SENIOR DAY TODAY

Seniors Chantelle Anderson and Ashley McElhiney, along with their families, will be honored following the today's game. Vanderbilt teamed with The Jean and Alexander Heard Library and The Charles Davis Foundation to collect resources for the Foundation's Learning Center. All fans who brought a children's book (appropriate for children ages 7-18) received **FREE** admission into the game.

Grammy winners Emmylou Harris, Ashley Cleveland and Marshall Chapman (Vanderbilt graduate) will sing the national anthem prior to the game. Dave Neal and Van Chancellor call the action for SEC-TV.

COMMODORE GOLD NUGGETS

★ The Commodores are **8-5** in SEC action and tied for fifth place with South Carolina who defeated VU earlier in the season, 57-66.

★ Chantelle Anderson and Abi Ramsey combined for 55 of Vanderbilt's 71 points at Tennessee. Anderson scored a season-high 35 points, including VU's first 14 points, going 10-20 from the field and 15-17 from the line. Ramsey hit a career-high 20 points and set another career mark with six three-pointers. She has scored in double figures in four of the last five games and totals 22 steals in those games, including five at Tennessee.

★ The starting lineup of Ashley McElhiney, Hillary Hager, Chantelle Anderson, Abi Ramsey and Jenni Benningfield own a 7-3 record for a 70.0 win percentage.

★ The Commodores have played **seven** teams ranked in the Top 25, including **two** in the Top 3.
★ Chantelle Anderson is one of 20 finalists for the prestigious Naismith Award and one of the Top 13 candidates for the State Farm Wade Trophy. She is also one of the Top 10 finalists for the Senior CLASS Award. Ashley McElhiney is also a finalist for the Senior CLASS Award. She is also on the Top 12 List for the Nancy Lieberman Point Guard Award.

★ Melanie Balcomb was named as one of the 25 finalists for the Naismith Coach of the Year.

★ Junior Jenni Benningfield is having her best season in her three-year Commodore career. She was the Commodore's leading scorer five of the last six games. She has set a single-season high in total points with **418**. She recorded **319** her freshman season and **221** points last season. She is also **42** points shy of becoming the second player this season to join the VU 1000-point club.

Ashley McElhiney did it February 6 vs. Alabama (**1,048** career points). Chantelle Anderson is also a member of the Club. Anderson totals **2,488** career points, the second highest total by a Commodore - male or female. Wendy Scholtens leads the list with **2,602** points. Anderson is **114** points shy of setting the Vanderbilt All-Time Scoring Record.

★ The Commodores are **third** the nation in field goal percentage with a **51.3** mark (708-1380)

★ Senior point guard Ashley McElhiney is the 22nd player (ironically her jersey number) to join the Vanderbilt 1000-Point Club. She nailed a 3-pointer, her third of the game, at the 5:42 mark in the first half against Alabama (Feb. 6) to break the 1000-point mark

★ McElhiney set the Vanderbilt school record with **17** assists at Louisville (Jan. 2, 2003). (The NCAA record is 23 by Michelle Burden, Kent State vs. Ball State, Feb. 6, 1991) On Dec. 22, 2002, she set the VU career assists record against UT-Martin with a then career-high 13 assists.. She surpassed Ginger Jared who totaled 516 (1993-96, 3.9 pga, 132 games). With 10 assists vs. Tennessee, McElhiney is the **only** Commodore to ever total over 600 career assists with **643**.

She now totals **17** career double-digit assist games, including **11** this season. She has played in **34** complete games, **eight** this season, and is tied with Donna Atkinson (1983-86) for the Vanderbilt record.

★ Senior center Chantelle Anderson suffered a dislocated big right toe in the Tennessee game (Feb. 2). Anderson has **never** missed a game as a Commodore, starting in all **131**, a Vanderbilt record. Her shoe was restructured by **NIKE** so it would not bend and protect the toe.

★ Anderson **set** the Vanderbilt Career Field Goals record at the 18:28 mark in the second half against Georgia (Feb. 16). She now totals **976** field goals surpassing Wendy Scholtens with **959**.

★ The inside-outside duo of Jenni Benningfield (inside) and Abi Ramsey (outside) not only accounted for the majority of Vanderbilt's points vs. Mississippi and Georgia, but also the most meaningful. Ramsey's two free throws with 0.7 seconds left against Georgia provided the difference in a 58-56 victory. Ramsey was fouled at the offensive end after her steal on defense created a fast break, courtesy of an outlet pass from Benningfield. Together, the two combined for virtually half of

Vanderbilt's points in the two games (49.6 percent), including 41 of 67 in a victory over Ole Miss.

