Andrew wrote *Strong Inside*. He is a visiting author working with Vanderbilt Athletics.

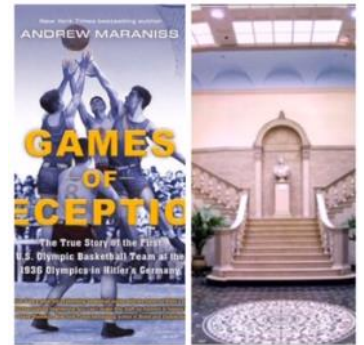
