VANDERBILT-TENNESSEE SERIES

The Commodores have played Tennessee more than any other university. It is the fourth most frequently played rivalry in SEC history, trailing only Auburn-Georgia, Ole Miss-Miss. State and Kentucky-Tennessee.

The overall series record is in dispute: Vanderbilt recognizes a 1918 win over the Volunteers. The schools played twice in 1892, the first year the teams met. Vanderbilt won just two of the first 24 games played in the series. Since 1966, Tennessee has won 32 of 35 games. Four of the last seven meetings have been decided by seven points or less. The teams played a thriller in their only previous meeting at the Nashville Coliseum, with Tennessee holding off a late Commodore rally to win 28-26 in 2000.

STRICKER WITHIN REACH OF SEC ALL-TIME YARDAGE MARK

Dan Stricker enters the last game of his Commodore career needing 134 receiving yards to become the SEC's all-time leader in career receiving yards.

Game Notes

Stricker enters the UT game off one of his best performances this season - six catches for 96 yards and one TD.

Stricker took sole possession of the VU team record with 21 career TD catches against Kentucky. The record came on a 19-yard reception just before half-time that ignited a Commodore rally. Stricker, who has a catch in 33 consecutive games, also moved up in the SEC's all-time list for catches and receptions with the Kentucky performance. He is now sixth on the all-time yardage list (and just 32 yards from jumping into third place) and ninth on the all-time receptions list (180).

Stricker needs 97 yards to break the team record of 2,964 yards set by Boo Mitchell (1985-88).

Stricker will need his best performance of the season to eclipse Josh Reed's SEC career receiving record. This year, Stricker has surpassed 100 yards just twice, with a season-high of 132 yards versus Furman.

DOSTER ADDS CUSHION TO RUSHING RECORD

Tailback **Kwane Doster** added to his Vanderbilt record for freshmen rushers with 111 yards against Kentucky. It was Doster's fourth 100-yard game this season, matching Rodney Williams' 1998 total as the most ever by a Commodore freshman. It was Doster's third 100-yard performance against an SEC opponent.

Doster's 39-yard scamper in the third quarter also was a career best.

Doster's 798 yards is the eighth finest single-season rushing total by a Commodore back. He would jump into the top five with 80 rushing yards against Tennessee.

In seven SEC games, Doster has averaged 86 yards on the ground. He is currently the NCAA's eighth leading freshman rusher.

Doster started the season as the Commodores' third tailback, and earned substantial playing time after leg injuries to junior Ronald Hatcher and sophomore Norval McKenzie. He has started just five games.

CUTLER APPROACHING VU FRESHMAN PASSING MARKS

Quarterback **Jay Cutler** needs 49 passing yards to add to the growing list of freshman passing records he holds at Vanderbilt.

Cutler threw TD passes at Kentucky to TE Tom Simone and WR Dan Stricker, giving him 10 on the season, the most ever by a Vanderbilt freshman QB. It was his fourth game with two TD passes.

THE LAST VU-TENNESSEE MEETING VANDERBILT 0, TENNESSEE 38

Nov. 24, 2001, NEYLAND STADIUM, KNOXVILLE

Knoxville, Tenn. - The Volunteers displayed an explosive offense and stingy defense against the Commodores, enough to shut down Vanderbilt 38-0 in Knoxville. Tennessee gained a three-touchdown margin midway through the second quarter. The Commodore offense seldom threatened as Zolman was limited to 17 completions in 26 attempts for 144 yards. He was sacked five times and constantly hurried by the Volunteer defense. Vanderbilt played with injured offensive line starters Duncan Cave and Justin Geisinger. Running back Rodney Williams gained 72 yards on 21 carries. Dan Stricker caught six passes for 41 yards. Webb averaged 45.7 yards on six punts. Cornerback Aaron McWhorter and defensive end Chuck Losey had fumble recoveries for the Commodores.

2002 - A SEASON OF COMMODORE CLOSE CALLS

Despite a 2-9 record, Vanderbilt has had its share of opportunities to win close games. On six occasions, against Ole Miss, USC, MTSU, UConn, Florida and Kentucky, the Commodores had possession late in the fourth quarter with a chance to tie or take the lead with a touch-down. The Commodores have taken advantage only once - against Connecticut.

ninth of the season. It establishes another Vanderbilt freshman record and is tops among SEC quarterbacks this year.

Cutler enters the finale within reach of at least two more freshman passing records set by John Gromos in 1985 - passing yards and attempts (224).

The All-SEC freshman candidate will need his finest game to top Gromos' record of 124 completions. He has posted a single-game high of 11 completions in five different games. He needs 23 completions to top Gromos' 1985 total.

The native of Santa Claus, Ind. is the Commodores' second leading rusher with 390 yards (on 121 attempts).

JOHNSON THIRD IN SEC AMONG TALENTED PUNTERS

Greg Johnson continues to make his case for Freshman All-American consideration as a punting/kicking specialist.

