#### COMMODORES IN HOME OPENERS

Vanderbilt is 81-25-4 in home openers. In the last 10 home openers, they are 4-6. The Commodores have also lost their last four openers at Vanderbilt Stadium. VU's last win in a home opener was 29-12 over North Texas in 1997. Furman is VU's third I-AA opponent in the last 10 years (the squad beat The Citadel 58-0 in 1999 and Richmond 28-22 last year.

### JOHNSON FACES FORMER SQUAD IN VANDERBILT STADIUM OPENER

Vanderbilt Head Coach Bobby Johnson faces his former players and coaching associates Saturday when the Commodores host Furman University.

Johnson served as head coach of the Paladins for eight years, achieving an impressive 60-36 overall record before accepting the Vanderbilt position. Johnson's 2001 Furman squad finished 12-3 and advanced to the I-AA national championship game. Johnson's 60 wins at Furman is tied for fourth all-time among Paladin head coaches.

Johnson spent 23 of the last 25 years in different coaching positions at Furman. He left twice for one-year positions at his alma mater, Clemson (1980 & 1993).

Bobby Lamb, Furman's first-year head coach, served as passing game coordinator under Johnson.

# Game Notes

## VU NEWCOMERS PLENTIFUL IN GEORGIA TECH MEETING

Of Vanderbilt's 22 starters Saturday against Georgia Tech, only seven started the 2001 season finale against Ole Miss.

The Commodores' starting lineup Saturday included a true freshman (P/K **Greg Johnson**) and five redshirt freshmen (QB **Jay Cutler**, DE **Jovan Haye**, CB **Dominique Morris**, OLB **Moses Osemwegie** and FB **Matthew Tant**). Six sophomores (OLB **Eric Byrum**, DT **Aaron Carter**, DT **Matt Clay**, OT **Justin Geisinger**, OT/OG **Brian Kovolisky** and TB **Norval McKenzie**) also were in the starting units.

Twelve Commodores recorded their first collegiate starts against Georgia Tech, including **Cutler**, TE **Nick Getter**, **Tant**, **McKenzie**, **Haye**, **Clay**, **Carter**, **Osemwegie**, **Eric Byrum**, **Morris** and **Greg Johnson**.

Twenty-three Commodores appeared in their first collegiate game, including WR **Grant Brigham**, **Cutler**, CB **Cheron Thompson**, CB **Kelechi Ohanaja**, WR **Keith Williams**, **Tant**, **Osemwegie**, FS **Andrew Pace**, TB **Kwane Doster**, FB **Bara Cola**, OLB **Herdley Harrison**, holder **Howdy MacPherson**, DE **Chris Booker**, DT **Trey Holloway**, TE **Dustin Dunning**, **Haye**, DT **Ralph McKenzie**, **Johnson**, WR **Erik Davis**, DT **Ray Brown**, OT **Ryan King**, OT **Mac Pyle** and OG **Nigel Seaman**.

Ten true freshmen (**Greg Johnson**, **Brigham**, **Ohanaja**, **Pace**, **Doster**, **Harrison**, **Booker**, **Brown**, **Davis** and **Pyle**) saw action at Tech. By contrast, just four of 25 freshmen recruits played in 2001.

## Other Georgia Tech Notes

★ **Cutler** became the first redshirt freshman quarterback to ever start the season opener for Vanderbilt. He completed his first pass attempt, hitting TB **Norval McKenzie** for a first down.

★ The entire Vanderbilt offensive backfield - **Cutler**, **Tant** and **McKenzie** - started for the first time against GT.

The Commodores introduced a new backfield - QB **Benji Walker**, FB **Bara Cola** and TB **Ronald Hatcher** - to start the second quarter.

★ Senior safety **Justin Giboney** matched a career high with 16 total tackles against Tech.

★ **Cola**, a fifth-year senior, played in his first collegiate game, as did senior holder **Howdy MacPherson**.

★ In his first career start, OLB **Moses Osemwegie** achieved nine solo tackles.

★ Freshman **Kwane Doster** went 31 yards on his

first collegiate kickoff return midway through the second quarter, remaining in the second quarter.

★ Freshman **Grant Brigham** recorded his first collegiate reception on a 32-yard pass from Walker with 12:19 remaining in the fourth quarter.

★ Freshman punter **Greg Johnson** 42.5 yards on eight punts, and added a 37-yard field goal. He missed a 28-yarder in the third quarter.

## VANDERBILT, FURMAN STAFFS FAMILIAR WITH EACH OTHER

All but a handful of the two coaching staffs have worked together on previous staffs

Commodore Head Coach **Bobby Johnson** worked with eight members of the current Furman staff, including **Bobby Lamb**. Three key assistants - head coach/offensive line coach **Clay Hendrix**, offensive coordinator **Tim Sorrells** and defensive coordinator **Steve Wilson** - also worked under **Johnson**.

**Johnson** is one of four Commodore coaches, joining **Ted Cain**, **Robbie Caldwell** and **Bruce Fowler**, who previously served on the Furman sideline. **Johnson**, **Cain** and **Fowler** came to Vanderbilt from Furman.

Three others in the Vanderbilt football program - Director of Football Operations **Brian Reese**, Director of Speed, Strength & Conditioning **John Sisk** and strength assistant **John Moore** - served at Furman.

