



Chateaubriand Fellowships: call open for 2012-2013

The Chateaubriand Fellowship Program of the French embassy is intended for PhD students registered in an American university who wish to conduct their research in a French laboratory for a 4 to 10 month period. Two sub-programs, one for STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) and the other one for HSS (Humanities and Social Sciences) are announced on:

For the STEM program, the Office of Science and Technology will provide a stipend (1,400 Euros a month) and cover the cost of travel and student health insurance.

Priority will be given to the candidates who will seek a “**dual degree**” (cotutelle) with the **French host university**. **All disciplines in Sciences, Technology and Health are eligible**. Knowledge of French is not mandatory. **The deadline to apply is February 1st, 2012**, and the fellowship can begin on any date from September 1st, 2012, to April 1st, 2013.

French Embassy Partner University Fund (PUF)
Call for Projects Submission Deadline: **February 6, 2012**

The Embassy of France to the United States and the FACE Foundation are accepting application proposals for the **Partner University Fund (PUF)**. PUF promotes innovative collaborations of excellence in research and education between French and American institutions of higher education. PUF supports emerging transatlantic partnerships with the potential to continue beyond the initial 3-year grant. PUF currently supports 55 multifaceted partnerships **in all fields of study**.

Partnerships may combine elements such as:

- Joint initiatives in Research and publications
- Faculty and postdoctoral mobility
- Collaboration in teaching
- Shared programs
- Joint and dual degrees at the master's and PhD levels

Thanks to private donors and public contributions, **PUF will fund up to 30% of the cost of the selected projects, in the limit of 80.000 USD annually**. The generous grant from the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation (www.mellon.org) will allow the projects in the humanities to be eligible to a higher level of financial support (up to 60 % of the cost and 160 000 USD annually).

Projects proposals must be jointly submitted by at least one American and one French university, by **February 6, 2012**.

Funding decisions will be announced in **May 2012** for the **2012-2013 academic year**.