Johnson, a freshman from Lilburn, Ga., averaged 40.1 yards on nine punts against Kentucky in cold, damp conditions. One of his efforts, from the back of the end zone, travelled 62 yards.

Johnson leads all freshmen punters in the NCAA with a 43.3-yard average. He has been remarkably consistent, sending at least one

effort more than 50 yards in 10 of the Commodores' 11 games.

Johnson is third in the SEC (and ninth in the NCAA). He trails Glenn Pakulak of Kentucky and Damon Duval of Auburn in the conference.

Johnson's average stacks up favorably when compared to outstanding seasons by previous Commodore punters, including former All-Americans Ricky Anderson, Bill Marinangel and Jim Arnold.

★★ The Commodores continue to be the least penalized team in the SEC, averaging just 47.6 yards of penalties per game.

★★ Vanderbilt leads the SEC in its ability to convert on red-zone possessions. The Commodores lead the conference with a 87.1% success rate, converting on 27 of 31 possessions inside the opponent's 20-yard line (21 TDs, six FGs).

★★ Vanderbilt has suffered from a poor turnover margin. The Commodores are lost 23 turnovers while forcing just 11. The -12 turnover margin is tied for worst in the conference with Mississippi State.

★★ Vanderbilt needs to get more production in the first quarter. With one game remaining, the Commodores are scoring just 3.1 first-quarter points. The Commodores have led just once - vs. Furman - after one quarter this season.

★★ For the second straight game, the Commodore secondary performed admirably against a solid SEC quarterback. After limiting Florida's Rex Grossman two weeks ago, Vanderbilt held Jared Lorenzen to one of his worst career outings - 128 yards and no TD passes.

The secondary held Florida and Kentucky without a TD pass. Last year, the two teams combined for a dozen TD passes.

★★ Safety **Jonathan Shaub** assisted with a pair of freshmen linebackers for two interceptions against Kentucky.

Shaub intercepted a Lorenzen pass in the second quarter after it was tipped by LB **Moses Osemwegie**. Then, late in the fourth quarter, Shaub gave the Vanderbilt offense a chance to drive for the tying TD when he deflected a Lorenzen pass that LB **Herdley Harrison** intercepted.

It was Harrison's first career interception and Shaub's team-leading third pick.

★★ Senior TE **Tom Simone** had just one catch against Kentucky, but it was a career-long 38-yarder that gave Vanderbilt its first points of the game.

★★ For the first time this season, senior MLB **Hunter Hillenmeyer** did not reach double digits in total tackles. He was credited with five primary and nine total stops against Kentucky.

Hillenmeyer did move into seventh place all-time on the team's single-season solo

tackle list. He has 100 on the season and appears within reach of fifth place (Andre Coleman's total of 108 in 1980).

★★ Senior LG **Jim May** made his 40th consecutive start - a team high - against Kentucky. Two senior captains, center **Jamie Byrum** and **Stricker** - have started 33 consecutive starts.

Among upperclassmen, only four seniors - **Hillenmeyer**, safety **Mike Martin**, **May** and **Simone** - and junior DE **Libnir Telusca** have played in every game of their Vanderbilt careers.

★★ How young are the Commodores? At least nine first-year players - **Greg Johnson**, **Cutler**, **Doster**, FB **Matthew Tant**, RG **Mac Pyle**, DE **Jovan Haye**, **Osemwegie**, **Harrison** and CB **Dominique Morris** - could garner consideration for the All-SEC Freshmen honors.

Several other freshmen, including CB **Cheron Thompson**, safety **Andrew Pace**, LB **Marty Morgan**, DE **Chris Booker**, WR **Grant Brigham**, DT **Ralph McKenzie** and WR **Erik Davis**, have earned substantial minutes.

Nine redshirt freshmen or true freshmen started for the Commodores against Kentucky: **Cutler**, **Tant**, **Doster**, **Pyle**, **Haye**, **McKenzie**, **Harrison**, **Morgan** and **Greg Johnson**.

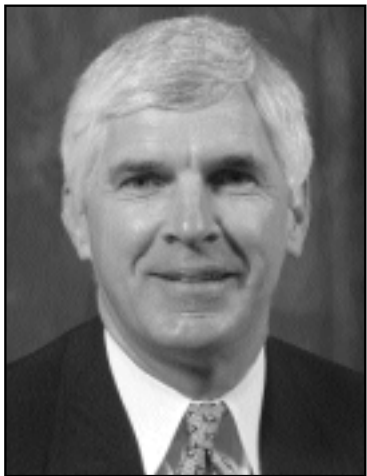
★★ CB **Rushen Jones** continues his impressive play during the second half of the season. He limited Kentucky's top receiver, Derek Abney, to 31 receiving yards Saturday.

This season, Jones has career highs of 66 total tackles and 10 defended passes.
