Commodores Open MVC Play

Vanderbilt opens Missouri Valley Conference play on the road at Evansville (Sept. 29) and at Western Kentucky (Oct. 1).

Evansville enters the game with a 1-3-2 record after defeating Xavier, 5-4, Tuesday evening. Gametime is set for 7 pm. Jeff Rhymer leads the Purple Aces with 14 points (six goals, two assists). Last season, Vanderbilt defeated Evansville 3-1 in the regular season, but lost to the Purple Aces, 2-1, in the Missouri Valley Conference Tournament. Evansville leads the series 9-1.

Western Kentucky hosts Belmont on Friday (Sept. 29) before playing the Commodores. The Hilltoppers, (2-6) are led by Steven Brown who totals two goals and two assists for six points. The Hilltoppers defeated VU last season in the final game of the regular season, 1-0. Western Kentucky leads in the series, 11-8-1.

Brad Winter Ranked in MVC Stats

Sophomore goalkeeper Brad Winter ranks eighth in the MVC in goalkeeping with a 1.212 GAA. He has played in seven games (520 minutes) and has allowed seven goals and totaled 24 saves. He also numbers two shutouts, third in the MVC.

Sophomore Chris Yingling and freshman Jimmy Stone lead the Commodores in scoring with five points each. Yingling totals two goals and one assist, while Stone has recorded one goal and three assists. Yingling recorded the game-winning goal against Bowling Green. Charlie White (6-1, 190, So.) totals two goals. Yingling, White and Eric Kubacki (5-10, 155, Jr.) account for all of Vanderbilt's six goals on the season.

Next Action

The Commodores return to Nashville for a four-game homestand, the longest of the season. Vanderbilt hosts Bradley (Oct. 6), Eastern Illinois (Oct. 8), Creighton (Oct. 13) and Drake (Oct. 15) at Vanderbilt Soccer Field.

DeMello Granted Redshirt

Nik DeMello, a 5-11, 165, Jr., from Oakdale, California, will be granted a medical redshirt this season. He underwent sports hernia surgery prior to the season. Last season, DeMello led all VU scorers with 14 points totaling five goals (one game winner) and four assists.

2000 Season Preview

Vanderbilt knows what it wants and where it wants to go with the 2000 soccer season. Exactly how it will happen and how the Commodores will get there remains to be seen.

With a continuing rash of injuries, a host of new faces, a challenging schedule, and an uncertainty of who will fill the starting lineup, there are many question marks for the Commodores.

Vanderbilt looks for its eighth consecutive winning season after finishing 10-9 last year, 4-3 in the Missouri Valley Conference. The Commodores, ranked tenth in the Midwest Region, ranked fourth in goalkeeping (1.38) and sixth in scoring (1.68) in MVC statistics.

Vanderbilt's schedule features five teams from last season's NCAA Tournament. After a tough opening half of the season which kicks off at St. Louis, the Commodores enter Missouri Valley Conference play with ranked teams such as Southwest Missouri, Creighton and newcomers SMU and Tulsa.

The Commodores return three players at goalkeeper who saw considerable playing time last season. In fact, the Commodores ranked fourth in the MVC in goalkeeping allowing an average of 1.38 goals a game. Mike Fach (6-0, 180, Sr.) has the most experience with Mat Gotterer (6-2, 190, So.) close behind. Fach ranked in three MVC statistical categories, including goalkeeping (seventh, 1.80), saves (fifth, 3.50) and shutouts (eighth, 0.09). Brad Winter (6-1, 190, So.) is the team's third goalie, but collected valuable playing time last season as a freshman. Winter was one of only two goalies to shutout NCAA quarterfinalist Alabama-Birmingham (1-0).

Defenders Jeff Prugh and Brian Forster have both graduated leaving two big holes to fill. Philip Stack (5-11, 165, Jr.) and Josh Epstein (6-2, 190, Sr.) are set to start in the middle, but the flank positions are wide open. Leading candidates are Nick Barker (5-10,

165, So.), Josh White (6-1, 190, So.) and Mike Diaz (6-1, 175, Jr.) who was most recently a midfielder. Freshmen Matthew Marz (5-9, 155) and Matt Fratkin (5-7, 140) will also challenge for the positions. The central defense is bolstered by John Nelson (5-9, 155, So.), Shaun Lieser (5-11, 170, Fr.) and Shawn Bercuson (5-10, 155, Fr.).

The midfield is the biggest question mark for the Commodores. Replacing All-MVC second teamer and four-year starter Jeff Burgess and Chris Bunick will be difficult. All of the candidates are young and inexperienced. Seth Gardiner (5-11, 165, Jr.) has seen limited playing time and Eric Kubacki (5-10, 155, Jr.) is coming off a redshirt season. Will Perez (5-6, 150, So.) and Charlie White (6-1, 190, So.) will also challenge for the positions along with Jeff Baker (6-0, 175, Fr.), Jack Hartley (5-10, 150, Fr.) and Tim Garon who transferred from George Mason University.

The front line will perhaps be the strongest area for the Commodores barring injury. VU must replace Mark Pizzulo, who transferred to Florida State, and Travis Weeks (graduation), who totaled 10 points. Weeks

winners. The Commodores will be without last season's leading scorer Nik DeMello (5-11, 165, Jr.) who had sports hernia surgery prior to the season. DeMello, who will redshirt this season, led VU scorers last season with 14 points and ranked 11th in the MVC in goals (0.31) and 13th in scoring (0.81). Sable and Brad Smith (5-8, 155, Jr.) are both very talented, but spent most of last year injured. Chris Yingling (6-2, 180, So.) is developing and Adam Bennett (5-9, 160, So.) provides depth.

The freshmen class is talented featuring Brian Lamping (5-11, 165, Fr., F), Jimmy Stone (5-7, 150, Fr., F) and Patrick Sullivan (5-10, 160, Fr., F). Lamping earned the Golden Boot Award at the 2000 Under-18 National Championship in Orlando, Fla., leading his Scott Gallagher club team to the national championship. Stone was a three-time all-state selection at Monsignor Kelly Catholic High School in Beaumont, Texas, and Sullivan helped lead Bishop Lynch High School (Dallas) to two state championships.

Leading the Commodores for the 28th consecutive season is head coach Randy Johnson. Johnson owns a 240-220-42 overall mark and was selected as Coach of the Year in 1996 (Sun Belt Conference). Assistant Coach Rob Acunto enters his fourth season with the Commodores. Vanderbilt welcomes two new faces to the coaching staff in Charles Morrow and Eric Vaughter. Morrow joins the Commodore staff after serving two years as head coach of the men's and women's soccer teams at Goodpasture High School (Nashville). Vaughter brings a national reputation to the team working with the Commodore goalkeepers. Last January, Vaughter was named to the US Soccer Coaching staff as a goalkeeper trainer.
