**Last Time Out**

South Carolina used a season-high 59 percent shooting to upset the Vanderbilt Commodores, 84-72, Saturday night in Memorial Gym. Vanderbilt sophomore Brian Thornton led all scorers with 22 points and six rebounds.

The Gamecocks, who entered the game as the SEC's worst three-point shooting team at 25 percent, shot themselves out of their slump. USC buried 7-of 11 attempts from behind the arc to finish the game at 63 percent.

The Commodores' Thornton sent the message early that he came to play. Thornton scored 10 of Vanderbilt's first 14 points and finished just one short of his career high.

With the Commodores leading 12-9 in the early going, the Gamecocks put together a streak the Commodores could not overcome. USC outscored Vanderbilt 23-4 over an eight-minute span in the first half to double up the Commodores, 32-16.

USC seemed to score at will on the Vanderbilt defense that could not stop the bleeding. The Gamecocks routinely got good looks at the basket and nailed most of them. The Commodores trailed 46-31 at the break after giving USC their highest point total for a half all season.

After halftime, the Commodores responded to the support of their fans by creating three turnovers in the first four minutes to trim the lead to 11. But that would be as close as Vanderbilt would get until the game was out of reach late.

**Scouting LSU**

LSU enters the game with an overall record of 13-8 and a 2-7 mark in the SEC after suffering a last-second 56-54 loss Saturday at Auburn. The Tigers began the season 12-2, including a home win over No. 1 Arizona, before dropping 7-of-9 games in the conference. LSU has a 2-2 conference at home this season with wins over Mississippi State and South Carolina.

Senior forward Ronald Dupree leads the team in scoring with 15.9 points per game and has actually increased that number in SEC play, averaging 16.6 points in the nine league contests. Junior forward Jaime Lloreda (12.2) and senior guard Torris Bright (10.0) also are averaging double-figure scoring. Lloreda is the squad's top rebounder with 8.5 boards per game.

Vanderbilt leads 52-44 in the all-time series between the two schools, while LSU holds the 26-18 advantage in Baton Rouge, La. The Commodores are 4-1 in the past five games versus LSU at the Maravich Assembly Center, dating back to the 1992-93 season.

just one off his career high and the six boards were the most for him since grabbing eight rebounds Jan. 18 at Tennessee.

Thornton came out of the gates strong, scoring the first eight Commodore points and 10 of Vanderbilt's first 14 points. He finished the game 10-of-14 from the field and 2-of-4 from the charity stripe.

This was the first time Thornton had led Vanderbilt in scoring since posting a career-high 23 points Jan. 8 at Auburn. It also snapped a string of five games in which Matt Freije had been the team's leading scorer.

### Point Guards Nearing Top-10 Lists

Junior guard Russell Lakey's 110 career steals leaves him just three short of breaking into Vanderbilt top-10 list. In 69 career games, Lakey has averaged 1.59 steals per game.

Guard Mario Moore also is nearing a Vanderbilt top-10 list. Moore's 48 assists this season leaves him just 10 short of reaching Vanderbilt's top-10 list for assists by a freshman. (See charts on page 6)

### Smith Returns to Action

Against South Carolina, sophomore Corey Smith returned to game action for the first time since breaking a bone in his left hand during practice Jan. 24. Smith played 12 minutes and scored eight points against the Gamecocks.

### Freije Earns Player of the Week Honors

Matt Freije was selected as the SEC Player of the Week after leading the Commodores to wins over No. 15 Georgia and Ole Miss this past week. Freije scored a career-high 31 points and grabbed nine rebounds in Vanderbilt's 94-91 win over Georgia. The junior forward led Vanderbilt to a 76-68 home victory over Ole Miss Saturday night. Freije scored a team-high 20 points, pulled down five rebounds and pocketed a career-high five steals.

This marks the second SEC Player of the Week honor for Freije. He was tabbed SEC Player of the Week last season on January 21, 2002 after scoring a then-career-high 29 points versus Auburn and helping VU to a road victory at South Carolina. This also marks the ninth time a Vanderbilt player has received this honor since the 1993-94 season.

### Commodores Top Scorers Against Georgia & Ole Miss

In back-to-back games, Vanderbilt put up the most points its opponent had surrendered all season.