★ Vanderbilt's **72.5** percent field goal percentage (29-40) vs. Arkansas set a school record and is the **nations's top mark this season**. The previous Commodore record of 71.4 (35-49) was set last season at Western Kentucky Nov. 21, 2001.

★ The Commodores shot 38.8 percent at TCU, which is the lowest field goal percentage by a Commodore team since Feb. 27, 2000. Vanderbilt shot 36.1 percent (22-61) in a 75-49 loss at Georgia. VU shot 39.1 percent at Mississippi connecting on 18 of 46 from the field.

LAST ACTION - VANDERBILT 71, AT FLORIDA 91

• Chantelle Anderson and Abi Ramsey combined for 55 of Vanderbilt's 71 points at Tennessee. Anderson scored a season-high 35 points, including VU's first 14 points, going 10-20 from the field and 15-17 from the line. Ramsey hit a career-high 20 points and set another career mark with six three-pointers.

• With UT leading 31-25, Shyra Ely was called for a personal foul and a technical foul. Ashley McElhiney and Chantelle Anderson hit all four free throws and Ramsey followed with a 3-pointer to cut the Lady Vol lead to one, 33-32. UT led 35-32 at halftime. With the score 68-59 at the 7:21 mark, UT went on a 16-0 run capped by a 3-pointer by both Kara Lawson and Shanna Zolman, for a 25-point lead, 84-59.

• UT outrebounded VU 35-19 and shot 76.2 percent from the field in the second half (16-21). VU was 17-20 from the line and Tennessee was 23-24, including 18-18 in the second half.

COMMODORE COMEBACK

• The Commodores came from 21-points down with 9:37 remaining in the game to defeat Auburn 67-66 in Auburn, Alabama. Auburn began the game with a 23-2 lead before VU cut the Tiger lead to 10 at halftime, 30-20. It is believed to be the greatest comeback in Vanderbilt women's basketball history. VU overcame a 13-point first-half deficit to defeat #1 Tennessee, 77-74, in the SEC Tournament semifinal game March 3, 2001.

2001-02 SEC CHAMPION HONORED AT TENNESSEE HALL OF FAME AND O'CHARLEY'S DINNER OF CHAMPIONS

• The 2001-02 Vanderbilt Commodore women's basketball team was honored as the Collegiate Amateur Team of the Year by the Tennessee Sports Hall of Fame Friday night (Jan. 24). That team captured the Southeastern Conference Tournament title and advanced to the NCAA Tournament Regional championship game. The Commodores owned a record of 30-7, 10-4 mark in league action. Vanderbilt led the nation - men and women - in field goal percentage for the second consecutive season.

CHANTELLE ANDERSON HONORED ALSO....

• Senior All-American Chantelle Anderson was also honored at the Tennessee Sports Hall of Fame Banquet as the Amateur Athlete of the Year. Anderson was a Kodak All-American last season and led the SEC in field goal percentage, second in the nation, with a 64.7 mark against the sixth-toughest schedule in the country. She recorded eight double-doubles and scored in double figures in all but one game. She made at least half of her shots in all but one game, including 22 consecutive games. She was honored as SEC Player of the Year and earned many All-America honors and was named ESPN the Magazine Women's Center of the Year.

COMMODORES HONORED AT O'CHARLEY'S DINNER OF CHAMPIONS

• Senior Chantelle Anderson received the Amateur Athletics Award at the fifth annual O'Charley's Dinner of Champions Monday night (Jan. 27). The Dinner was held at the Opryland Hotel with George Plaster and Darrell Waltrip serving as the hosts.

• The evening concluded with the Top 10 Sports Moments in Nashville for 2002. The team's SEC Tournament title finished in second place behind the Tennessee Titans streak of 10 wins in the final 11 games.

COMMODORES NOW AT 8-5 IN SEC AFTER 0-2 START

• The last time the Commodores started SEC play with an 0-2 record was during the 1988-89 season (Phil Lee) when Vanderbilt went 0-4 before winning its last five consecutive league games. VU ended the season with a 21-8 overall mark and 5-4 league record. The Commodores lost in first round action in the SEC Tournament to LSU (73-79) and lost to St. Joseph in first round action of the NCAA Tournament (68-82).

• The Commodores are now 8-5 in SEC action after starting league play 0-2.

TWO TIME, TWO TIME - SIX COMMODORES IN DOUBLE FIGURES

• Six Commodores scored in double figures for the second time this season following the Holy Cross game. All five starters (Hager 15, Benningfield 11, Anderson 20, Ramsey 11, McElhiney 12) along with top reserve Tia Battle (10 points) scored in double figures in VU's 86-54 win. Prior to that, six players scored in double figures vs. Youngstown State in a, 91-60, Commodore win. All five starters (Battle 12, Benningfield, 13, Anderson 16, McElhiney 14, Hager 12) along with Ashley Earley (13) scored in double figures in that contest.

