### Last Time Out

Junior Matt Freije regained his shooting touch and freshman Julian Terrell posted his first career double-double, but Vanderbilt's second-half surge came up short in a 76-63 loss at No. 6 Notre Dame. Junior Russell Lakey also had a solid game with 12 points and six rebounds.

It looked like the Irish would cruise after a taking a 20-point lead in the first half. Then sloppy play early in the second allowed the Commodores to rally. The Irish had 10 turnovers in the first 10 minutes of the second half and Vanderbilt, which struggled offensively in the first half, took advantage.

The Commodores scored 16 points off turnovers in the second half, helping cut the gap to six. Freije, who scored a season-best 23 points, and Lakey each hit three-pointers during a 19-7 run that sliced the deficit to 60-54.

Notre Dame then closed the game on a 14-7 run, as Vanderbilt missed 10 shots in the final eight minutes. Notre Dame sealed the win at the end with free throws as the Irish went 21-for-29 from the line.

Terrell had 12 points and 10 rebounds for Vanderbilt, while Chris Thomas scored 19 points and Matt Carroll added 15 for Notre Dame.

### Scouting College of Charleston

College of Charleston enters the game with a record of 10-2 and winners of two straight in the Cougars' own tournament. College of Charleston defeated Maryland-Baltimore County 78-57 Sunday and then earned a 77-73 win over Howard Monday.

College of Charleston is ranked seventh in the latest CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major poll and is coming off a season in which the Cougars finished with a 21-9 record.

Junior forward Thomas Mobley leads the team in scoring with 14.3 points per game. He is followed closely by senior guard Troy Wheless, who is averaging 14.0 points per contest. The Cougars' leading rebounder is junior center Mike Benton, who is pulling down 5.5 boards per game.

The only previous meeting between the two schools came Feb. 8, 1992, at Memorial Gym in Nashville. Commodore coach Eddie Fogler led Vanderbilt to a 74-68 victory over College of Charleston. Two Commodores who played on that 1991-92 squad, Kevin Anglin and Willy Daunic, will be broadcasting the game for Comcast Sports Southeast.

**Three...Dot...Data vs. Notre Dame**

Vanderbilt was 16-of-21 on free throws, which is the most for both in the past five games...VU's 76.2 free-throw percentage was the second-best this season (.842 vs. UConn)...VU's 41 rebounds was the third-most this season...The Commodores have averaged 7.7 blocks in the past three games...VU's 12 steals was the second most this season (13 vs. Alabama A&M)...VU's 27 first-half points was a season-low and the 63 total points was the second-lowest of the season...VU shot 33.9 percent from the field, which is just the second time this season the Commodores have not shot at least 41.5 percent...Points in the paint: VU 22, ND 32...Points off turnovers: VU 24, ND 15...Second-chance points: VU 11, ND 2...Fast-break points: VU 4, ND 10.

**Commodores Welcome Back Freije of Old**

Junior forward Matt Freije rebounded from a sub-par performance at Michigan to score a season-best and game-high 23 points at No. 6 Notre Dame. He also pulled down six rebounds and added two assists and a steal.

Freije was 7-of-16 from the field and 3-of-7 from three-point range, while hitting 6-of-7 free throws. He had 10 points at the half, but his presence was felt mostly when he helped key the Commodores' comeback attempt that closed a 22-point gap to just six points midway through the second stanza.

Freije is currently ranked sixth in the SEC in scoring (16.8) and ninth in free-throw percentage (.731).

**Terrell Records First Double-Double**

Freshman forward Julian Terrell had his best game as a Commodore at No. 6 Notre Dame. He posted his first double-double with season highs in points (12) and rebounds (10), while also recording a season-high three blocks in just 20 minutes.

This outburst was unexpected due to the fact that Terrell had aver-

aged just 1.7 points and 2.3 rebounds in the six games leading up to the Notre Dame contest.

Terrell just missed a double-double with 10 points and eight rebounds against Georgia Southern and also had seven points and seven boards against Alabama A&M.

