Tour of the University Residence

Lydia Howarth

The Vanderbilt University Residence, at 211 Deer Park Drive, was designed by and built in 1912 by two bold and unconventional school teachers, Ida Hood and Susan Heron. They planned it to be their retirement home when they stepped down in 1913 as heads of Belmont College, an all-female school they had founded in 1890. The house was donated to Vanderbilt University in 1962, and first occupied by Chancellor Alexander Heard and his family. Significant renovations were undertaken in 2001, and the house remains the frequent setting of large and small gatherings hosted by the Chancellor's Office.

A tour of the 20,000 square-foot house and, weather permitting, a glance at its seven-acre landscape are offered for up to 50 people. The two-hour event includes a catered tea reception, expert art collection guide, and musical performance by Blair students.
