Last Time Out

The Commodores, who had four players score in double digits and were powered by sophomore Brian Thornton's career-high 18 points and eight rebounds, beat East Tennessee State 86-75 Wednesday night at Memorial Gym.

The Commodores opened the game with a concerted effort to work the ball inside because of a significant height advantage. Thornton cashed in as he was a perfect 5-for-5 from the field and 4-for-4 from the line for 14 points in the first half. Saddled with foul trouble, Thornton only added four points in the second.

After falling behind 18-11, the Buccaneers went on a 10-0 run behind the deadly shooting of senior guard Ryan Lawson. Lawson lit the Commodores up from behind the arc with four three-point buckets and 16 points in the first half alone. However, he only added two more points.

The 'Dores went into the break leading 48-38. After trailing 51-38, the Buccaneers ran off nine straight points to cut the Commodores lead to 51-47. The four-point deficit would be as close as ETSU would get the rest of the night.

Leading 65-58 with less than seven minutes left in the game, Vanderbilt scored 10 points in less than two minutes to put the game out of reach. Sophomore Jason Holwerda finished the game with nine points and four assists while junior Matt Freije pumped in 18 points on the night.

Scouting Tulane

Tulane enters the game with a record of 3-3 after an 80-67 loss at New Orleans Thursday. The Green Wave returns 13 lettermen and all five starters from last year's squad that finished 14-15 and 5-11 in the Conference USA standings.

Senior forward Brandon Brown leads Tulane in scoring and rebounding with 16.7 points and nine rebounds per game. Senior guard Brandon Spann is second in scoring with 15.2 points per contest and leads the team with 25 assists. Senior guard Waitari Marsh, who was the team's third-leading scorer last season with 11.8 points per game, has only played two games this season because of an ankle injury.

The Vanderbilt-Tulane series dates back to the 1920-21 season and continued with their membership in the SEC. The series was renewed last year for the first time since the 1965-66 season. Last season, Tulane shot almost 67 percent from the field and 63 percent from three-point range to defeat Vanderbilt 87-77 at the New Orleans Arena.

Three...Dot...Data vs. East Tennessee State

Vanderbilt had four double-digit scorers (Freije, Thornton, Przybyszewski, Hundley), which is just the second time that has occurred this season...Vanderbilt shot 50 percent from three-point range, which is the third time in five games this season VU has surpassed last season's three-point percentage (.370)...Vanderbilt had eight blocks to just two for ETSU...Six of the 10 Commodores who took a shot versus ETSU had field goal percentages of at least 50 percent...Vanderbilt had a scoring drought of 4:30 in the first half and then scored just three points in the first 6:06 of the second half...The attendance of 12,490 fans for the Connecticut game was the most for a non-SEC game since 12,810 showed up for a 92-86 win over Ohio State on Nov. 28, 1998...Points in the paint: VU 38, ETSU 32...Points off turnovers: VU 26, ETSU 18...Second-chance points: VU 5, ETSU 13...Fast-break points: VU 13, ETSU 10.

Deuce Is Loose

Sophomore Brian Thornton is making a habit of flirting with double-doubles almost every night despite averaging just over 20 minutes per game. In just 19 minutes of action versus Georgia Southern, he scored a career-high 18 points and pulled down nine boards. Two games later against East Tennessee State, Thornton matched his career best with 18 points and grabbed eight rebounds in just 20 minutes.

Thornton's best rebounding game came against Alabama A&M when he had 10 boards. It was the fifth time in his career he has recorded a double-digit rebound game as he continues to be the only Commodore since the beginning of last season to post a double-figure rebound game.

The 1:21 That Made the Difference Versus ETSU

As has become the norm in recent years, the Commodores got all they wanted Wednesday against East Tennessee State. With just under

seven minutes to play in the second half, Vanderbilt was hanging on to a 65-58 lead. But in the next 1:21, the Commodores made four plays that sealed the game for the home team.

First, Corey Smith made a steal which led to an alley-oop dunk from Jason Holwerda to Matt Freije. Just 24 seconds later, Freije was on the receiving end of another alley-oop pass, this time from Smith.