ROAD WEARY

• The Commodores completed a 5-game- in-10-day stretch (three on the road) with a win at Duquesne on Jan. 6. VU played at TCU on Dec. 29; hosted Charlotte on Dec. 31; played at Louisville on Jan. 2; and hosted Holy Cross on Jan. 4. VU was 3-2 on the stretch.

UNRANKED LOSSES - RANKED WINS

• VU's 70-53 loss at TCU (Dec. 28) was the first loss to an unranked team since Arkansas defeated VU, 67-57, Jan. 31, 2002 in Fayetteville, Ark. It was the first loss to an unranked non-conference team since Nov. 19, 2000, when VU fell at Xavier, 64-60, when Melanie Balcomb was the Muskateer's head coach.

On the other hand....

• Vanderbilt's 76-59 win over Arkansas (Jan. 23) was the first win over a ranked team this season. VU was ranked #18/17, while Arkansas was ranked #8/7. It was the first Commodore win over a higher-ranked team since Feb. 2, 2002, when the #8/6 Commodores defeated #2/2 Tennessee, 76-59, in Memorial Gym.

• The Commodores picked up their second victory over a higher ranked team with a 58-56 decision over #14/16 Georgia. VU was #18/19.

NO THREES FOR TWO GAMES, BUT BACK ON TRACK

- The Commodores did not attempt a 3-point shot vs. Arkansas (Jan. 23). There has been only **one** other time in Vanderbilt history when the Commodores did not attempt a 3-point shot in a game - Dec. 9, 1989, vs. Wright State in the Lady Herd Classic in Huntington, WV (Marshall, host). Vanderbilt won the game 88-49.

- The Commodores were 0-0 from 3-point range in the Arkansas win. The last time Vanderbilt did not hit a 3-pointer in a game was Feb. 27, 2000, in a 75-49 loss at Georgia. The Commodores were 0-3 from 3-point range against the Lady Bulldogs.

- Since going 0-8 from 3-point range vs. Arkansas and LSU, the Commodores have hit 50 3-point shots in the following eight games, including 10 vs. Alabama.

THREE...FOUR...FIVE....FOR THREEEE

- The Commodores have three players ranked three, four, and five in the SEC in 3-point field goal percentage. Ashley McElhiney is third with a 43.1 percentage (50-116), Abi Ramsey is fourth (39.9, 59-148), followed by Hillary Hager in fifth (39.5 - 30-76)

90+

- The Louisville Cardinals 92 points were the most by a Vanderbilt opponent since Feb. 21, 1999, when Alabama defeated the Commodores 102-59 in Tuscaloosa, Ala. Louisville won the contest 92-82 on Jan. 2.

COMMODORES SET FIRST HALF SCORING MARGIN RECORD

- The Commodores outscored Milwaukee 56-13 in the first half to set a school record for highest scoring margin in the first half - 43 points. The Commodore defense held UWM to just 13.6 percent shooting in the first half (3-22). VU was 17-29 (58.6) from the field, including a 9-13 performance from 3-point range. Sophomore Abi Ramsey totaled five of those 13 3-pointers.

COMMODORES ALMOST SET ANOTHER FIRST HALF RECORD

- The Commodores scored 60 points in the first half at Tennessee-Martin (60-31). That was the most points in the first half since Jan. 14, 1993, when the Commodores totaled 61 points vs. Oral Roberts

40-MINUTES

- Ashley McElhiney played in the entire Boston University, Purdue, TCU, Louisville, Mississippi State, South Carolina, Tennessee, Alabama, Mississippi, Georgia and Florida games and now totals **34** 40-minute games in her career.

- She is now tied with Donna Atkinson (1983-86) on the Vanderbilt List with **34** complete career games.
- She missed the Arkansas and LSU games due to a sprained left ankle sustained at the 17:58 mark in the Kentucky game.

- Junior guard Hillary Hager played in her first 40-minute game of her career at LSU and then again vs. Tennessee and Kentucky. She saw point guard action in the LSU game after the injury to Ashley McElhiney.

- Abi Ramsey recorded her first 40 minute game of her career at Mississippi. She played 39 minutes at Kentucky in the game prior to Mississippi and 39 minutes vs. Georgia.

JENNI ON THE OFFENSIVE

- Junior forward Jenni Benningfield has led the Commodores in points and rebounds in **13** games this season (Boston, Syracuse, Purdue; Austin Peay, Duquesne, Mississippi State, Kentucky, Arkansas, LSU, Alabama, Georgia and Florida) and in rebounds vs. Charlotte (10), Louisville (6), Mississippi State (15) and South Carolina (6).

