Down Memory Lane

Living on campus as told in 1993 by
Grace Gardner.

Grace was a former president of the Vanderbilt Woman's Club and an active participant in the Tuesday Bridge Group. In later years she only attended exceptional Thursday events as that was her day for the beauty parlor. We are delighted she considered the Centennial year exceptional and shared these memories with us.

It will be quite obvious after my brief remarks that I have been around a long time. My parents married in 1898. My father was already a professor at Vanderbilt and my mother joined him here and I'm sure was one of the early members of the Vanderbilt Woman's Club.

We moved into Old Central, which was the home where I and all my five brothers were born. Old Central was the only building on the original property that was given to start Vanderbilt University. It was in the country. The expression "on the city's western border" was really a very true expression. We had a cow. We had chickens, when I grew up on the Vanderbilt campus. That's a little different from the way it is now.

I have early memories of, in particular, the Vanderbilt Woman's Club activities. I remember the garden parties that they had out on the lawn. There was a lot of lawn then adjacent to Kirkland Hall. I knew all the Chancellors personally, beginning with Chancellor Kirkland. I really go back to Chancellor Garland because he was my father's best friend and my oldest brother was named for him.

Some of my best memories include those occasions when we went to afternoon concerts. There was no Neely Auditorium.
Old Central today



The only auditorium on campus was on the second floor of Kirkland Hall. It later became the library and after that became the executive offices. I remember so well going to those afternoon concerts and hearing, believe it or not, the original Fisk Jubilee Singers sing in the auditorium.

In those days, Mrs. Whiteford Cole was the wife of the then chairman of the Vanderbilt board. Mrs. Cole was a large woman. She had a head of snow-white hair. She always came to those afternoon occasions with a floor-length dress, often heavily beaded, and always a feather boa. As a child, that fascinated me.

In conclusion, since I was born on the Vanderbilt campus, since my husband became the burser and then treasurer at the same time my father retired from Vanderbilt, I can truthfully say that I have had a longer, continuing relationship with Vanderbilt than any living person.

That sounds better than saying I'm the oldest living person. You get the drift.
