MATCHUP FEATURES OPENER

FOR BOTH HEAD COACHES

Both head coaches - Bobby Johnson of Vanderbilt and Chan Gailey of Georgia Tech - will be directing their first games at their schools. In 2001, Johnson coached Furman to a national I-AA runnerup finish. Gailey directed the Miami Dolphins' offense last year. This is the first meeting between

Johnson and Gailey, a former collegiate head coach at Samford and Troy State.

BOBBY JOHNSON'S FORMER GAME EXPERIENCES VERSUS GA. TECH

Bobby Johnson has competed against GT eight times - as a Furman head coach and defensive assistant coach, Clemson defensive coordinator, and Clemson player. The combined record is 2-5-1.

INTERESTING SERIES TIDBITS

- ★ In 1894, Vanderbilt and Georgia Tech were among seven universities to form the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Association.
- ★ The first game played between the schools - a 20-10 win by Vanderbilt in Atlanta in 1892 - was just the second game ever played by Ga. Tech.
- ★ Between 1904 and 1919, the Commodore-Yellow Jacket series featured two of college football's most famous coaches - Vanderbilt's Dan McGugin and Ga. Tech's John Heisman. In 1904, each coach was a first-year coach at their respective schools. For the next 16 years, GT and Vanderbilt were Southern football's most prominent teams. McGugin was 3-2 in the series. Both Heisman and McGugin are members of the College Football Hall of Fame.
- ★ In 1932, the universities also became charter members - with 11 others - of the Southeastern Conference. Georgia Tech withdrew in 1964.
- ★ Vanderbilt has faced Ga. Tech 34 times. Excluding current SEC schools, the only teams Vanderbilt has faced more are Sewanee (52) and Tulane (48).
- ★ The three ties between Vanderbilt and Ga. Tech - 1927, 1936 & 1965 - were all played in Nashville.
- ★ The 83-0 loss (1917) suffered by Vanderbilt at the hands of a co-national champion Ga. Tech squad remains the worst defeat in VU history.

TOP VU, GA. TECH ASSISTANTS ON SAME STAFF LAST YEAR

A pair of key assistant coaches from both teams - VU Assistant Head Coach/Offensive Line Coach **Robbie Caldwell** and GT Defensive Coordinator **Jon Tenuta** - served together last year on the North Carolina Tar Heel coaching staff.

Caldwell, a Furman graduate and long-time NC State assistant, served as offensive line coach at UNC. Tenuta was UNC's defensive coordinator last year.

A Vanderbilt defensive assistant, secondary coach **Jamie Bryant**, served on Tenuta's UNC staff last year as a graduate assistant.

Tenuta also is a former Vanderbilt assistant, having served as a DB coach in 1984-85.

CHARLIE FISHER, GT DL COACH HAS WEST GEORGIA TIES

Charlie Fisher, the Commodores' running backs coach, and Jacket defensive line coach **Glenn Spencer** were head coaches at West Georgia College.

Fisher joined West Georgia in 1991 as offensive coordinator, one year after Spencer was hired as a defensive assistant. In 1993, Fisher was named head coach, guiding the team to a 36-17 record and two NCAA Division II appearances in five years.

When Fisher left to join the NC State staff, Spencer was named head coach, going 28-7 in three years.

VU COACHING STAFF HAS DEEP ACC CONNECTIONS

Though none of VU's 10 coaches have worked at GT, eight Vanderbilt coaches have coached against the Yellow Jackets as members of ACC staffs. Only **Warren Belin** (LBs) and **J.D. Hall** (WRs) have not faced Georgia Tech.

Seven VU coaches (Johnson, Bryant, Ted Cain, Caldwell, Fisher, Jimmy Kiser and David Turner) have coached in the ACC.

Turner and Fisher are the only Commodore coaches with previous SEC experience.

COMMODORE ROSTER INCLUDES TEN GEORGIA RESIDENTS

Ten players on the Vanderbilt roster hail from the state of Georgia, including likely

starters **OG Jim May** (senior, Lilburn/Parkview HS), **DT Matt Clay** (sophomore, Powder Springs/McEachern HS), **TB Norval McKenzie** (sophomore, Powder Springs/McEachern HS) and **punter Greg Johnson** (freshman, Lilburn/Parkview HS).

Other Commodores who live in Georgia are **CB Ronnie Swoopes** (redshirt freshman, Athens), **CB Cheron Thompson** (redshirt freshman, Atlanta), **WR Keith Williams** (redshirt freshman, Riverdale), **LB Herdley Harrison** (freshman, Marietta), **LB Funtaine Hunter** (freshman, Lowndes County) and **OT Mac Pyle** (freshman, Adairsville).

