President's Message

Greetings,

Thank you for the great attendance at our Fall Luncheon. The detailed stories, kind memories, and oral histories from our Life Members were enlightening, humorous and informative. A very special thank you to **Rosemary Worley, Mary Nelle Bryant, Margaret Norris**, and **Virginia Holladay** for sharing their experiences with us. I was touched by how the Vanderbilt Woman's Club was so welcoming to them and how they invigorated the organization with their presence. By the way, **Margaret Norris** had just returned from her 65th anniversary of when she graduated from Columbia Medical School. Kudos to her!

At the luncheon **Sandy Spitz** and **Amy Christiansen** reported on the outcome of the Short-Term Funding and Scholarship Task Force. To align with the financial aid processes which have come about because of *Opportunity Vanderbilt*, our scholarship of an annual amount of \$5000 will be awarded to an incoming first year student during the Vanderbilt admissions process. **Brent Tener**, Director of the Office of Financial Aid and Scholarships, demonstrated a plan in which we could fund one of our scholars by building up our endowment over the next four years. That scholarship would continue forever. We will continue to support that student until graduation in four years. Our scholarship will appear on the offer letter to the first-year student. The name of our scholarship is the **Vanderbilt Woman's Club Stapleton/Weaver Endowed Scholarship**. Should the student not remain for those four years there is a contingency plan in place to address that issue. As **Elisabeth Sandberg** stated at a board meeting, "*That scholar will have 250+ moms*". We look forward to the opportunity to follow our recipient (s) for four years.

This month we will be having our first Dyer Lecture. **Lisa LeMaster** has arranged for **Dr. Michael Bess**, Vanderbilt University Chancellor's Professor of History, to speak with us about his recently-published book: *Our Grandchildren Redesigned: Life in the Bioengineered Society of the Near Future.* Dr. Bess has a particular interest in the social and cultural impacts of technological change. After the lecture, we hope you will join us for a boxed lunch from Provence—this was a big hit last year! 

Her grandfather, great uncle, father, husband and son were all Vanderbilt Alumni. As a new faculty wife she received a call from Elaine Schneider who planned to give her a ride to the Opening Tea. Rosemary explained she knew Vanderbilt well and there was no need for Elaine to drive from the Vanderbilt neighborhood to Inglewood to pick her up and she would meet her there. Elaine came back with, "That is not how we do it at Vanderbilt, I will give you a ride." For the next three meetings Rosemary rode in style. After that she was hooked and has been a faithful attendee of Woman's Club events ever since.





Margaret Norris always remembers how welcoming the Newcomers' Club was to her when she first came to Vanderbilt with her husband. She has been a Book Group One member for 57 years. At first it was very serious with presentations on Russian authors and other erudite topics. Over the years, things changed to themes and authors the members could really enjoy. Margaret participated in the Dance Group. Music was



provided by the Doctors' Orchestra but sadly the group disbanded when their orchestra was no longer available and the hiring of another orchestra proved prohibitive.







Down Memory Lane Continued

Mary Nelle Bryant My father graduated from Vanderbilt in 1910 when there was a pharmacy school. Ever since I was born in 1924 (yes, I turned 90 this year) Vanderbilt has been a part of me. Billy and I married in 1946 and he became a Peabody student but joined the Math faculty in 1948 and taught there for 50 years. The Vanderbilt Woman's Club became a part of my life in the early 50s. At that time the meetings were held at three in the afternoon. I suppose that suited the life styles of the members at the time. One memorable afternoon I was able to obtain and pay for a sitter and I headed for the meeting which was at what is now Cheekwood. It was then the private home of Walter and Hilda Sharpe. As I drove our 41 pre-war Ford up the winding drive leading to the mansion, my car stopped. How embarrassing. I cannot remember who came to my rescue, perhaps a parking attendant. Eventually I made it and was greeted by Mrs. Sharpe. Their young daughter, maybe five or six was there. Of the many, many times I have been to Cheekwood since then, I will never forget that afternoon.

The bridge groups and book groups have been a big part of my enjoyment of the VWC. I have read many books and made many friends. For several years we read German authors, French authors, Hispanic authors, Canadian and African authors. I thought it was interesting and a great education to me, but our son, Bob called it the masochistic book group. Finally someone suggested that we read books that others were reading. So we read Nobel Prize authors in literature and Pulitzer Prize winners.

These books are chosen by the reviewers. I have acquired many recipes from our parties, where we brought favorites for Christmas Luncheons etc. with meetings in Branscomb.

In 2001, seven members of the VWC made a quilt to be

auctioned to support the scholarship fund. It includes, Old Gym, Kirkland, of course, the old engineering building around which is wrapped Owen, Social-Religious building (now Wyatt) and most of all Old Benson Hall where Billy climbed the steps to his third floor office several times each day.



The women did a wonderful job of selecting materials that matched the buildings, even the foundations and the leaves are from trees on campus. The quilters embroidered their names on the back of the quilt—Judy Lefkowitz, Barbara Crooke, Sharon Hogge, Sarah Bell Early, Judith Stabin, Karen Bemin and Ellen White. Billy's birthday was approaching and when I saw it on display, I wanted it very much. It is one of the prized possessions of

I don't go back to **Ada Bell Stapleton**, but **Blanche Henry Weaver** was a good friend for many years. She was a remarkable woman, with a wonderful sense of humor—what stories she could tell. I am so glad that our scholarship fund honors her and Ada Bell.

Virginia Holladay spoke on the Centennial celebrations in 1993. They celebrated all year long. Three members who grew up on the Vanderbilt campus spoke at a monthly meeting. Grace Gardner, Eleanor Morrissey and Libby Zerfoss Fryer. Their memories were priceless. The Gibson girls performed at another meeting. They wore black skirts, white blouses and red plaid taffeta sashes with hat bands to match. They sang Thanks for the *Memories* describing different aspects of the Woman's Club. One verse told about the Holiday Potluck Lunches every year where the food was incredible.

The box lunches were in black shiny boxes tied with pink, satin ribbon. The musical program was performed by the Blair Quartet. **Chancellor Heard** and **Chancellor Branscomb** both attended.

We had committees for everything. The committee chairs worked hard and did a wonderful job. I sent notes and audiotapes to each chair telling them that THEY MADE IT LOVERLY. 20 years ago I dared to sing it. You don't want me to sing now. I had so much fun as chair of the 100th celebration, I'm volunteering for the 200th.