The 94 points VU scored against Georgia topped the previous high of 83 points that Georgia Tech and Gonzaga had scored against the Bulldogs. The 94 points also was the highest Vanderbilt point total versus an SEC opponent since scoring 101 against Georgia March 1, 2000.

The Commodores then scored 76 points on Ole Miss, which topped the previous high of 69 that Evansville had scored against the Rebels. The 76 points also was the most Ole Miss had allowed in 13 games against SEC opponents.

### Vanderbilt Playing Nation's 16th Toughest Schedule

As of Monday, CollegeRPI.com has Vanderbilt's schedule ranked as the 16th toughest in the nation. That ranks VU fifth in the SEC behind Georgia (1), Arkansas (2), South Carolina (11) and Alabama (12).

This season VU has played eight teams ranked in the Top-25 of the national polls, including Connecticut (12), Indiana (6), Notre Dame (6), Alabama (4), Kentucky (16), Florida (5), Georgia (15) and Mississippi State (23).

### No. 35 is No. 1 Against Top Teams

Matt Freije has proven this season that he will show up for the Commodores in the big games. In eight games against Top-25 teams, Freije is averaging 20.8 points and 5.5 rebounds.

Against No. 12 Connecticut, Freije scored a team-high 18 points and grabbed a team-high nine rebounds. At No. 6 Indiana, he once again put the team on back, scoring a team-high 18 points and pulling down a team-high nine rebounds.

At No. 6 Notre Dame, Freije scored a game-high 23 points and also grabbed six rebounds. Against No. 4 Alabama, he scored a team-high 19 points and then followed with 15 points versus No. 16 Kentucky.

Freije scored a team-high 21 points at No. 5 Florida and then came back with a career-high 31 points and game-high nine rebounds to lead Vanderbilt to a 94-91 upset win over No. 15 Georgia.

Most recently, Freije scored a game-high 21 points at No. 23 Mississippi State.

### Hundley Makes Most of Opportunity

While Corey Smith was unavailable, Scott Hundley was given more of an opportunity to help the Commodores and he made his mark.

Playing a then-career-high 24 minutes versus Georgia, Hundley scored a then-season-high 14 points, grabbed four rebounds and pocketed a career-best four steals. He also had an 8-of-9 performance from the free-throw line. His 4-of-4 shooting from the charity stripe in the final 10 seconds of the game secured the Vanderbilt victory.

Hundley then turned in an even better effort against Ole Miss despite battling illness throughout the game. He scored a season-best 18 points and pulled down a game-high seven rebounds, while playing a career-high 33 minutes. Again, he was solid at the charity stripe, making 8-of-10 free-throw attempts.

### Good as Gold

The Commodores are 4-1 this season when wearing gold uniforms. The team has three sets of uniforms — white, gold and black. While white uniforms have been the standard home attire, Vanderbilt has earned home victories over Alabama A&M, College of Charleston, Georgia and Ole Miss in the gold uniforms. The only loss in gold uniforms was versus South Carolina.

### Freije Moves to 28th in Career Scoring

Junior forward Matt Freije became the 35th member of Vanderbilt's 1,000-Point Club Jan. 18 at Tennessee. Now with 1,117 career points, he has already climbed to No. 28 on the school's career scoring list.

The last Commodore to enter this exclusive club was Sam Howard last season. Howard finished his four-year career 32nd on the list with 1,026 points and is now 33rd. Vanderbilt's all-time leading scorer is Phil Cox, who scored 1,725 points from 1981 to 1985.

Georgia. He is Vanderbilt's first 30-point scorer since Dan Langhi scored 31 points against Georgia March 1, 2000.

Freije finished the game 11-of-15 from the field, including hitting a career-best five three-pointers in eight attempts. He also was 4-of-6 from the free-throw line.

Freije scored 19 of his points in the first half on 7-of-10 shooting. The 19 first-half points is better than all but four of Freije game totals this season.

### Lights Out Shooting for Commodores & Foes

Vanderbilt (.577) and Georgia (.517) both shot better than 50 percent from the field and combined to shoot 54.5 percent (61-112). It was the fourth time in five games in which the Commodores and their opponent had combined to shoot 50 percent or better from the field.

