Opened in 1822, the City Cemetery is an outstanding outdoor museum focusing on the history of Middle Tennessee. This annual Living History Tour enables visitors to see the past "come alive" as costumed local actors recreate some of Nashville's most interesting historical figures. Tours commence at 1pm and new tours start every 15 minutes. We will assemble our group and start our tour at 1pm or soon thereafter. Tours last approximately one hour. <u>Tuesday, October 13th at 10:30am</u>: Tour of the Vanderbilt Fine Arts Gallery led by Joseph Mella, Director and Margaret Walker, Art Curator Assistant. 