## FOUR VANDERBILT COACHES ARE FURMAN GRADUATES

Four Vanderbilt coaches - offensive coordinator **Ted Cain**, assistant head coach/offensive line coach **Robbie Caldwell**, defensive coordinator **Bruce Fowler** and quarterbacks coach **Jimmy Kiser** - played at Furman.

## SON OF VU COORDINATOR IS RESERVE FURMAN QUARTERBACK

VU coach **Cain**, will face his son on the opposing sideline. **Matt Cain** is a redshirt freshman quarterback prospect for the Paladins.

## NUMEROUS COMMODORE, PALADIN ROSTER CONNECTIONS

**Thomas** and **Cecile Brigham** of Birmingham, Ala., will have representation on both sidelines Saturday. **Grant Brigham** is a freshman receiver at Vanderbilt. His older brother, **Hindley Brigham**, is a junior who should start at tailback for Furman.

## STRICKER CONTINUES TO MOVE UP VANDERBILT, SEC MARKS

Despite a sub-par performance Saturday at Georgia Tech, WR **Dan Stricker** continued to move up the SEC's all-time list for receiving yards.

Stricker caught three passes for 23 yards against the Yellow Jackets, giving him 2,283 receiving yards, good for a tie for 16th all-time.

The effort pushed Stricker into second on the VU all-time list, just ahead of former WR **Martin Cox**.

The Cincinnati resident has 141 career receptions, fifth on the VU all-time list. He is just behind **Everett Crawford** (143) and **Chuck Scott** (145).

Commodore offensive guard **Jordan Pettit** is lost for the season following a severe leg injury Saturday at Georgia Tech.

Pettit, a junior from Olive Branch, Miss., underwent surgery Sunday morning at Vanderbilt University Medical Center to repair fractures of his right tibia and right fibula. Team orthopedic surgeon **Eric McCarty** and **Dr. Marcus Sciadini** of VUMC performed the operation. He is expected to remain in the hospital Monday.

Following the game, **Jordan** travelled back to Nashville with his father, **Jerry Pettit**, and **Dr. Kurt Spindler** of the Vanderbilt Sports Medicine Center staff.

Pettit, making his second start, was injured late in the first quarter.

## **COACH JOHNSON'S POSTGAME INTERVIEWS**

Media wishing to participate in postgame interviews should meet at the elevator with five minutes remaining in the game to be escorted to the south end zone area of the field.

Coach Johnson's post-game press conference will be held immediately after he addresses Commodore players after the game. The location is Room 153 in McGugin Center. *Please use the entrance marked "Sports Medicine" for access into McGugin Center, then enter the media room through first door on right.*

## **COMMODORE PLAYER POSTGAME INTERVIEWS**

The Vanderbilt Player Locker Room is closed to media representatives this year, a change of policy from recent years. Upon request, the Media Relations Staff will provide players needed for post-game interviews in the media room after Coach Johnson concludes his remarks.

During Commodore home games at Vanderbilt Stadium, the visiting coach's press conference will be held at the stadium, taking place in the interview room located off the south endzone field tunnel.

## **PLAYER INTERVIEWS (DURING WEEK OF PRACTICE)**

Media wishing to interview players during the week should contact the Media Relations Office in advance. In general, practice interviews will take place from 2:00 to 2:45 on Tuesdays through Thursdays. The first 30 minutes of practice is open to media photographers and videographers. The coaching staff may close practice without notice. Out of town media can arrange phone interviews through the Vanderbilt Media Relations Office. For such requests, please allow 24-hour notice, if possible.

## **CREDENTIAL REQUESTS FOR VANDERBILT HOME GAMES**

To request season or single-game credentials, please fax your request on company letterhead to Football SID Larry Leathers or Assistant Football SID Andre Foushee.

When time allows, credentials will be mailed. However, they can also be picked up in advance at the Vanderbilt Media Relations Office, located on the second floor of McGugin Center (across from stadium) or at Media Will Call on game day located at Gate 2 (near intersection of Jess Neely Drive and Natchez Trace Drive). Media Will Call is staffed two hours before each home game.

## **PRESS BOX ACCESS AT VANDERBILT HOME GAMES**

Media must wear their press or photo credentials to gain access to the stadium press box, which is located on the third level. Seating arrangements are posted in various press box locations.

Field access is restricted to working photojournalists from kickoff until five minutes remaining in the game. To gain field access, photojournalists must pick up an arm band at Media Will Call at Gate 2 (near intersection of Jess Neely Drive and Natchez Trace Drive) before the game.

## **NOTE REGARDING MEDIA PARKING AT VANDERBILT HOME GAMES**

A limited number of parking passes are available for media use. All media representatives with a season parking permit will use the 25th Avenue Parking Garage, located one block south of the stadium across from the Hawkins Baseball Field (*for easy access to the parking garage, take Blakemore Avenue to 25th Avenue*). All media representatives receiving single-game credentials will receive a parking pass which allows access to Lot 3, located across Natchez Trace from the football practice field (*for easy access to Lot 3, take Blakemore Avenue to Natchez Trace or Vanderbilt Place*).

***Note On Parking: Depending on your arrival time, certain roads around Vanderbilt Stadium will be closed, including Jess Neely Drive and a section of Natchez Trace between the stadium and West End Avenue. To prevent delays, please use Blakemore Avenue to access both the 25th Avenue Parking Garage and Lot 3.***
