**Graham Lindegger** is a Clinical Psychologist and Professor of Psychology in the School of Psychology at the University of KwaZulu-Natal in Pietermaritzburg, South Africa. Professor Lindegger is Principal Investigator of HIV/AIDS Vaccine Ethics Group of the South African AIDS Vaccine Initiative. His teaching and research interests include personality theory, psychopathology, clinical practice, and cognitive-behaviour therapy.

**Robert Morrell** is an Historian in the School of Education at the University of KwaZulu-Natal. Professor Morrell teaches courses on gender and education in the School of Education and in the Medical School. Morrell's current research interests include postcolonial masculinities in school; gender, sexuality and HIV prevention in schools; and parenting and fatherhood. Morrell edited *Changing Men in Southern Africa* (2002) and co-edited *Baba, Men and Fatherhood in South Africa* (2006).