After a two-point basket for ETSU, Holwerda made two three-pointers in 24 seconds to make the score 75-60 Vanderbilt. In the span of 1:21, the Dores extended their lead from seven to 15 points and put the game out of reach.

Przybyszewski Steadily Becoming More Productive

Sophomore David Przybyszewski scored a season-high 13 points against East Tennessee State on 6-of-7 shooting, which included just his second three-pointer of the season. Przybyszewski has now increased his scoring total in every game this season from two points against Southeastern Louisiana to the 13 versus ETSU.

Also against ETSU, Przybyszewski registered a career-high four blocks and grabbed five rebounds, which is one off a season high.

Hundley Fond of Playing the Bucs

Junior Scott Hundley must circle the East Tennessee State game when schedule comes out every season because he always seems to have a solid game against the Buccaneers. Wednesday night, Hundley had a season-high 11 points on 5-of-8 shooting and also grabbed three rebounds, dished out three assists, blocked two shots and pocketed a steal. The 11 points were the third-most of his career and the most since scoring 11 points last season versus ETSU (12/22/01).

Vanderbilt's Scoring Sources Different This Season

One has to look no further than the stats sheet to see in black and white that Vanderbilt has switched from a perimeter-based offense to more of an inside game.

This season, four of the top five scorers are forwards and post players, including Matt Freije (18.0), Brian Thornton (13.8), Corey Smith (8.4) and David Przybyszewski (7.2). Last season, three of the top four scorers were guards, including Chuck Moore (12.7), Brendan Plavich (10.1) and Sam Howard (9.7).

Freije Quietly Still Team Leader

Junior forward Matt Freije quietly continues to be the team leader with 18 points per game. He has been Vanderbilt's leading scorer in all four contests and the game-high scorer in four of those five games.

Freije's season-high scoring output was 22 points against Georgia Southern, but his performance against the No. 12 UConn Huskies was his best all-around effort. The junior scored 18 points and just missed his second career double-double with nine rebounds. His nine boards was the most for him since grabbing nine rebounds Dec. 29 against Morehead State.

Smith Sets Career High, Again

Sophomore Corey Smith set career highs in points (14) and field goals attempted (10), while matching a career high with five made field goals against No. 12 Connecticut. The guard from Houston also was 4-of-4 from the free-throw line and added an assist and a steal.

Smith recorded a then-career high with his game-high 13 points against Alabama A&M. Smith was 5-of-8 from the field, including a three-pointer, and 2-of-2 from the charity stripe. His previous career high before this season was nine points, which he scored four times last

year as a freshman.

Making the accomplishment improbable is that Smith has a hair-line fracture in right thumb, which is his shooting hand. He is forced to wear a splint, which is taped into place for every practice and every game. He will wear the splint for the next four to six weeks.

"Actually, I think it is helping my shot," Smith said after the Alabama A&M game. "Because of the wrap on my thumb, I don't put the ball on the palm of my hand which is a bad place for it to be. It also stops my thumb from interfering with my shot."

Commodores Regain Long-Range Touch

After making just 2-of-15 (.133) from behind the three-point arc against Connecticut, Vanderbilt was 8-of-16 (.500) from three-point range versus ETSU. Sophomore Jason Holwerda made a career-high three treys to lead the Commodores, while junior Matt Freije (2-4) was the only other Commodore with more than one three-pointer.

Dores' Domsday Defense

Defense has been the early calling card for this Vanderbilt team. The Commodores limited Alabama A&M to 19.3 percent shooting, Southeastern Louisiana to 33.9 percent, Georgia Southern to 36.7 percent and East Tennessee State to 38.7 percent. Last season, Vanderbilt's opponents shot 45.1 percent from the field.

The Commodores held Alabama A&M to just 13 in the first 25:12 and just 40 for the game. It was the lowest scoring output for a Commodore opponent since Vanderbilt held Nicholls State to 37 points in an 85-37 victory Dec. 15, 1996. The lowest point total for an opponent last season was 50 by Houston in the opening round of the NIT.