**Lakey Turns in Solid Performance at Notre Dame**

Junior guard Russell Lakey had his second-best statistical game of the season at No. 6 Notre Dame. His 12 points at Notre Dame is second this season to the 15 he scored versus Georgia Southern and his six rebounds tied a season-best mark. And for the second time this season (Alabama A&M) Lakey tied a career-high with five steals, which moved him to fourth in the SEC is steals with 4.00 swipes per game.

Lakey, who continues to see time at the shooting guard position, also has made a three-pointer in five consecutive games, which is a career-long streak.

**BT Carries Team at Michigan**

At Michigan, Brian Thornton once again showed he is an offensive threat to be reckoned with. The sophomore forward posted game-highs with 20 points and eight rebounds and also recorded a career-high four blocks. He did this while playing 35 minutes, which is five minutes more than his previous career high.

BT got to 20 points on 8-of-11 shooting from the field and 4-of-6 from the charity stripe. It was in the first half that he made his biggest impact. After falling behind 10-1, Thornton helped Vanderbilt gain a three-point halftime lead by scoring 14 of the team's final 23 points.

**Moore Provides Offensive Spark**

Mario Moore finished the Michigan game with a season-best 10 points, making him the only double-figure scorer for Vanderbilt other than Brian Thornton (20). The freshman guard was 4-of-9 from the field and 2-of-5 from three-point range, which are all season highs. He also recorded a positive assist/turnover ratio for the fourth straight game.

**Double-Duty Does**

In five of the past seven games, the same player has been the leading scorer and rebounder for Vanderbilt. Sophomore Brian Thornton has done it three times, including the past two games, while junior Matt Freije has accomplished it twice.

**Thornton Continues to Set Scoring Records**

Sophomore Brian Thornton set his career high in scoring for the third time this season with 22 points against High Point. He got to his record on 8-of-12 shooting from the field and 6-of-11 from the free-throw line. He also pulled down seven boards.

Entering the season, Thornton's career-best was 17 points. He scored 18 points against Georgia Southern and East Tennessee before topping that with 20 points against Tulane.

**Smith Sets Career High, Again**

Sophomore Corey Smith also set his career best in scoring for the third time this season with 19 points versus High Point despite not starting for the first time this season. Smith's 19 points came on 7-of-9 shooting from the field and 2-of-2 from the charity stripe. But it was his career-high three treys on three attempts that fueled his charge.

Previously, Smith had recorded scoring highs against Alabama A&M (13) and Connecticut (14).

Making these accomplishments improbable is that Smith has a

hairline fracture in right thumb, which is his shooting hand. He is forced to wear a splint, which is taped into place for every practice and every game.

"Actually, I think it is helping my shot," Smith said after the Alabama A&M game. "Because of the wrap on my thumb, I don't put the ball on the palm of my hand which is a bad place for it to be. It also stops my thumb from interfering with my shot."

**Commodores Throw Block Party**

With the help of a career-best four blocks from sophomore David Przybyszewski and a career-best two blocks from junior guard Russell Lakey, Vanderbilt recorded nine blocks against High Point. The nine blocks is the most for the Commodores since they recorded nine blocks Nov. 21, 1997 against Memphis.

For the season, Vanderbilt has recorded 58 blocks, which is second in the SEC, and has not had less than four blocks in a game this season. In 32 games last season, Vanderbilt had just 60 total blocks and only twice had more than four blocks in a single contest.

**Vanderbilt Versus Ranked Opponents**

After losing at No. 6 Notre Dame, Vanderbilt is 0-3 this season and 9-18 under Kevin Stallings versus ranked opponents. In the 36 games versus ranked opponents leading up to Stallings' arrival (1994-99), VU won just six games. All-time, the Commodores are now 63-170 against ranked opponents.

**Smith Near Perfect From the Charity Stripe**

Sophomore Corey Smith doesn't get to the free-throw line a great deal, but he makes it count when he gets there. Smith began the season a perfect 14-of-14 from the charity stripe. At Michigan, Smith was 1-of-2 from the free-throw line and is now 15-of-17 on free throws. Last season, the Houston native was 25-of-40 (.625) on his free throws.