### Commodores Find Three-Point Stroke

After facing some inconsistency from three-point range during the early part of the season, the Commodores have rebounded from behind the arc. In the five games leading up to the Ole Miss contest, VU had made 51.9 percent (42-81) of its three-point shots and had not made less than eight treys in any of those five contests.

For the season, Vanderbilt is shooting 34.2 percent from three-point range and is averaging 5.95 three-pointers per game.

### Slowing Down Their Ace

In all but four games this season, the Vanderbilt defense has held the opponent's top scorer below his season scoring average. Here is a list of the accomplishments of the Commodore defense.

## Deuce Finds Going Easier in Second Half

Sophomore Brian Thornton, who Commodore fans call "Deuce," must like seconds. For the third time during the SEC season, Thornton had a big second half, scoring 11 of his 13 points in the second stanza versus Mississippi State. Thornton had a huge second half against Georgia, scoring all 16 of his points after the intermission. He did much the same thing at Auburn, scoring 19 of his career-high 23 points in the second stanza.

## Vanderbilt Takes Down a Top-5 Opponent

Vanderbilt's 70-69 win over No. 4 Alabama Jan. 11 was the team's first victory over a Top-5 opponent since the Commodores beat No. 5 Tennessee Feb. 19, 2000. It also was the highest ranked win for VU since beating No. 4 UCLA Nov. 22, 1995, in the Maui Invitational.

## Vanderbilt Versus Ranked Opponents

Vanderbilt dropped to 2-6 this season and 11-21 under Kevin Stallings versus ranked opponents after losing to Mississippi State, 82-60. In the 36 games versus ranked opponents leading up to Stallings' arrival (1994-99), VU won just six games.

All-time, the Commodores are now 65-174 against ranked opponents. VU is 47-58 all-time at home and 15-108 all-time on the road versus ranked foes.

Moore's best game as a Commodore came against No. 16 Kentucky when he scored a team-high and career-best 17 points on the strength of a career-best 4-of-7 three-point shooting effort. His previous high was 10 points at Michigan.

### Thornton Continues to Set Scoring Records

Sophomore Brian Thornton set his career high in scoring for the fourth time this season with 23 points at Auburn, including 19 in the second half alone. He got to his record on 10-of-14 shooting from the field and 3-of-4 from the free-throw line, while playing just 22 minutes. He also grabbed six boards.

Entering the season, Thornton's career-best was 17 points. He scored 18 points against Georgia Southern and East Tennessee, 20 points against Tulane and 22 points versus High Point.

### Near Perfection From the Charity Stripe

Sophomore Corey Smith doesn't get to the free-throw line a great deal, but he makes it count when he gets there. Smith began the season a perfect 14-of-14 from the charity stripe and is now 31-of-34 (.912) after going 3-for-3 versus South Carolina. Last season, the Houston native was 25-of-40 (.625) on his free throws.

Matt Freije also has a sterling free-throw mark in SEC play. In league play, Freije is first in the conference with his 90.3 free-throw percentage (28-31). Overall, Freije is fourth in the conference, making 70-of-88 free throws (.795).

### Three-Point Streak Moves Past 500 Games

Vanderbilt continues to be one of only three schools (UNLV & Princeton) to have made a three-point field goal in every game since the shot was introduced for the 1986-87 season. VU's streak stands at 524 games, which is just behind UNLV's streak for the longest in the nation.

Against Indiana, the Commodores came as close as they have in

almost seven seasons to not extending the streak. Vanderbilt did not make a three-pointer until the 15:03 mark of the second half and finished just 1-of-15 from long range.

The last time Vanderbilt made just one three-pointer was the 1995-96 season. That season, Vanderbilt went 1-of-7 two times with both games coming against the Florida Gators.

### Smith Sets Career High, Again

After not reaching double figures in any game last season, sophomore Corey Smith reached double-digits for the sixth time this season with a game-high 18 points at Tennessee. Smith has set his career best in scoring three times this season with 19 points versus High Point as the current high mark. Previously, Smith had recorded scoring highs against Alabama A&M (13) and Connecticut (14).

