Dr. Billy Teets, director of Dyer Observatory, will give us a brief tour inside the observatory to highlight some of the history of astronomy at Dyer and Vanderbilt University as well as a few exhibits. We shall see a short presentation about some of the objects visible that evening and discuss one or two upcoming events, namely lunar eclipses. Finally, we shall end at the Seyfert Telescope to view the Moon, Orion Nebula, and a few other objects.

Dr. Billy Teets is the director of Dyer Observatory as well as the resident astronomer. He coordinates events for the community to engage in astronomy like: Telescope Nights, open houses, lectures, concerts, summer camps, and field trips. He establishes exhibits at the observatory and collaborates with Vanderbilt's physics and astronomy departments as well as teaches introductory astronomy classes.

Message from Eric Kopstain, Vice Chancellor for Administration

Beginning **Monday, March 14**, the university will move to a maskoptional status if six feet of physical distance can be maintained.

This decision comes backed by science - positive cases of COVID-19 at Vanderbilt dropped 60 percent between the week of Feb. 7 and Feb. 14, and continuing discussions with leading public health experts have guided our decision-making through the course of the pandemic.

Masks will be <u>optional</u> for students, faculty, staff and postdocs while indoors, including in classrooms, lab spaces and common areas, if six feet of distance can be maintained. If six feet of distance cannot be maintained, a mask must be worn.

"Mask optional" means it is an individual's choice whether to wear a mask. The university will continue to support those who want to wear a mask at any time for any reason. We expect all members of the Vanderbilt community to respect others' choices regarding masking.

Following these guidelines, then, if you wish to attend an indoor VWC gathering or event, masks are optional.

When the University guidelines and protocols change, we will inform you promptly. Thank you for your VWC membership, your cooperation with VU/VUMC COVID-19 guidelines, and your flexibility in these challenging circumstances.