- In **SEC** games, she is second in scoring with **17.1** points and leads the team in rebounding with **7.7**.

- She set a season-high in **total points** in the Alabama game and now totals **418**. She totaled 319 points in her freshman season. Last season, she totaled 221.

- She is **42** points shy of joining the Vanderbilt 1000-point club. She totals **958** points.

- She totals **13 double-double** games, including **nine** this season (Boston-16 points and 13 rebounds; Austin Peay-20 points, 10 rebounds; UT-Martin-16 points and 11 rebounds; Charlotte - 10 points and 10 rebounds; Duquesne - 21 points, 10 rebounds; Mississippi State - 20 points and 15 rebounds; Arkansas - 28 points and 10 rebounds; Alabama 19 points and 11 rebounds; Georgia - 17 points 15 rebounds). She totaled four double-doubles her freshman season and none last season.

- She tied a then career-high with 21 points at Duquesne and totaled 10 rebounds in the contest - she owned her double-double at halftime with 13 points and 10 rebounds.

- Set **career** marks vs. Arkansas, including **28 points** and **12 field goals made**.

- She totaled 25 points and eight rebounds at Mississippi.

- She also picked up where she left off last season in drawing offensive fouls and totals **28** this season .

She took three offensive charges vs. Boston and at Louisville, two vs. Purdue, Charlotte, LSU and Alabama, one at Syracuse, Youngstown State, Austin Peay, Holy Cross, Duquesne, South Carolina, Kentucky, Arkansas, Tennessee and Mississippi, and a season-high four at TCU.

HAGER BACK IN STARTING LINEUP AFTER A YEAR'S ABSENCE

- After playing in 32 games while starting in 18 as a freshman, junior Hillary Hager did not start any games last season. This season, she has started in all 26 games and is the Commodore's third leading rebounder with 5.0 rebounds a game and fifth leading scorer with 7.3 points.

- She averages 33.5 minutes a game and is 68-151 from the field (45.0), including 30-76 from 3-point range (40.5), and 24-32 from the line (75.0).

- She totals 58 assists and a team-leading 45 steals. Last season, she numbered two steals and totaled 20 in her freshman season.

- She totaled a game and season-high eight rebounds vs. Tennessee.

- She tied a career-high six assists vs. Holy Cross.

- At the Duquesne game, she had a fan club from her nearby hometown of Franklin, Penn.

- Has seen playing time at the point guard position since the injury to McElhiney in backup to Erica Grimaldi.

She played her first entire game of her career at LSU. She followed that with a 40-minute game vs. Tennessee and at Kentucky.

TIA BATTLE

- Sophomore Tia Battle has started in 16 of 24 games this season, including the first 11 consecutive games. She has missed two games this season - Alabama and Kentucky - because of the coach's decision.

- She provided a spark from the bench vs. Georgia going 3-5 from the field, 1-1 from the line and totaled two rebounds and one assist in 12 minutes of play. Battle gave VU's its first lead in the second half, 40-39, at the 12:18 mark. She then totaled five points and one assist in the next three minutes.

- She played in 21 games last season and averaged 8.0 minutes a game.

- This season, she averages 19.5 minutes, 6.3 points and 2.4 rebounds a game.

- At UT-Martin, she recorded a season-high four assists. She hit a layup at the 10:15 mark on an assist from Ashley McElhiney which gave McElhiney the school career assists record.

- She hit 4-7 from the field and 5-6 from the line at LSU for 13 points.

- She was 3-4 vs. Tennessee in 13 minutes of play vs. Tennessee. She totaled all six points and one steal in the opening nine minutes of the game when VU owned a 25-9 lead.

FRESHMEN GRIMALDI AND JULES SEE ACTION

- Both Commodore freshmen Erica Grimaldi and Nicole Jules have seen valuable playing time this season.

- After an ankle sprain to Ashley McElhiney in the Kentucky game, Grimaldi was forced to enter the game at point guard and responded with two points and nine assists with only four turnovers in 38 minutes of play.

- In the last three games that McElhiney did not play, Grimaldi averaged 29.6 minutes per game (38 minutes vs. Kentucky, 29 minutes vs. Arkansas and 22 minutes at LSU). In the previous 15 games, she played in 10 and averaged 7.6 minutes a game.

- Grimaldi is a walkon who was granted a scholarship this season by Head Coach Melanie Balcomb.

- Grimaldi saw limited action at Syracuse, but averaged 15 minutes in the First Tennessee Classic. She numbered four assists in 14 minutes of play vs. Youngstown and was 1-1 from the field with two assists and one steal vs. Harvard.

- At Duquesne, she scored a career-high six points going 2-2 from the field and 2-2 from the line in three minutes of play.