### Vanderbilt Throws Block Party

With the help of a career-best four blocks from sophomore David Przybyszewski and a career-best two blocks from junior guard Russell Lakey, Vanderbilt recorded nine blocks against High Point. The nine blocks is the most for the Commodores since they recorded nine blocks Nov. 21, 1997 against Memphis.

With 82 blocks this season, Vanderbilt is ranked fifth in the SEC and has already surpassed last season's mark of 60 blocks.

### Double-Duty Does

Eight times this season the same player has been the leading scorer and rebounder for Vanderbilt. Brian Thornton has done it five times, including Saturday against South Carolina, while Matt Freije has accomplished it three times.

### Freije Flirts With Double-Doubles

Junior Matt Freije is becoming a player that has the potential to record a double-double every night. This season, he has one double-double with 14 points and 11 boards versus Tulane and came within one rebound of the double-dip against UConn, Indiana and Georgia. In his career, Freije has had eight games in which he missed a double-double by just one rebound and another two games in which he missed by only two rebounds.

### Dores' Dynamic Duo

Junior forward Matt Freije and sophomore forward Brian Thornton have joined forces to lead Vanderbilt early this season as they are the team's top two scorers and rebounders. They alone are responsible for almost 44 percent of the team's scoring and almost 32 percent of the rebounding.

### Freije Quiet Leader

Freije continues to be the team leader with 17.7 points per game. He has been Vanderbilt's leading scorer in 14 of the 20 contests and the game-high scorer in nine games with his high being a career-best 31 points against No. 15 Georgia.

### Close Call Commodores

This season, Vanderbilt is 2-3 in games decided by five points or less after defeating Georgia, 94-91. Last season, the Commodores posted a 7-1 record in the same situations. Under Kevin Stallings, Vanderbilt is 20-11 in games decided by five points or less.

### **Freije Climbs Blocks Chart**

Matt Freije's 46 career blocks leaves him four away from the school's top-10 list. His 28 blocks in the 1999-2000 season ranked him as the top freshman and sixth overall in single-season blocks at VU.

### **Dores Can Still Serve Up Wins on Silver Treys**

Vanderbilt has quieted most of the talk about it's lack of a perimeter threat. Against Georgia Southern, VU finished the game 10-of-16 (.625) from three-point range. It was the highest three-point percentage since Vanderbilt hit 65.2 percent (15-23) of its treys Jan. 1, 2000 against Florida.

For the season, VU has made at least seven three-pointers in nine games. In the five games leading up to the Ole Miss contest, the Commodores made eight treys three times and nine threes in the other two contests.

### **Commodores On Target**

Vanderbilt opened the season with an inside game that has not been a part of the Commodore offense for years. One of the by-products of this new philosophy was a high field goal percentage.

Against Southeastern Louisiana, Vanderbilt shot 62 percent (31-50) from the field and an even better 73.1 percent (19-26) in the second half alone. The Commodores still made 5-of-12 (.417) from behind the three-point arc, but it was the 44 points in the paint that won the game.

In the Georgia Southern contest, the Commodores once again found the bottom of the net often. They shot 62.7 percent (37-59) from the field and 62.5 percent (10-16) from three-point range, while scoring 48 points from the paint.

Most recently, Vanderbilt shot 57.7 percent (30-52) from the field and 56.3 percent (9-16) from long range against No. 15 Georgia. Before that, VU shot 56.8 percent (25-44) from the field and 61.5 percent (8-13) from three-point range versus No. 4 Alabama.

### **Lineup Merry-Go-Round Stopping**

This season, Vanderbilt has started the lineup of Matt Freije, Jason Holwerda, Russell Lakey, Corey Smith and Brian Thornton in 12 of the 20 games, including a stretch of six straight. Last season, Vanderbilt never started the same lineup more than three consecutive games.

During the 2001-2002 season, Vanderbilt started 18 different lineups in 32 games. Freije was the only Commodore to start every game.

## **SEASON NOTES**

### **Holwerda Gears up for Gators**

Sophomore guard Jason Holwerda once again proved he likes to play the Florida Gators. Of the 13 statistical categories in which career highs are kept, he has set or tied 11 of them in three games against Florida. He also averages 8.7 points per game versus the Gators, which is almost five points above his career average.

Holwerda broke out of his scoring and shooting slump by scoring a career-high 17 points at No. 5 Florida. He actually had eclipsed his previous high of 12 points when he headed to halftime with 13 points.

