GOLD NUGGETS

- The Commodores return 20 letterwinners, including all 11 starters from the 2000 team.
- Nik DeMello, VU's leading scorer in 1999, returns to the lineup after receiving a red-shirt last season due to a sports hernia injury.
- Sophomore Jimmy Stone, a 2000 Missouri Valley Conference All-Newcomer Team selection, was the team's second leading scorer last season with 14 points (5G, 4A). He totaled three game-winning goals along with Charlie White who led VU scorers with 16 points (8G, 0A)
- Mike Diaz, a 2000 Missouri Valley Conference Honorable Mention Team member, led the team in assists with five, including four in Missouri Valley Conference play
- The Commodores were 4-0 in overtime game last seasons. In the last 18 overtime games, VU has lost only one of those contests.
- The Commodores enter their fifth season competing in the Missouri Valley Conference.
- Philip Stack and Jimmy Stone were named to the 2000 Vanderbilt/PUMA Classic All-Tournament Team.
- Brian Lamping scored his first career goal with five seconds remaining in overtime to lead VU to a 2-1 win at Western Kentucky.
- VU defeated Drake 3-2 in overtime with one player short.
- VU scored a season-high four goals at TCU.
- Charlie White scored two goals vs. Drake, while Jimmy Stone scored two goals vs. Southwest Missouri, including the game winner in double overtime.
- Jimmy Stone collected two assists vs. Bowling Green and Nick Barker collected two assists vs. Southwest Missouri.
- The 2001 Freshman class consists of Steve Chromik (5-6, F); Mason DeMello (6-0, F); Drew Ducker (5-6, M); Brendan Matthews (5-7, M); Ryan Paugh (6-4, D); Josh Ratner (5-11, D); and Brady Savell (6-0, D)