McKENZIE, CLAY PREP TEAMMATES OF GT QB SUGGS; SEVERAL OTHER PREP CONNECTIONS IN GAME

A pair of Vanderbilt sophomores - **DT Matt Clay** and **TB Norval McKenzie** - are very familiar with probable GT quarterback **A.J. Suggs**. The trio were prep teammates at McEachern High, leading the team to the Georgia AAAA state championship game in 1998 (junior year for McKenzie and Clay).

Other high school ties include:

★ Vanderbilt sophomore **WR Brandon Smith** was a classmate and teammate of GT standout sophomore **OT Nat Dorsey** and junior **CB Albert Poree** at St. Augustine High School in New Orleans. **Jason Burns**, a Vanderbilt freshman walk-on, quarterbacked the St. Augustine squad.

★ VU redshirt freshman **CB Cheron Thompson** starred at Douglass High in Atlanta, following in the footsteps of GT's senior starting **CB Marvious Hester**.

★ **OG Jim May** is close friends with Tech senior free safety **Jeremy Muires**. Both were all-star performers at Parkview HS.

★ Senior safety **Mike Martin** could face one of his closest friends, **WR Will Grover**, in Yellow Jacket passing alignments. Both were standouts at Tampa's Jesuit HS. **George Godsey**, Tech's starting QB the last two seasons, also attended Jesuit.

★ VU freshman punter **Greg Johnson** followed GT junior **Dan Burnett** as Parkview's punter/placekicker.

★ Two Commodores - senior **WR Ryan Cuffee** and freshman **CB Kelechi Ohanaja** - were prep teammates of GT sophomore **RB Jimmy Dixon** at Martin High in Arlington, TX.

Game Notes

WR STRICKER APPROACHING VANDERBILT, SEC MARKS

WR **Dan Stricker** enters his final season within reach of two significant Southeastern Conference receiving marks - career catches and career receiving yards.

Stricker, of Cincinnati, Ohio, is the SEC's active leader with 2,260 career receiving yards. It ranks 20th all-time in the category among SEC receivers, and 3rd all-time among VU receivers, behind Boo Mitchell (2,964 yards) and Martin Cox (2,275 yards). He is just 742 yards short of the all-time SEC mark of 3,001 yards established last year by Josh Reed of LSU.

Stricker also has 138 career catches, second among active SEC receivers (Terrence Edwards of UGA has 145 catches). He needs 71 catches this year to surpass the current SEC career mark of 208 held by Craig Yeast of Kentucky.

Stricker, a preseason All-SEC pick who was named last week as a Biletnikoff Award candidate, is coming off two superb seasons, with 61 and 65 catches in 2000 and 2001, respectively.

He also enters the season within reach of Vanderbilt's all-time mark for TD receptions. He is five TDs shy of Chuck Scott's mark of 20.

COMMODORES MUST REPLACE KEY OFFENSIVE PERSONNEL

The Commodores enter the 2002 season looking to replace the school's all-time leading passer and almost all of their rushing production from a year ago.

Either of two quarterbacks - junior **Benji Walker** and redshirt freshman **Jay Cutler** - are likely to replace three-year starter Greg Zolman (VU career leader in completions, attempts and passing yards). Walker offers the only collegiate experience, though it is limited (six pass attempts in 2001).

At running back, the Commodores must replace two seniors who each rushed for more than 600 yards last year - Lew Thomas and Rodney Williams. Sophomore **Norval McKenzie**, the likely starter, has the most experience (80 yards on 13 attempts).

The Commodores worked out of the shotgun much of last year, and did not utilize a fullback in its base offense. None of the team's FB prospects have a collegiate carry.

NOTED GT TRAINER, JOHNSON WORKED TOGETHER AT FURMAN

Georgia Tech's highly respected head trainer, **Jay Shoop**, was a former head trainer at Furman, and worked with a number of Vanderbilt coaches.

Shoop spent six years (1970-76) at Furman, working with former Furman players and current Commodore coaches Ted Cain, Robbie Caldwell and Jimmy Kiser.

Shoop's final year at Furman was Johnson's first year as a Paladin assistant (1976).

GT RADIO ANNOUNCER WAS FORMER COMMODORE VOICE

If the voice of Tech radio play-by-play announcer **Wes Durham** sounds familiar to many Commodore fans, it should.

Durham was "Voice of the Commodores" from 1992-94, doing play-by-play over the Vanderbilt Radio Network. During his time at Vanderbilt, Durham was awarded a pair of Associated Press honors for "Best Play-by-Play" and "Sports Reporting." He left Vanderbilt to become Georgia Tech's Director of Broadcasting, with duties including play-by-play for football, men's basketball and baseball games.

THE COMMODORES IN SEASON OPENERS

★ The Commodores, celebrating their 111th year of football, are 73-33-4 in season openers. They are 22-20-2 in season openers on the road.