- Grimaldi earned her first collegiate start vs. Arkansas because of an ankle injury to McElhiney and played for 29 minutes with four assists and three rebounds.

- Jules has played in 15 games, averages 7.2 minutes and totals 31 points and 17 rebounds. Against Wisconsin-Milwaukee, Jules played for 15 minutes and went 4-6 from the line and 1-1 from the line for a career-high nine points. She totaled a career-high three assists at Duquesne in six minutes of play

EARLEY OFF THE BENCH

- Sophomore guard/forward Ashley Earley has been a spark off the bench averaging 6.8 points and 3.7 rebounds a game in 17.6 minutes per game.

- She has come off the bench in each game and has scored in double figures in five of the 26 contests, including a season-high 15 vs. Austin Peay and at Kentucky.

- At Tennessee, she played for 18 minutes and hit 4-6 from the field for eight points. She also numbered two rebounds and two steals.

- At Florida, Earley came off the bench and went 3-4 from the field and 3-6 from the line for nine points and numbered five rebounds, two steals, one assist and one blocked shot in 26 minutes.

- She numbered eight rebounds in 19 minutes of play vs. Kentucky (1/19) and five boards in 17 minutes vs. Tennessee. At Kentucky, Earley played for 23 minutes and went 6-10 from the field, 3-4 from the line and totaled 15 points, four rebounds and one steal.

WBCA/Summerville RPI

The Commodores 2002-03 strength of schedule is ranked as the 11th toughest in the nation according to the **preseason** WBCA/Summerville RPI. Last season, the Commodores finished ranked fifth in the RPI with the sixth toughest schedule in the country.

As of Feb. 26, the Commodores own a 14 RPI vs. the 11th toughest schedule.

LARGER THAN LIFE

A 50' x 40' billboard featuring Chantelle Anderson and men's basketball player Matt Freije was installed Nov. 11 on the Ramada Inn located at 920 Broadway facing westbound traffic. The billboard features the two players and the men's and women's home schedules. A second billboard featuring Ashley McElhiney and Russell Lakey has also been installed on the Baker Building off West End Avenue.

HOME OPENERS

With a 91-60 win over Youngstown State, the Commodores are now 24-2 in home openers. Vanderbilt owns a 17-game win streak in home openers. The last time the Commodores lost a home opener was Nov. 24, 1985, when Texas Tech defeated Vanderbilt, 74-69.

ASTRAZENECAHOOPS FOR THE CURE CLASSIC II

Vanderbilt joined Purdue, Notre Dame and host Arizona State for the AstraZeneca Hoops for the Cure Classic II. Proceeds from the games will benefit breast cancer research, treatment and education in the Valley of the Sun and the donation going to the Phoenix affiliate of the Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation. Notre Dame defeated Arizona State in the first game, followed by VU's 73-66 loss to Purdue. Over 14,672 tickets were sold and distributed to the game.

Last season, Arizona State and Tennessee drew 16,728 fans at Bank One Ballpark in the inaugural event which raised \$10,000 for breast cancer research.

RAMSEY EARNS START IN 10 GAMES

- In the last five Commodore games, sophomore Abi Ramsey has averaged 14.2 points and 4.2 rebounds a game and totals 22 steals, including a career-high seven vs. Georgia. She has hit 17 three-pointers and is 8-10 from the line, including two free throws with 0.7 seconds left vs. Georgia to ice the VU win (58-56).
- Played the entire Tennessee game (2/27) and scored a career-high 20 points hitting a career-high six 3-pointers. She also numbered five steals in the game.
- She hit a career-high five three pointers vs. Wisconsin-Milwaukee on only seven attempts in the first half of the game when she played only 12 minutes. Against Charlotte, she played for 25 minutes and was 5-10 from the field, including 3-4 from 3-point range and totaled five rebounds, two assists and one steal. She gave VU its first lead of the game when she hit a 3-pointer at the 17:41 mark and then collected a steal and layup on the very next possession for a 7-4 Commodore lead at the 17:28 mark. At Louisville, she played 35 minutes, a career-high, and totaled 10 points, three rebounds, two assists, three steals and one blocked shot.
- At Florida, she totaled 14 points (4 3-pointers and two free throws) and totaled five rebounds, one steal and one assist in 35 minutes of play with no turnovers.
- In the Kentucky and Mississippi games, she played some of her best basketball as a Commodore. She totaled 11-20 from the field, including 7-13 from 3-point range. She also totaled 11 rebounds, nine steals and averaged 16.5 points. She played 39 minutes at Kentucky and her first complete game at Mississippi where she went 4-8 from 3-point range.
- At Kentucky, Abi played for 39 minutes and totaled 17 points, five rebounds and four steals. She went 6-10 from the field, 3-5 from 3-point range, and 2-4 from the line.
- In the Auburn and Tennessee (2/2) games, Abi was 7-11 from 3-point range for a 63.6 percentage
- She hit 4-6 from 3-point range at Auburn for 12 points.
- She earned her first start of the season against Holy Cross.
- She has started in 10 games this season and is averaging 8.7 points and 2.4 rebounds a game.
- After a 6-8 performance from 3-point range vs. Wisconsin-Milwaukee, Ramsey went 16-60 in eight games for a 26.6 percentage before having a 4-6 performance vs. Kentucky. In that game, Ramsey went 5-7 from the field, 3-4 from the line and totaled 17 points in 28 minutes of play.