In addition to his scoring high, Holwerda also set or tied six other career highs. He was 7-of-9 from the field and 3-of-4 from long range, while also grabbing a team-high six rebounds and dishing out three assists and pocketing a steal.

---

### **Tennessee Triple Play**

At Tennessee, Matt Freije and Corey Smith tied for game-high honors with 18 points apiece, while Brian Thornton added 16 points and eight rebounds. It was the first time this season the Commodores have had three players score at least 16 points in the same game.

Freije scored all 18 of his points in the second half as he shot 7-of-10 after the intermission. Smith was 4-of-6 from three-point range, which are both career-best marks. He also played a career-high 38 minutes. Thornton also had a second-half surge, scoring 12 points on 6-of-9 shooting in the second period.

### **Hundley Gives Vanderbilt Quality Play in Three Straight**

Scott Hundley had a good 10 days with solid performances against College of Charleston, at Auburn and against No. 4 Alabama. Against College of Charleston, he scored six points, which was the most for him since scoring 11 versus Connecticut. Hundley then came back to score nine points at Auburn before recording a then-season-best 12 points against Alabama on 4-of-6 shooting from the field and a 4-of-5 performance from the charity stripe.

In addition to his scoring, Hundley showed his all-around game against College of Charleston as he tied a career-high with five assists to go along with no turnovers.

### **Przybyszewski Returns to Scoring Column**

In just 13 minutes of action against College of Charleston, David Przybyszewski was 4-of-4 from the field, including a three-pointer, and 1-of-2 from the charity stripe to finish with 10 points. It was his highest point total since scoring 14 points Dec. 9 at Indiana. For Przybyszewski, who despite his 7-1 height is a solid three-point shooter, it was just his fourth trey of the season and the first since the Dec. 7 Tulane game.

Przybyszewski has been relatively efficient when he has found his scoring touch this season. He scored 13 points against East Tennessee State on 6-of-7 shooting and also registered a career-high four blocks and grabbed five rebounds. Versus Tulane, Przybyszewski contributed offensively with seven points in just 10 minutes and against Georgia Southern, he scored seven points on 3-of-3 shooting.

### **Terrell Rewarded for Notre Dame Effort**

Freshman Julian Terrell earned his first career start against College of Charleston mainly because of what he was able to accomplish in Vanderbilt's game at No. 6 Notre Dame. At Notre Dame, he posted his first double-double with season highs in points (12) and rebounds (10), while also recording a season-high three blocks in just 20 minutes.

### **Lakey Turns in Solid Performance at Notre Dame**

Junior guard Russell Lakey had his second-best statistical game of the season at No. 6 Notre Dame. His 12 points at Notre Dame is second this season to the 15 he scored versus Georgia Southern and his six rebounds tied a season-best mark. And for the second time this season (Alabama A&M) Lakey tied a career-high with five steals.

### **Commodores Welcome Back Freije of Old at Notre Dame**

Junior forward Matt Freije rebounded from a sub-par performance at Michigan to score a game-high 23 points at No. 6 Notre Dame. He also pulled down six rebounds and added two assists and a steal.

Freije was 7-of-16 from the field and 3-of-7 from three-point range, while hitting 6-of-7 free throws. He had 10 points at the half, but his presence was felt mostly when he helped key the Commodores'

comeback attempt that closed a 22-point gap to just six points midway through the second stanza.

### **BT Carries Team at Michigan**

At Michigan, Brian Thornton posted game-highs with 20 points and eight rebounds and also recorded a career-high four blocks. He did this while playing 35 minutes, which is five minutes more than his previous career high. It was in the first half that he made his biggest impact. After falling behind 10-1, Thornton helped Vanderbilt gain a three-point half-time lead by scoring 14 of the team's final 23 points.

### **Moore Provides Offensive Spark at Michigan**

Mario Moore finished the Michigan game with a then-season-best 10 points, making him the only double-figure scorer for Vanderbilt other than Brian Thornton (20). The freshman guard was 4-of-9 from the field and 2-of-5 from three-point range, which are all season highs. He also recorded a positive assist/turnover ratio for the fourth straight game.