**Commodores Find Three-Point Stroke**

After facing some inconsistency from three-point range during the early part of the season, the Commodores have been able to string together three solid performances. The Dores made seven treys against High Point and five at Michigan and at Notre Dame.

This comes on the heels of a stretch in which in a four-game span, Vanderbilt went 2-of-15 versus Connecticut, 3-of-15 against Tulane and 1-of-15 at Indiana.

**Vanderbilt Cuts Down on Turnovers**

Vanderbilt had just 10 turnovers against High Point, which is a season low. It is the team's best mark since recording eight turnovers last season versus Houston in the opening round of the NIT and it ties for the second-best mark since the beginning of last season.

**Freije Has 1,000-Point Club in Sight**

Junior forward Matt Freije is closing in on Vanderbilt's 1,000-Point Club with 932 career points. At his current pace of 16.8 points per game, he will become the 35th player in school history eclipse the 1,000-point barrier in just over four games.

The last Commodore to enter this exclusive club was Sam Howard last season. Howard finished his four-year career 32nd on the list with 1,026 points. Vanderbilt's all-time leading scorer is Phil Cox, who scored 1,725 points from 1981 to 1985.

**No. 35 is No. 1 Against Top Teams**

Matt Freije has proven already this season that he will show up for the Commodores in the big games.

Against No. 12 Connecticut, Freije scored a team-high 18 points and grabbed a team-high nine rebounds. At No. 6 Indiana, he once again put the team on back, scoring a team-high 18 points and pulling down a team-high nine rebounds. Then at No. 6 Notre Dame, Freije scored a season and game-high 23 points and also grabbed six rebounds.

### Freije Flirts With Double-Doubles

Junior Matt Freije is becoming a player that has the potential to record a double-double every night. This season, he has one double-double with 14 points and 11 boards versus Tulane and came within one rebound of the double-dip against UConn and Indiana. In his career, Freije has had seven games in which he missed a double-double by just one rebound and another two games in which he missed by only two rebounds.

### Przybyszewski Shines at Indiana

Sophomore David Przybyszewski had his best game of the young season at No. 6 Indiana. He scored a season-high 14 points and also grabbed a season-high seven rebounds against the Hoosiers. In addition to Matt Freije, Przybyszewski was the only double-digit scorer for the Commodores and was truly the only other offensive threat for Vanderbilt against Indiana.

Przybyszewski has been relatively efficient in his scoring this season. He scored 13 points against East Tennessee State on 6-of-7 shooting and also registered a career-high four blocks and grabbed five rebounds. Versus Tulane, Przybyszewski contributed offensively with seven points in just 10 minutes and against Georgia Southern, he scored seven points on 3-of-3 shooting.

### Three-Point Streak Moves Past 500 Games

Vanderbilt continues to be one of only three schools (UNLV & Princeton) to have made a three-point field goal in every game since the shot was introduced for the 1986-87 season. Vanderbilt's streak stands at 514 games, which is just one game behind UNLV's streak for the longest in the nation.

Against Indiana, the Commodores came as close as they have in almost seven seasons to not extending the streak. Vanderbilt did not make a three-pointer until the 15:03 mark of the second half and finished just 1-of-15 from long range.

The last time Vanderbilt made just one three-pointer was the 1995-96 season. That season, Vanderbilt went 1-of-7 two times with both games coming against the Florida Gators.

### Packin' Them In

Since Vanderbilt tipped off the season Nov. 22, the Commodores have been off and running. Vanderbilt played its first seven games in just 18 days from Nov. 22 to Dec. 9. However, the Dores will play just four games between Dec. 15 and Jan. 8 when they open the SEC season at Auburn.

### Freije Posts Second Career Double-Double

After trying for more than two years, junior forward Matt Freije recorded his second career double-double with 14 points and 11 rebounds against Tulane, while tying a career best with five assists. Freije's first double-double came his freshman season when he scored 22 points and grabbed 11 boards versus Birmingham Southern.