Vanderbilt Finds Offense in Lakey

Junior guard Russell Lakey put together one of the more solid games of his career against Georgia Southern. Lakey dished out a career-high eight assists and pocketed four steals, while committing no turnovers. For the season, he has 20 assists to just eight turnovers.

Also, Lakey's 15 points, which he scored all in the first half, was just three off his career best. Lakey made them count as he scored 11 points in the final 6:08 to help key Vanderbilt's 31-10 run to close out the first half.

Lakey ranks third in single-season freshman assists with 94 (2000-01) and also ranks 10th in single-season steals with 54 during his freshman campaign (2000-01).

Vanderbilt Runs Away From the Eagles

On the strength of a 31-10 run to end the first half, the Commodores posted a 96-60 win over Georgia Southern. The 36-point margin of victory is the largest for a Vanderbilt team since defeating Alabama A&M 113-71 (+42) Dec. 30, 1998.

Also, Vanderbilt's 57 first-half points were the most for the Commodores in a half since they scored 60 in the first half against Western Kentucky Dec. 18, 1999. VU went on to defeat WKU 101-77.

Vanderbilt Versus Ranked Opponents

Vanderbilt is 0-1 this season and 9-16 under Kevin Stallings versus ranked opponents. This season's loss was a 76-70 home decision to No. 12 Connecticut. In the 36 games versus ranked opponents leading up to Stallings' arrival (1994-99), VU won just six games.

Dores Still Serving Up Wins on Silver Treys

With all of the preseason talk about Vanderbilt's lack of a prime-

ter threat, it was hard for some to believe what they saw in the Commodores' 96-60 win over Georgia Southern. VU finished the game 10-of-16 (.625) from three-point range. It was the highest three-point percentage since Vanderbilt hit 65.2 percent (15-23) of its treys Jan. 1, 2000 against Florida.

The Commodores followed that performance two games later with an 8-of-16 (.500) effort from three-point range versus ETSU.

Going Inside More

However, the Commodores have improved their inside game at the same time. Vanderbilt has scored 50 percent of its baskets from the paint. Because of this inside presence, the Dores are shooting 52.9 percent from the field, including a 62.7 percent effort versus Georgia Southern a 62-percent performance against Southeastern Louisiana and a 54.7 percent showing versus East Tennessee State.

Winning Without Treys

Last season, the lowest number of three-pointers Vanderbilt made in a win was five. This season the Commodores got off to 2-0 start, making five and four treys in the first two games, respectively.

JT Makes His Mark on the Stats Sheet

Freshman Julian Terrell had a statistical coming out party against Georgia Southern. In just 19 minutes of action, he scored 10 points, grabbed eight rebounds and recorded three steals.

Home Sweet Home

Vanderbilt is in the midst of an impressive streak against non-conference opponents. Entering the Tulane game, the Commodores are 55-3 in their last 58 homes games versus non-SEC foes. Before losing to Connecticut, the Commodores had won 16 of these games in a row since dropping a 77-74 decision to Notre Dame Dec. 2, 2000. The other loss in the stretch was an 83-68 loss to Wake Forest March 14, 2000 in the first round of the NIT.

Three-Point Streak Moves Past 500 Games

Vanderbilt continues to be one of only three schools (UNLV & Princeton) to have made a three-point field goal in every game since the shot was introduced for the 1986-87 season. Vanderbilt's streak stands at 509 games, which is just one game behind UNLV's streak for the longest in the nation.

Against Connecticut, the Commodores came as close as they have in recent memory to not extending the streak. Vanderbilt did not make a three pointer until the 13:32 mark of the second half and finished just 2-of-15 from long range.

Slowing Down Their Ace

In every game this season, the Vanderbilt defense has held the opponent's top scorer below his season scoring average.

Southeastern Louisiana's Amir Abdur-Rahim was held scoreless in the first half and did not score until the 16:27 mark of the second half. He finished the game with 13 points after averaging almost 16 points a game last season.