### **Vanderbilt Cuts Down on Turnovers**

Vanderbilt had just 10 turnovers against High Point, which is a season low. It is the team's best mark since recording just eight turnovers last season versus Houston in the opening round of the NIT and it ties for the second-best mark since the beginning of last season.

At Auburn, Vanderbilt committed just 11 turnovers with only three of them coming in the second half.

### **Przybyszewski Shines at Indiana**

Sophomore David Przybyszewski had his best game of the season at No. 6 Indiana. He scored a season-high 14 points and also grabbed a season-high seven rebounds against the Hoosiers. In addition to Matt Freije, Przybyszewski was the only double-digit scorer for Vanderbilt.

### **Freije Posts Second Career Double-Double**

After trying for more than two years, junior forward Matt Freije recorded his second career double-double with 14 points and 11 rebounds against Tulane, while tying a career best with five assists. Freije's first double-double came his freshman season when he scored 22 points and grabbed 11 boards versus Birmingham Southern.

### **Dores' Domsday Defense**

The Commodores limited Alabama A&M to 19.3 percent shooting, Tulane to just 32.8 percent, Southeastern Louisiana to 33.9 percent, Georgia Southern to 36.7 percent and Michigan to 38.5 percent. Last season, VU's opponents shot 45.1 percent from the field.

The Commodores held Alabama A&M to just 13 points in the first 25:12 and just 40 for the game. It was the lowest scoring output for a Commodore opponent since Vanderbilt held Nicholls State to 37 points in an 85-37 victory Dec. 15, 1996. Vanderbilt also limited Tulane to just 21 first-half points and 46 for the game.

### **Stallings Reaches 100 Games at Vanderbilt**

VU's 81-75 victory over High Point was the 100th game for Kevin Stallings as the Commodores' head coach. Stallings reached the century mark with a 57-43 (.570) record and two trips to the postseason.

### **Hundley Fond of Playing the Bucs**

Junior Scott Hundley must circle the East Tennessee State game when the schedule comes out every season because he always seems to have a solid game against the Buccaneers. In this year's game ver-

sus ETSU, Hundley had a then-season-high 11 points on 5-of-8 shooting and also grabbed three rebounds, dished out three assists, blocked two shots and pocketed a steal. At the time, the 11 points were the third-most of his career and the most since scoring 11 points last season versus ETSU (12/22/01).

### **Vanderbilt Runs Away From the Eagles**

On the strength of a 31-10 run to end the first half, the Commodores posted a 96-60 win over Georgia Southern. The 36-point margin of victory is the largest for a Vanderbilt team since defeating Alabama A&M 113-71 (+42) Dec. 30, 1998.

Also, Vanderbilt's 57 first-half points were the most for the Commodores in a half since they scored 60 in the first half against Western Kentucky Dec. 18, 1999. VU went on to defeat WKU 101-77.

### **Holwerda Begins Season With a Bang**

Jason Holwerda began his second Commodore season with a bang. Against Southeastern Louisiana, Holwerda recorded then-career highs in points (12), FGs made (5), FGs attempted (7), 3-pt FGs made (2), 3-pt FGs attempted (4) and tied a career high with five assists.

### **Vanderbilt Finds Offense in Lakey**

Junior guard Russell Lakey put together one of the more solid games of his career against Georgia Southern. Lakey dished out a career-high eight assists and pocketed four steals, while committing no turnovers. Also, Lakey's 15 points, which he scored all in the first half, was just three off his career best. Lakey made them count as he scored 11 points in the final 6:08 to help key Vanderbilt's 31-10 run to close out the first half.

### **Home Sweet Home**

Vanderbilt finished the non-conference portion of the regular season in the midst of an impressive streak against non-conference opponents. The Commodores are 58-3 in their last 61 homes games versus non-SEC foes.

Before losing to Connecticut, the Commodores had won 16 of these games in a row since dropping a 77-74 decision to Notre Dame Dec. 2, 2000. The other loss in the stretch was an 83-68 loss to Wake Forest March 14, 2000 in the first round of the NIT.

### **Skuchas to Redshirt**

Vanderbilt freshman Ted Skuchas will redshirt this season. Skuchas, a 6-11, 243-pound center from Audubon, Pa., will sit out this season in an effort to help his long-term development.