★ The Commodores are 56-42-5 all-time against current ACC teams, and own a winning record against all but two ACC schools, GT and North Carolina (Vanderbilt has never played Florida State). The most recent game against an ACC foe was Duke (42-28 win) last year.

★ In season openers involving non-SEC teams, the Commodores are 34-16-3 since 1932.

★ The Commodores are 0-4-1 in season openers versus Georgia Tech. The Commodores are 0-2 in Atlanta openers.

VU TO BUS LARGE FRESHMEN CONTINGENT TO GT CONTEST

The university will bring 260 incoming freshmen to Atlanta for the game. The freshmen will leave Nashville Saturday on five charter buses and return after the game. The trip is being coordinated by VU's Division of Student Life. Classes begin on the Vanderbilt campus this Wednesday.

VANDERBILT FOOTBALL PROGRAM GETS BOOST OF IMPROVED FACILITIES

Coach Johnson's football program at Vanderbilt received a huge boost just days before preseason camp opened when construction crews finished work on a \$2.5 renovation of the McGugin Practice Complex.

The facilities, renamed the John Rich Football Complex on August 11, feature a natural grass field and an AstroPlay synthetic surface.

For the first time in several years, the Commodores did not miss a practice during preseason camp thanks to the improvements.

Last January, VU also remodeled its football weightroom. All new equipment - and a 2,000-square foot expansion - were part of the \$800,000 project.

During the summer, the university also installed a new natural grass surface on Dudley Field in Vanderbilt Stadium.

MAGIC'S TRAINING TABLE NAMED BEST IN NATION

Vanderbilt has America's premier football training table, according to *Sports Illustrated*.

The magazine recognized the Vanderbilt athletic training table and executive chef Majid "Magic" Noori in its recent College Football Preview edition. The magazine gave Noori a two-page, full-color spread in the preview. Several players, including DE Robert Dinwiddie, QB Benji Walker and OG Nigel Seaman, joined Noori for the photo shoot.

VANDERBILT RECOGNIZED FOR GRADUATION RATES

One year after leading the nation with a 100% graduation rate, Vanderbilt recently was recognized for outstanding graduation rates of student-athletes.

The American Football Coaches Association Study, conducted this year, found that Vanderbilt graduated 90% of the football players from the freshmen class of 1996. Vanderbilt was one of

nine universities recognized with a 90% or higher ranking. In 2001, Vanderbilt and Notre Dame shared the Academic Achievement Award.

HEALTHY VU SECONDARY

Three key performers in the Vanderbilt secondary - DB **Rushen Jones**, SS **Justin Giboney** and FS **Jonathan Shaub** - are back after missing significant parts of last season.

Shaub missed all of last year, forced to the sidelines after a pair of shoulder surgeries. He started in the secondary two years ago.

Jones, a preseason All-SEC pick, missed six games due to a fractured hand. During his absence, the Commodore defense allowed 44 points a game (17 points more than in games he played).

In 2001, Giboney, a two-year starter, missed the final five games with a leg injury.

The return of Shaub, Giboney and Jones with senior CB Aaron McWhorter gives the Commodores one of the SEC's most experienced defensive backfields.

When time allows, credentials will be mailed. However, they can also be picked up in advance at the Vanderbilt Media Relations Office, located on the second floor of McGugin Center (across from stadium) or at Media Will Call

on game day located at Gate 2 (near intersection of Jess Neely Drive and Natchez Trace Drive). Media Will Call is staffed two hours before each home game.

PRESS BOX ACCESS AT VANDERBILT HOME GAMES

Media must wear their press or photo credentials to gain access to the stadium press box, which is located on the third level. Seating arrangements are posted in various press box locations.

Field access is restricted to working photojournalists from kickoff until five minutes remaining in the game. To gain field access, photojournalists must pick up an arm band at Media Will Call at Gate 2 (near intersection of Jess Neely Drive and Natchez Trace Drive) before the game.

NOTE REGARDING MEDIA PARKING AT VANDERBILT HOME GAMES

A limited number of parking passes are available for media use. All media representatives with a season parking permit will use the 25th Avenue Parking Garage, located one block south of the stadium across from the Hawkins Baseball Field (*for easy access to the parking garage, take Blakemore Avenue to 25th Avenue*). All media representatives receiving single-game credentials will receive a parking pass which allows access to Lot 3, located across Natchez Trace from the football practice field (*for easy access to Lot 3, take Blakemore Avenue to Natchez Trace or Vanderbilt Place*).

Note On Parking: *Depending on your arrival time, certain roads around Vanderbilt Stadium will be closed, including Jess Neely Drive and a section of Natchez Trace between the stadium and West End Avenue. To prevent delays, please use Blakemore Avenue to access both the 25th Avenue Parking Garage and Lot 3.*
