ScholarSips was a resounding success! We are grateful for so many participating in this event, making it as profitable as it was. There were 64 VWC members who purchased one or more tickets. In total there were 143 tickets sold, of those 13 were sponsors. Sponsor totals tallied **\$3,005**. In addition there were direct donations to the scholarship fund from 30 sources contributing an additional **\$2,795**. The total receipts from the invitations were **\$11, 910**.

Elaine Blake chaired this committee with talent, poise and grace. Nancy Dwyer was the coordinator and the facilitator at the Jean and Alexander Heard Central Library. Lisa LeMaster and Kelly Chambers designed the invitations and tallied the RSVP's and the donations. Maddy Berezov worked with Vanderbilt ground maintenance to decorate the recessed window shelves in the library with clippings from the campus. Our members also were well represented in the auction items. Kendra Holroyd, Angela Bowens created the silent auction baskets and Dede Clements solicited original auction items. Joyce Gore donated an authentic Indian dinner for 10 and sold

two dinners thus making a **\$1,200** donation. Loretta Saff offered her skills as a Life Counselor. Judy Isaac donated Kenny G symphony tickets. We could not have done this without our members working the check-in and check-out (with Elisabeth Sandberg on hand for clarification): Lynne Siesser, Angela Bowens, Lisa LeMaster, Judy Auer, Dede Clements, Kate Shaw, Karen Lawrence, Anne Plummer, Joan Hornberger, Aileen Webb, Judy Isaac, and Pam King. Yolonda Brooks Robinson and Cindy Slobogin showed the club's gratitude by distributing the souvenir wine glasses to departing guests.
