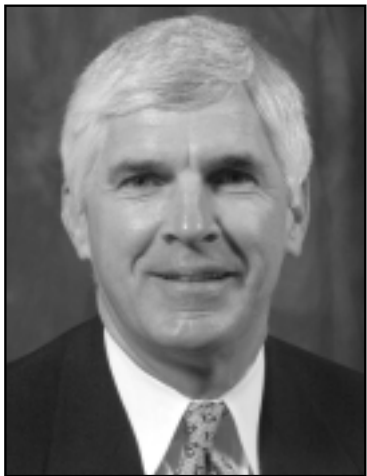

Media wishing to interview players during the week should contact the Media Relations Office in advance. In general, practice interviews will take place from 2:45 to 2:45 p.m. on Tuesdays through Thursdays. The first 30 minutes of practice is open to media photographers and videographers. The coaching staff may close practice without notice. Out of town media can arrange phone interviews through the Vanderbilt Media Relations Office. For such requests, please allow 24-hour notice, if possible.

CREDENTIAL REQUESTS FOR VANDERBILT HOME GAMES

To request season or single-game credentials, please fax your request on company letterhead to Football SID Larry Leathers or Assistant Football SID Andre Foushee.

When time allows, credentials will be mailed. However, they can also be picked up in advance at the Vanderbilt Media Relations Office, located on the second floor of McGugin Center (across from stadium) or at Media Will Call on game day located at Gate 2 (near intersection of Jess Neely Drive and Natchez Trace Drive). Media Will Call is staffed two hours before each home game.

PRESS BOX ACCESS AT VANDERBILT HOME GAMES

Media must wear their press or photo credentials to gain access to the stadium press box, which is located on the third level. Seating arrangements are posted in various press box locations.

Field access is restricted to working photojournalists from kickoff until five minutes remaining in the game. To gain field access, photojournalists must pick up an arm band at Media Will Call at Gate 2 (near intersection of Jess Neely Drive and Natchez Trace Drive) before the game.

NOTE REGARDING MEDIA PARKING AT VANDERBILT HOME GAMES

A limited number of parking passes are available for media use. All media representatives with a season parking permit will use the 25th Avenue Parking Garage, located one block south of the stadium across from the Hawkins Baseball Field (*for easy access to the parking garage, take Blakemore Avenue to 25th Avenue*). All media representatives receiving single-game credentials will receive a parking pass which allows access to Lot 3, located across Natchez Trace from the football practice field (*for easy access to Lot 3, take Blakemore Avenue to Natchez Trace or Vanderbilt Place*).

Note On Parking: Depending on your arrival time, certain roads around Vanderbilt Stadium will be closed, including Jess Neely Drive and a section of Natchez Trace between the stadium and West End Avenue. To prevent delays, please use Blakemore Avenue to access both the 25th Avenue Parking Garage and Lot 3.