### Freije Quiet Leader

Freije quietly continues to be the team leader with 16.8 points per game. He has been Vanderbilt's leading scorer in seven of the 10 contests and the game-high scorer in five games with his high being 23 points at No. 6 Notre Dame.

### Deuce Is Loose

Sophomore Brian Thornton is making a habit of flirting with dou-

ble-doubles almost every night. In just 19 minutes of action versus Georgia Southern, he scored a career-high 18 points and pulled down nine boards. Two games later against East Tennessee State, Thornton matched his then-career best with 18 points and grabbed eight boards in just 20 minutes.

Thornton's best rebounding game came against Alabama A&M when he had 10 boards. It was the fifth time in his career he has recorded a double-digit rebound game.

## Dores' Dynamic Duo

Junior forward Matt Freije and sophomore forward Brian Thornton have joined forces to lead Vanderbilt early this season as they are the team's top two scorers and rebounders. They alone are responsible for almost 42 percent of the team's scoring and more than 32 percent of the rebounding.

## Vanderbilt's Scoring Sources Different This Season

One has to look no further than the stats sheet to see in black and white that Vanderbilt has switched from a perimeter-based offense to more of an inside game.

This season, the top three scorers are forwards and post players, including Matt Freije (16.8), Brian Thornton (13.9) and Corey Smith (8.9). Last season, three of the top four scorers were guards, including Chuck Moore (12.7), Brendan Plavich (10.1) and Sam Howard (9.7).

### **Dores' Domsday Defense**

Defense has been one of the early calling cards for this Vanderbilt team. The Commodores limited Alabama A&M to 19.3 percent shooting, Tulane to just 32.8 percent, Southeastern Louisiana to 33.9 percent, Georgia Southern to 36.7 percent and Michigan to 38.5 percent. Last season, VU's opponents shot 45.1 percent from the field.

The Commodores held Alabama A&M to just 13 points in the first 25:12 and just 40 for the game. It was the lowest scoring output for a Commodore opponent since Vanderbilt held Nicholls State to 37 points in an 85-37 victory Dec. 15, 1996. Vanderbilt also limited Tulane to just 21 first-half points and 46 for the game.

---

### **Home Sweet Home**

Vanderbilt is in the midst of an impressive streak against non-conference opponents. The Commodores are 57-3 in their last 60 homes games versus non-SEC foes.

Before losing to Connecticut, the Commodores had won 16 of these games in a row since dropping a 77-74 decision to Notre Dame Dec. 2, 2000. The other loss in the stretch was an 83-68 loss to Wake Forest March 14, 2000 in the first round of the NIT.

---

### **Freije Climbs Blocks Chart**

Matt Freije's 43 career blocks leaves him five away from the school's top-10 list. His 28 blocks in the 1999-2000 season ranked him as the top freshman and sixth overall in single-season blocks at VU.

---

### **Close Call Commodores**

This season, Vanderbilt is 0-1 in games decided by five points or less with a 70-66 loss at Michigan. Last season, the Commodores posted a 7-1 record in the same situations. Under Kevin Stallings, Vanderbilt is 18-9 in games decided by five points or less.

---

### **Stallings Reaches 100 Games at Vanderbilt**

VU's 81-75 victory over High Point was the 100th game for Kevin Stallings as the Commodores' head coach. Stallings reached the century mark with a 57-43 (.570) record and two trips to the postseason.

---

### **Hundley Fond of Playing the Bucs**

Junior Scott Hundley must circle the East Tennessee State game when schedule comes out every season because he always seems to have a solid game against the Buccaneers. Wednesday night, Hundley had a season-high 11 points on 5-of-8 shooting and also grabbed three rebounds, dished out three assists, blocked two shots and pocketed a steal. The 11 points were the third-most of his career and the most since scoring 11 points last season versus ETSU (12/22/01).

---

### **Vanderbilt Finds Offense in Lakey**

Junior guard Russell Lakey put together one of the more solid games of his career against Georgia Southern. Lakey dished out a career-high eight assists and pocketed four steals, while committing no turnovers. For the season, he has 20 assists to just eight turnovers.