The last Commodore to truly redshirt was Sam Lekwauwa in the 1998-99 season. Chuck Moore, who graduated this past spring, was forced to sit out the 1999-00 season after transferring from Seton Hall.

### **Krueger Leaves Team**

Vanderbilt freshman Bryson Krueger has decided to leave Vanderbilt University. Krueger, a 6-6, 183-pound guard from Tempe, Ariz., missed most of the preseason practices because of personal issues and did not play in either exhibition game. He was scheduled to be redshirted this season before deciding to leave the program.

### **Bulk of Production Returns for Commodores**

With the loss of just two starters and four letterwinners overall, the majority of Vanderbilt's production returns for the 2002-2003 season. Led by junior Matt Freije, almost 55 percent of the scoring and almost

64 percent of the rebounding return from this past season. The Commodores also have more than 55 percent of the assists, more than 53 percent of the steals and almost 59 percent of the minutes played returning this fall.

The only area in which less than half of the team's production is not returning is three-point field goals. With the departure of Brendan Plavich, Sam Howard and Chuck Moore, VU returns less than 28 percent of its three-point baskets from last season.

**Stallings' Fourth Year Provides Quality Seasons**

In his 20 seasons as an assistant and head coach, there have been three times when Kevin Stallings has coached the same team for a fourth consecutive season. As Stallings enters his fourth season at the helm of the Commodores, history provides hope for a successful 2002-2003 Commodore campaign.

In his fourth season as an assistant coach on Gene Keady's staff at Purdue, Stallings helped the Boilermakers to a 22-10 overall record, an 11-7 Big Ten mark and an NCAA Tournament berth.

Stallings' fourth season as an assistant on Roy Williams' staff at Kansas saw the Jayhawks finish 27-5 overall, 11-3 in the Big Eight and advance to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

In his fourth season as the head coach at Illinois State, Stallings led the Redbirds to a 24-6 overall record, a 14-4 record in the Missouri Valley Conference and a trip to the NCAA Tournament.

**Youth Reigns Again for Vanderbilt**

Just as they have the past two seasons, the Commodores will be forced to depend on a young and inexperienced group of players to win games. Of the 12 scholarship players on the roster, there are no seniors, three juniors, five sophomores and four freshmen.

**Reaching New Heights**

This year's VU team has six players that stand 6-8 or taller, including sophomore David Przybyszewski (6-11), freshman Ted Skuchas (6-11), sophomore Martin Schnedlitz (6-10), junior Matt Freije (6-9), freshman Julian Terrell (6-9) and sophomore Brian Thornton (6-8).

The last VU team to have at least six players who stood 6-8 or taller was the 1997-98 squad that advanced to the third round of the NIT. The six players on the 1997-98 squad included Darius Coulibaly (7-0), Dan Langhi (6-11), Austin Bates (6-10), Billy Di Spaltro (6-9), Greg LaPointe (6-9) and Gianni Cugini (6-8).

**Vanderbilt Welcomes Two Freshmen With Local Ties**

Incoming freshmen Mario Moore and Julian Terrell both come to Vanderbilt from Nashville, continuing a long tradition of home-grown talent for the Commodore men's basketball program.

This is the first time since the 1985-86 season in which more than one incoming freshman has come to Vanderbilt from the same area. That 1985-86 squad actually had two pairs of freshmen from common areas. Barry Booker from Franklin, Tenn., and Sydney Grider from Nashville, Tenn. joined the local team, while Frank Kornet and Chip Rupp joined the Commodores from Lexington, Ky.

**Vanderbilt on the Tube**

Vanderbilt will receive nice exposure this season as 12 of its 27 regular season games will be televised. All of the Commodores' post-season game will be televised as well. Here is a listing of Vanderbilt's 2002-03 television games:

**Muller Promoted, Jankovich Leaves**

Dan Muller was named an assistant coach after Tim Jankovich left Vanderbilt to take an assistant coach position at Illinois. Jankovich, who joined the Commodores' staff when Stallings was hired in the spring of 1999.

Muller joined the basketball staff for the 2000-01 season and has spent the past two years at the team's administrative assistant. In that role, he was in charge of arranging team travel, supervising player academic progress and a variety of administrative matters.