VU BOMBERS

- The Commodores hit 10-19 from three-point range against Wisconsin-Milwaukee. The team game record is 15 three-pointers vs. Oral Roberts in 1993. VU also hit 10 3-pointers vs. Alabama led by McElhiney's five.
- For the season, Vanderbilt is 166-430 from three-point range for a 38.6 percentage, second in the SEC, 11th in the nation

COMMODORE HOT SHOTS – SET SCHOOL RECORD IN FG PERCENTAGE

- Vanderbilt has shot at least 50 percent in 15 games, including a **school record 72.5 percent vs. Arkansas** (29-40). The Commodores were 18-23 from the field in the second half for a 78.3 percentage. The previous mark of 71.4 (35-49) was set last season at Western Kentucky Nov. 21, 2001.
- Even though the Commodores are sporting a new up-tempo style offense, the Commodores are second in the SEC and third in the nation in field goal percentage with a 51.3 mark (708-1380).
- Against Wisconsin-Milwaukee, the Commodores shot 59.6 percent from the field with all 11 Commodores playing in the contest. VU shot 58.6 percent in the first half (17-29) and 60.7 percent (17-28) in the second half.
- Against Austin Peay, VU shot 69.6 percent in the first half (16-23).
- The Commodores hit a season-low 38.8 percent from the field at TCU connecting on 19-49. That 38.8 percent (at TCU) is the lowest field goal percentage by a Commodore team since Feb. 27, 2000, when Vanderbilt shot 36.1 percent (22-61) in a 75-49 loss at Georgia. At Mississippi, VU shot 39.1 percent (18-46).
- At Auburn, the Commodores were 7-28 from the field in the first half for a 25.0 percentage. In the second half, VU hit 14-23 for a 60.9 percentage, including 9-11 in the final nine minutes.
- For the last two seasons (2000-01 & 2001-02), the Commodores led the nation - men and women - in field goal percentage. Last season, VU owned a 52.1 percentage (988-1897) and in 2000-01 the Commodores shot 54.5 percent from the field (984-1806). Below is the first five game field goal percentages:

CHANTELLE AND MAC

- In games when seniors Chantelle Anderson and Ashley McElhiney were both in the lineup, the Commodores own a 91-33 record for a 73.4 win percentage. McElhiney missed three complete games and the most of another during the 2001-02 season due to a foot injury and missed 38 minutes of the Kentucky game and the entire Arkansas (Jan. 23) and LSU (Jan. 26) contests due to a severe high ankle sprain.

- Both are Top 10 Finalists for the Senior CLASS Award.

- During their three-year career, the Commodores have made three NCAA Tournament appearances, including two Regional final games and two trips to the SEC Tournament Championship game, winning the title in 2002.

- Anderson and McElhiney both had slow starts to the season, but turned that around in the First Tennessee Tournament.

CHANTELLE...

- Chantelle Anderson is one of 20 finalists for the prestigious Naismith Award and one of the Top 13 candidates for the State Farm Wade Trophy. She is also one of the Top 10 finalists for the Senior CLASS Award.

- Scored a season-high 35 points at Tennessee going 10-20 from the line and 15-17 from the line.

- Set the Vanderbilt record for career field goals vs. Georgia when she hit her sixth bucket of the game at the 18:28 mark. She now totals **976**. The previous record was 959 held by Wendy Scholtens.

- Suffered a dislocated right toe at the 11:14 mark vs. Tennessee. She returned to the game at the 5:55 mark, but was obviously hindered by the sore toe. She finished the game with 21 points in 29 minutes.

- Her shoe was reconstructed by the shoe company to give more support in the sole to cushion the toe.

- She was **questionable** for the Alabama game, but responded with a perfect game from the field going **7-7** in 24 minutes.

- She has **never** missed a game as a starter for the Commodores. She owns the record of **131** consecutive starts, set in the Kentucky contest Jan. 19. The previous mark was **120** by Wendy Scholtens. Scholtens played in 122 games, but did not start in the first two games of her freshman season.