Also, Lakey's 15 points, which he scored all in the first half, was just three off his career best. Lakey made them count as he scored 11 points in the final 6:08 to help key Vanderbilt's 31-10 run to close out the first half.

Lakey ranks third in single-season freshman assists with 94 (2000-01) and also ranks 10th in single-season steals with 54 during his freshman campaign (2000-01).

---

### **Vanderbilt Runs Away From the Eagles**

On the strength of a 31-10 run to end the first half, the Commodores posted a 96-60 win over Georgia Southern. The 36-point margin of victory is the largest for a Vanderbilt team since defeating Alabama A&M 113-71 (+42) Dec. 30, 1998.

Also, Vanderbilt's 57 first-half points were the most for the Commodores in a half since they scored 60 in the first half against Western Kentucky Dec. 18, 1999. VU went on to defeat WKU 101-77.

---

### **Dores Can Still Serve Up Wins on Silver Treys**

With all of the preseason talk about Vanderbilt's lack of a perimeter threat, it was hard for some to believe what they saw in the Commodores' 96-60 win over Georgia Southern. VU finished the game 10-of-16 (.625) from three-point range. It was the highest three-point percentage since Vanderbilt hit 65.2 percent (15-23) of its treys Jan. 1, 2000 against Florida.

The Commodores followed that performance two games later with an 8-of-16 (.500) effort from three-point range versus ETSU.

---

### **Winning Without Treys**

Last season, the lowest number of three-pointers Vanderbilt made in a win was five. This season the Commodores got off to 2-0 start, making five and four treys in the first two games, respectively.

---

### **Holwerda Begins With Career Night**

Jason Holwerda began his second Commodore season with a bang. Against Southeastern Louisiana, Holwerda recorded career highs in points (12), FGs made (5), FGs attempted (7), 3-pt FGs made (2), 3-pt FGs attempted (4) and tied a career high with five assists.

The native of Chattanooga, Tenn., also played solid defense throughout the game. And for good measure, he helped out on offense with two alley-oop dunks. With the first dunk, Holwerda set up Matt Freije for the acrobatic slam. For the second play, Holwerda took a mid-court pass from freshman Mario Moore and finished the fast break with a rim-rattling dunk.

---

### **Commodores On Target**

Vanderbilt opened the season with an inside game that has not been a part of the Commodore offense for years. One of the early by-products of this new philosophy is a high field goal percentage.

Against Southeastern Louisiana, Vanderbilt shot 62 percent (31-50) from the field and an even better 73.1 percent (19-26) in the second half alone. The Commodores still made 5-of-12 (.417) from behind the three-point arc, but it was the 44 points in the paint that won the game.

In the Georgia Southern contest, the Commodores once again found the bottom of the net often. They shot 62.7 percent (37-59) from the field and 62.5 percent (10-16) from three-point range, while scoring 48 points from the paint.

The 62.7 percent versus Georgia Southern ranks as the 18th-best single-game field goal percentage in the nation.

---

### **Lineup Merry-Go-Round Stopping**

This season, Vanderbilt has started the lineup of Matt Freije, Jason Holwerda, Russell Lakey, Corey Smith and Brian Thornton in eight of the 10 games, including a stretch of six straight. Last season, Vanderbilt never started the same lineup more than three consecutive games.

During the 2001-2002 season, Vanderbilt started 18 different lineups in 32 games. The combination of Matt Freije, Sam Howard, Chuck Moore, Brendan Plavich and David Przybyszewski led the way with a 5-

2 record. Freije was the only Commodore to start every game.

### Skuchas to Redshirt

Vanderbilt freshman Ted Skuchas will redshirt this season. Skuchas, a 6-11, 243-pound center from Audubon, Pa., will sit out this season in an effort to help his long-term development.

The last Commodore to truly redshirt was Sam Lekwauwa in the 1998-99 season. Chuck Moore, who graduated this past spring, was forced to sit out the 1999-00 season after transferring from Seton Hall.