Alabama A&M's top threat, Ricky Ricketts, also was shut out in his first half against the Commodores. He did not score until the 14:48 mark of the second stanza and finished the game with just nine points. Ricketts had scored 28 points in the Bulldogs' season opener after averaging almost 12 points per game last year.

Georgia Southern's Julius Jenkins, who was averaging 22 points per game, finished with 21 points for the game.

Against Connecticut, Vanderbilt was able to limit Ben Gordon to just four points after he had averaged a team-high 19.5 points in the Huskies' first two games.

East Tennessee State's Tiras Wade entered the game versus Vanderbilt averaging 16.3 points per game. He finished with only 14 points against the Commodore defense.

Holwerda Begins With Career Night

Jason Holwerda began his second Commodore season with a bang. Against Southeastern Louisiana, Holwerda recorded career highs in points (12), FGs made (5), FGs attempted (7), 3-pt FGs made (2), 3-pt FGs attempted (4) and tied a career high with five assists.

The native of Chattanooga, Tenn., also played solid defense throughout the game. And for good measure, he helped out on offense with two alley-oop dunks. With the first dunk, Holwerda set up Matt Freije for the acrobatic slam. For the second play, Holwerda took a mid-court pass from freshman Mario Moore and finished the fast break with a rim-rattling dunk.

Commodores On Target

Vanderbilt opened the season with an inside game that has not been a part of the Commodore offense for years. One of the early by-products of this new philosophy is a high field goal percentage.

Against Southeastern Louisiana, Vanderbilt shot 62 percent (31-50) from the field and an even better 73.1 percent (19-26) in the second

half alone. The Commodores still made 5-of-12 (.417) from behind the three-point arc, but it was the 44 points in the paint that won the game.

In the Georgia Southern contest, the Commodores once again found the bottom of the net often. They shot 62.7 percent (37-59) from the field and 62.5 percent (10-16) from three-point range, while scoring 48 points from the paint.

Lineup Merry-Go-Round Stopping

This season, Vanderbilt has started the lineup of Matt Freije, Jason Holwerda, Russell Lakey, Corey Smith and Brian Thornton the past four games. Last season, Vanderbilt never started the same lineup more than three consecutive games.

During the 2001-2002 season, Vanderbilt started 18 different lineups in 32 games. The combination of Matt Freije, Sam Howard, Chuck Moore, Brendan Plavich and David Przybyszewski led the way with a 5-2 record. Freije was the only Commodore to start every game.

Skuchas to Redshirt

Vanderbilt freshman Ted Skuchas will redshirt this season. Skuchas, a 6-11, 243-pound center from Audubon, Pa., will sit out this season in an effort to help his long-term development.

The last Commodore to truly redshirt was Sam Lekwauwa in the 1998-99 season. Chuck Moore, who graduated this past spring, was forced to sit out the 1999-00 season after transferring from Seton Hall.

Krueger Leaves Team

Vanderbilt freshman Bryson Krueger has decided to leave Vanderbilt University. He plans to attend a junior college in his home state of Arizona.

Krueger, a 6-6, 183-pound guard from Tempe, Ariz., missed most of the preseason practices because of personal issues and did not play in either exhibition game. He was scheduled to be redshirted this season before deciding to leave the program.

Bulk of Production Returns for Commodores

With the loss of just two starters and four letterwinners overall, the majority of Vanderbilt's production returns for the 2002-2003 season. Led by junior Matt Freije, almost 55 percent of the scoring and almost

64 percent of the rebounding return from this past season. The Commodores also have more than 55 percent of the assists, more than 53 percent of the steals and almost 59 percent of the minutes played returning this fall.

The only area in which less than half of the team's production is not returning is three-point field goals. With the departure of Brendan Plavich, Sam Howard and Chuck Moore, VU returns less than 28 percent of its three-point baskets from last season.

Youth Reigns Again for Vanderbilt

Just as they have the past two seasons, the Commodores will be forced to depend on a young and inexperienced group of players to win games. Of the 12 scholarship players on the roster, there are no seniors, three juniors, five sophomores and five freshmen.