- Chantelle earned Tennessee Hall of Fame Amateur Athlete of the Year honors on Jan. 24 and was then named Amateur Athlete of the Year at the O'Charley's Dinner of Championship hosted by the Nashville Sports Council on Jan. 27.

- Chantelle currently is the team's leading scorer with 17.9 points a game (4th in the SEC) and is second on the team in rebounding with 5.3 a game.

- She leads the SEC in field goal percentage with a 62.7 mark (173-276), third in the nation.

- In SEC games, she is 84-140 from the field for a 60.0 percentage and averages 17.7 points and 4.8 rebounds a game.

- She totaled 27 points at UT-Martin connecting on 10-12 from the field and 7-11 from the line. She also numbered seven rebounds and one blocked shot in 31 minutes of play.

- Shot a season low 30.0 (3-10) at Boston on Nov. 23 and at Mississippi on Feb. 13.

- At TCU, Chantelle totaled a team-high 19 points, including 15 in the second half in 12 minutes of play. She recorded her second double-double of the season with 10 rebounds. She went to the locker-room midway through the first half after getting sick on the bench and did not start the second half. She played 12 minutes in each half.

- At Louisville, Chantelle went 11-16 from the field, including 9-12 in the second half to lead all scorers with 25 points.

- At Duquesne, Chantelle shot her then best percentage from the field for the season going 10-11 from the field (90.9).

- Against Arkansas, she played 36 minutes, went 9-11 from the field, 7-10 from the line and totaled seven rebounds, three assists, two blocked shots and a career-high four steals with only three fouls.

- At Auburn, she was held scoreless in the first half. With nine minutes remaining in the game, she went 8-9 from the free throw line and 2-2 from the field, including the game-winner with five seconds remaining. With 18 seconds remaining, she tied the ball with Natasha Brackett to give VU possession.

- In the first two games of the season, Anderson averaged 24.5 minutes a game, shot an uncharacteristic 47.1 percent from the field (8-17) and averaged 4.5 rebounds, 8.5 turnovers and 12.0 points. She also collected nine fouls, while fouling out of the Syracuse contest. Against Youngstown, the senior All-American answered with a double-double with 16 points and 10 rebounds. She also matched a career-high six blocked shots. For the tournament, Anderson averaged 17.5 points and 8.5 rebounds.

- She has scored in double figures in **every** game this season and **48** consecutive games. The last time she did not score in double figures was Jan. 3, 2002 at South Carolina where she went 1-5 from the field and 1-2 from the line in 23 minutes of play.

• She set the Vanderbilt school record with **17** assists at Louisville (Jan. 2, 2003). The NCAA record is 23 by Michelle Burden, Kent State vs. Ball State, Feb. 6, 1991. On Dec. 22, 2002, she set the VU career assists record against UT-Martin with a then career-high 13 assists.. She surpassed Ginger Jared who totaled 516 (1993-96, 3.9 pga, 132 games). With 10 assists vs. Tennessee, McElhiney exceeded 600 assists - the **only** Commodore - male or female - to ever total over 600 career assists. She now totals **643**.

• McElhiney suffered a high left ankle sprain at the 17:58 mark in the Kentucky game. She missed most of the Kentucky game and all of the Arkansas and LSU games. She entered the Auburn game at the 13:58 mark and never came out. She hit her only field goal of the game with 39 seconds remaining to cut Auburn's lead to one, 66-65.

• She totals seven double-doubles this season, the last coming vs. Tennessee (2/2) with 16 points and 10 assists.

• She now totals **17** career double-digit assist games, including **11** this season.

• McElhiney started the first two games 3-15 from the field and totaled 16 turnovers. Against YSU in the First Tennessee Tournament, McElhiney hit 5-10 from the field, including 4-7 from 3-point range and totaled 11 assists for the second consecutive game with just two turnovers in 35 minutes of play. She was named **MVP** of the First Tennessee Tournament averaging 14 points, 5.0 rebounds, 7.5 assists and shot 72.7 from 3-point range hitting 8-11 from beyond the arc.

• With a 40-minute performance at Florida, she moved into a tie for first place with Donna Atkinson (1983-86) as the career leaders in complete games played with **34**. 40-minute performances this season include the following games: Boston, Purdue, TCU, Louisville, Mississippi State, South Carolina, Tennessee, Alabama, Mississippi, Georgia and Florida.

• She leads the SEC in assists with 7.88 a game - almost 1.5 assists more than the second place player -- and is third in 3-point percentage (43.1 (50-116). She is fifth in 3-pointers made (2.08), and fifth in assists/turnover ratio (2.25).