### Krueger Leaves Team

Vanderbilt freshman Bryson Krueger has decided to leave Vanderbilt University. He plans to attend a junior college in his home state of Arizona.

Krueger, a 6-6, 183-pound guard from Tempe, Ariz., missed most of the preseason practices because of personal issues and did not play in either exhibition game. He was scheduled to be redshirted this season before deciding to leave the program.

### Bulk of Production Returns for Commodores

With the loss of just two starters and four letterwinners overall, the majority of Vanderbilt's production returns for the 2002-2003 season. Led by junior Matt Freije, almost 55 percent of the scoring and almost 64 percent of the rebounding return from this past season. The Commodores also have more than 55 percent of the assists, more than 53 percent of the steals and almost 59 percent of the minutes played returning this fall.

The only area in which less than half of the team's production is not returning is three-point field goals. With the departure of Brendan Plavich, Sam Howard and Chuck Moore, VU returns less than 28 percent of its three-point baskets from last season.

### Stallings' Fourth Year Provides Quality Seasons

In his 20 seasons as an assistant and head coach, there have been three times when Kevin Stallings has coached the same team for a fourth consecutive season. As Stallings enters his fourth season at the helm of the Commodores, history provides hope for a successful 2002-2003 Commodore campaign.

In his fourth season as an assistant coach on Gene Keady's staff at Purdue, Stallings helped the Boilermakers to a 22-10 overall record, an 11-7 Big Ten mark and an NCAA Tournament berth.

Stallings' fourth season as an assistant on Roy Williams' staff at Kansas saw the Jayhawks finish 27-5 overall, 11-3 in the Big Eight and advance to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

In his fourth season as the head coach at Illinois State, Stallings led the Redbirds to a 24-6 overall record, a 14-4 record in the Missouri Valley Conference and a trip to the NCAA Tournament.

### Youth Reigns Again for Vanderbilt

Just as they have the past two seasons, the Commodores will be forced to depend on a young and inexperienced group of players to win games. Of the 12 scholarship players on the roster, there are no seniors, three juniors, five sophomores and five freshmen.

### Reaching New Heights

This year's VU team has six players that stand 6-8 or taller, including sophomore David Przybyszewski (6-11), freshman Ted Skuchas (6-11), sophomore Martin Schnedlitz (6-10), junior Matt Freije (6-9), freshman Julian Terrell (6-9) and sophomore Brian Thornton (6-8).

The last VU team to have at least six players who stood 6-8 or taller was the 1997-98 squad that advanced to the third round of the NIT. The six players on the 1997-98 squad included Darius Coulibaly (7-0), Dan Langhi (6-11), Austin Bates (6-10), Billy Di Spaltro (6-9), Greg LaPointe (6-9) and Gianni Cugini (6-8).

### Vanderbilt Welcomes Two Freshmen With Local Ties

Incoming freshmen Mario Moore and Julian Terrell both come to Vanderbilt from Nashville, continuing a long tradition of home-grown talent for the Commodore men's basketball program.

This is the first time since the 1985-86 season in which more than one incoming freshman has come to Vanderbilt from the same area. That 1985-86 squad actually had two pairs of freshmen from common areas. Barry Booker from Franklin, Tenn., and Sydney Grider from Nashville, Tenn. joined the local team, while Frank Kornet and Chip Rupp joined the Commodores from Lexington, Ky.

### Memorial Gym Shines Past Golden Anniversary

The VU basketball teams play their games in a new-look Memorial Gym as a \$25 million renovation was completed this past fall. Included in the renovation was a three cross-court practice gym, coaches office suites, new entry plazas and a donor lounge that overlooks the court.

These improvements come on the heels of Phase I of the project, which included aesthetic enhancements to the seating bowl and lobby areas, new lighting and sound systems, private suites and new press row and media work areas.

### Vanderbilt on the Tube

Vanderbilt will receive nice exposure this season as 12 of its 27 regular season games will be televised. All of the Commodores' post-season game will be televised as well. Here is a listing of Vanderbilt's 2002-03 television games:
