

Community Explorers

Visit to Owl's Hill Nature Sanctuary March 23rd

Explore the beauty and serenity of **Owl's Hill Nature Sanctuary** with the Community Explorers on **Monday**, **March 23rd** at **10:00 a.m.**

Owl's Hill provides a protected home for more than 2,000 species of

local flora and fauna that thrive in the hills, forests, creeks, ponds and meadows of this

300-acre hidden gem in the Beech Creek Valley of northern Williamson County. Join a Naturalist Trail Guide for a private wildflower hike to learn about our native wildlife and connect with nature.

Cost is **\$10** per person for the guided 1.5 hour hike.



Participants should dress for the weather. Wear closed-toe, comfortable shoes suitable for hiking. Also bring a reusable water bottle.


Book Talk with Brunch: Friday, April 17th. 9:30 - 11:30