Stallings' Fourth Year Provides Quality Seasons

In his 20 seasons as an assistant and head coach, there have been three times when Kevin Stallings has coached the same team for a fourth consecutive season. As Stallings enters his fourth season at the helm of the Commodores, history provides hope for a successful 2002-2003 Commodore campaign.

In his fourth season as an assistant coach on Gene Keady's staff at Purdue, Stallings helped the Boilermakers to a 22-10 overall record, an 11-7 Big Ten mark and an NCAA Tournament berth.

Stallings' fourth season as an assistant on Roy Williams' staff at Kansas saw the Jayhawks finish 27-5 overall, 11-3 in the Big Eight and advance to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

In his fourth season as the head coach at Illinois State, Stallings led the Redbirds to a 24-6 overall record, a 14-4 record in the Missouri Valley Conference and a trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Reaching New Heights

This year's VU team has six players that stand 6-8 or taller, including sophomore David Przybyszewski (6-11), freshman Ted Skuchas (6-11), sophomore Martin Schnedlitz (6-10), junior Matt Freije (6-9), freshman Julian Terrell (6-9) and sophomore Brian Thornton (6-8).

The last VU team to have at least six players who stood 6-8 or taller was the 1997-98 squad that advanced to the third round of the NIT. The six players on the 1997-98 squad included Darius Coulibaly (7-0), Dan Langhi (6-11), Austin Bates (6-10), Billy Di Spaltro (6-9), Greg LaPointe (6-9) and Gianni Cugini (6-8).

Vanderbilt Welcomes Two Freshmen With Local Ties

Incoming freshmen Mario Moore and Julian Terrell both come to Vanderbilt from Nashville, continuing a long tradition of home-grown talent for the Commodore men's basketball program.

This is the first time since the 1985-86 season in which more than one incoming freshman has come to Vanderbilt from the same area. That 1985-86 squad actually had two pairs of freshmen from common areas. Barry Booker from Franklin, Tenn., and Sydney Grider from Nashville, Tenn. joined the local team, while Frank Kornet and Chip Rupp joined the Commodores from Lexington, Ky.

Memorial Gym Shines Past Golden Anniversary

The VU basketball teams play their games in a new-look Memorial Gym as a \$25 million renovation was completed this past fall. Included in the renovation was a three cross-court practice gym, coaches office suites, new entry plazas and a donor lounge that overlooks the court.

These improvements come on the heels of Phase I of the project,

which included aesthetic enhancements to the seating bowl and lobby areas, new lighting and sound systems, private suites and new press row and media work areas.

Vanderbilt on the Tube

The Commodores posted a 7-1 record this past season in games decided by five points or less. Under Kevin Stallings, Vanderbilt is 18-8 in games decided by five points or less.

Freije Climbs Blocks Chart

Matt Freije's 40 career blocks leaves him eight away from cracking the school's top-10 list. His 28 blocks in the 1999-2000 season ranked him as the top freshman and sixth overall in single-season blocks at Vanderbilt.

Muller Promoted, Jankovich Leaves

Dan Muller was named an assistant coach after Tim Jankovich left Vanderbilt to take an assistant coach position at Illinois. Jankovich, who joined the Commodores' staff when Stallings was hired in the spring of 1999.

Muller joined the basketball staff for the 2000-01 season and has spent the past two years at the team's administrative assistant. In that role, he was in charge of arranging team travel, supervising player academic progress and a variety of administrative matters.

Prior to joining the Vanderbilt staff, Muller spent two years playing professionally in Argentina, Vancouver and Belgium. Muller also played for Stallings at Illinois State, where he helped the Redbirds to two regular season and Missouri Valley Conference Tournament championships and four postseason appearances, including trips to the NCAA Tournament in his final two seasons.

Muller also was a two-time GTE Academic All-American and was a recipient of the NCAA's Post-Graduate Scholarship. He also was named a Bone Scholar, the highest academic honor at ISU.

Muller is currently working toward his MBA through the University of Florida's professional online course system.