Senior CLASS Award Candidates
 Named to Top 10 List
 Chantelle Anderson - Ashley McElhiney

Chantelle Anderson and Ashley McElhiney have been listed as candidates for the second annual Senior CLASS Award. The award is presented annually to the nation's senior player-of-the-year for NCAA Division I men's and women's basketball. The inaugural award winners were Juan Dixon of Maryland and Sue Bird of Connecticut. The list of women's "Players to Watch" include representatives from 15 conferences, eight of which have multiple players on the list. The SEC also has the most women's players, with six nominations. There are five players on the women's list that were AP All-Americans last season, including two first-team selections.

The formation of the Senior CLASS Award - an acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School - was announced during last season's college basketball season. The CLASS Award was developed in response to the recent trend of college basketball players leaving college early to turn professional.

Selection criteria is based on a number of factors, the most important being that the recipient must have exhausted their four years of eligibility and have fulfilled their commitment to their respective university.

**NAISMITH WATCH
 ANDERSON NAMED TO TOP 20 LIST**

Chantelle Anderson leads the list of pre-season candidates for the 2002-03 Naismith College Basketball Player of the Year Award. Jackie Bradford, President of the Atlanta Tipoff Club, announced the candidates. Nine players from the Southeastern Conference are on the list.

The Naismith Awards program, now in its 35th year, honors the outstanding college basketball players in the United States. The awards program was founded by the Atlanta Tipoff Club, an organization dedicated to recognizing the achievements of student-athletes in basketball.

The candidates were selected by a vote of the Board of Selectors comprised of leading basketball coaches, journalists and basketball analysts. Members of the board were asked to name top male and female players who are most likely to be in contention for the award.

The award honors college seniors for their athletic and academic achievements as well as community involvement. Anderson recorded a season-high 27 points at UT-Martin.

Melanie Balcomb

Head Coach

Melanie Balcomb is not one to sit around and wait for things to happen. That much was evident during her days as a high school and college player in New Jersey, and nothing has changed in a coaching career that has been on the fast track from the start.

Balcomb became the fourth head women's basketball coach in Vanderbilt history when she was hired May 28, following a successful seven-year run at Xavier University. She was the winningest women's basketball coach in Xavier history with an overall record of 135-78 with two Atlantic 10 Conference championships, three NCAA Tournament appearances and a pair of Atlantic 10 Conference tournament crowns. During her tenure she increased the number of winning seasons in the program's history by 50 percent.

Her fast-paced philosophy is apparent in her coaching style, which features an up-tempo approach and a lot of points. Of the 15 Xavier players who have scored at least 1,000 points in a career, 40 percent played at least one season under Balcomb with two others poised to join that club when she left. The highest scoring team in program history was her 2000-01 squad, which averaged 79.4 points per game.

It took just three years for her to turn Xavier into, first, a postseason participant and, then, a national title contender. In 1997-98 she guided the Musketeers beyond the regular season for the first time ever with an appearance in Women's National Invitational Tournament. Each of the next three seasons Xavier competed in the NCAA Tournament, capped in 2001 by a run to the regional final which featured a victory over perennial power Tennessee. Every season from 1995-96 through 2000-01, the program rose through the Ratings Power Index (RPI) from 94 through 15.

Prior to Xavier she spent two years as head coach at Ashland (Ohio) University. Her first season there (1993-94) she led the team to an 18-9 overall record, which matched the best in school history, and an 11-7 mark in the Great Lakes Valley Conference, the first winning season in that program's history in that league.

She also served three years as an assistant at Providence College (1990-93), during which the Lady Friars went 62-30, made two NCAA Tournament appearances and once (1990-91) led the nation in scoring while they amassed 26-6 record. In 1989-90, Balcomb was as assistant at Ohio University and she began her coaching career with a four-year stint (1985-89) on the staff at Niagara University.

Her playing career featured similar rush to success. At both Trenton State College and Highstown (N.J.) High School, she set career records for scoring, assists and steals. In other words, not only did she score a lot of points, she quickly got the ball to others who could score and then often took it away from the opposition to make sure her team could score once more.

In high school, rather than wait for someone else to do it, she became the first female athlete to score 1,000 points in a career. She finished with 1,581 points, two All-State selections and three All-County honors. She also excelled on both the varsity tennis and softball teams.

Her basketball education even began earlier than most and is based in some of the most fundamental aspects of the sport. She learned the game at an early age as the daughter of Alan Balcomb, a varsity boy's coach for 30 years at South Brunswick (N.J.) High School and then an assistant for four years at Princeton University under Pete Carril, the master of the half-court game.

With a long-running history of achievement as a player and a coach, it is no rush to judgment to say Melanie Balcomb is more than just a quick fix for Vanderbilt.
