Catherine Keller is Professor of Constructive Theology at Drew University Theological School. Professor Keller is a prominent voice in current discussions on the role of religion in the global ecological crisis and the author of numerous publications including, *From a Broken Web: Separation, Sexism and Self; Face of the Deep: A Theology of Becoming, God and Power: Counter-Apocalyptic Journeys* (forthcoming).
