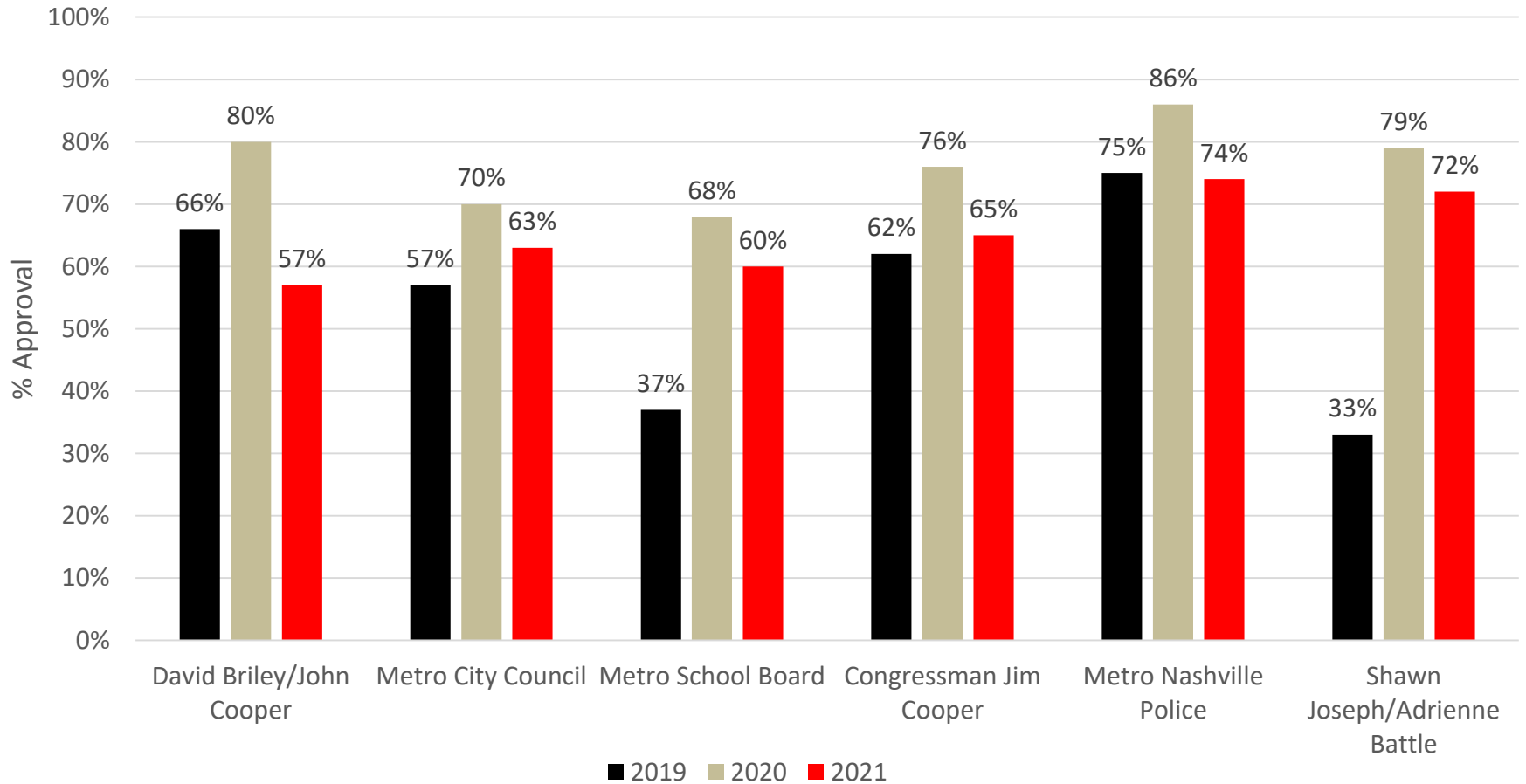

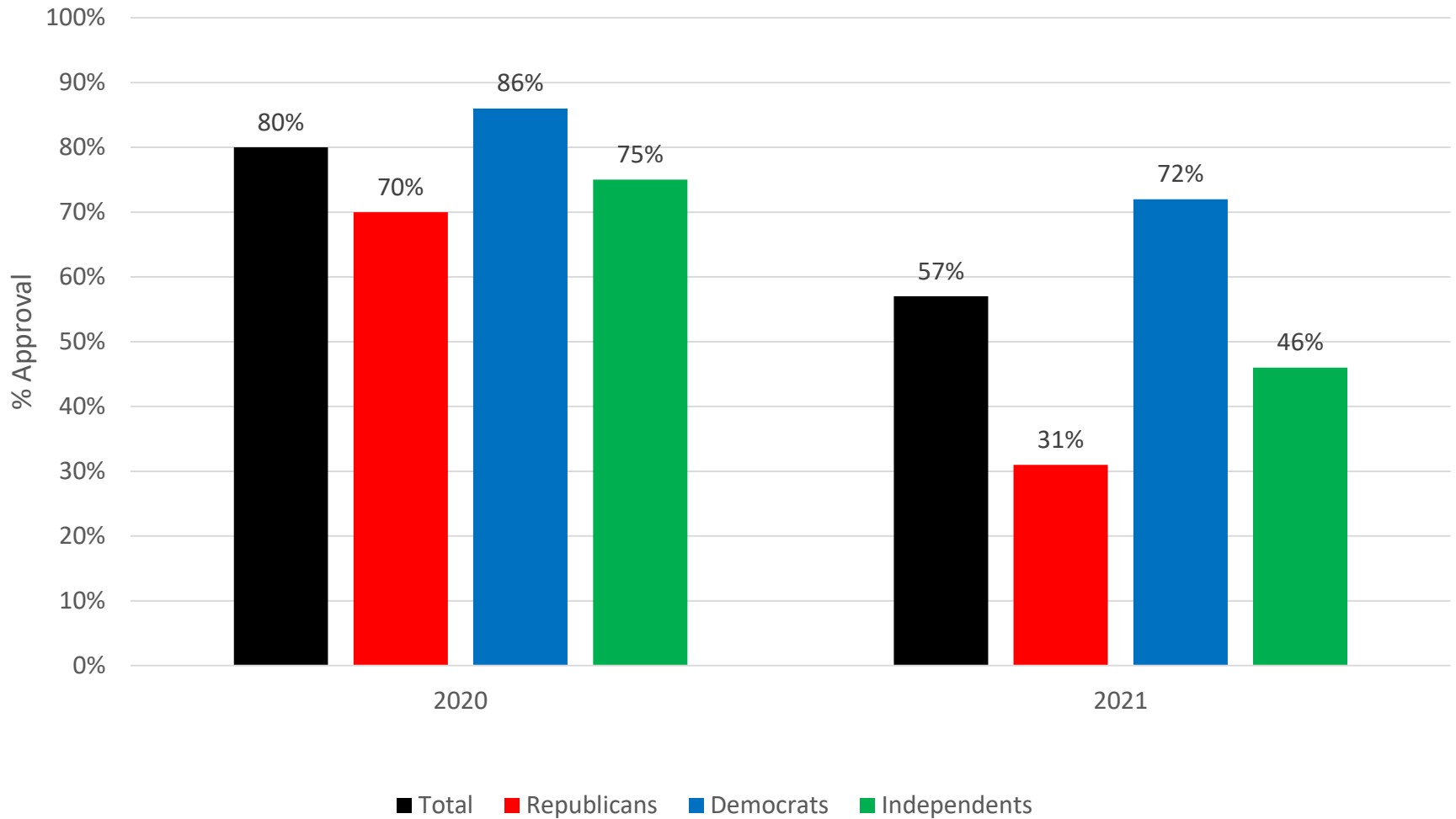

Approval of Nashville's Elected Officials, Institutions Over time

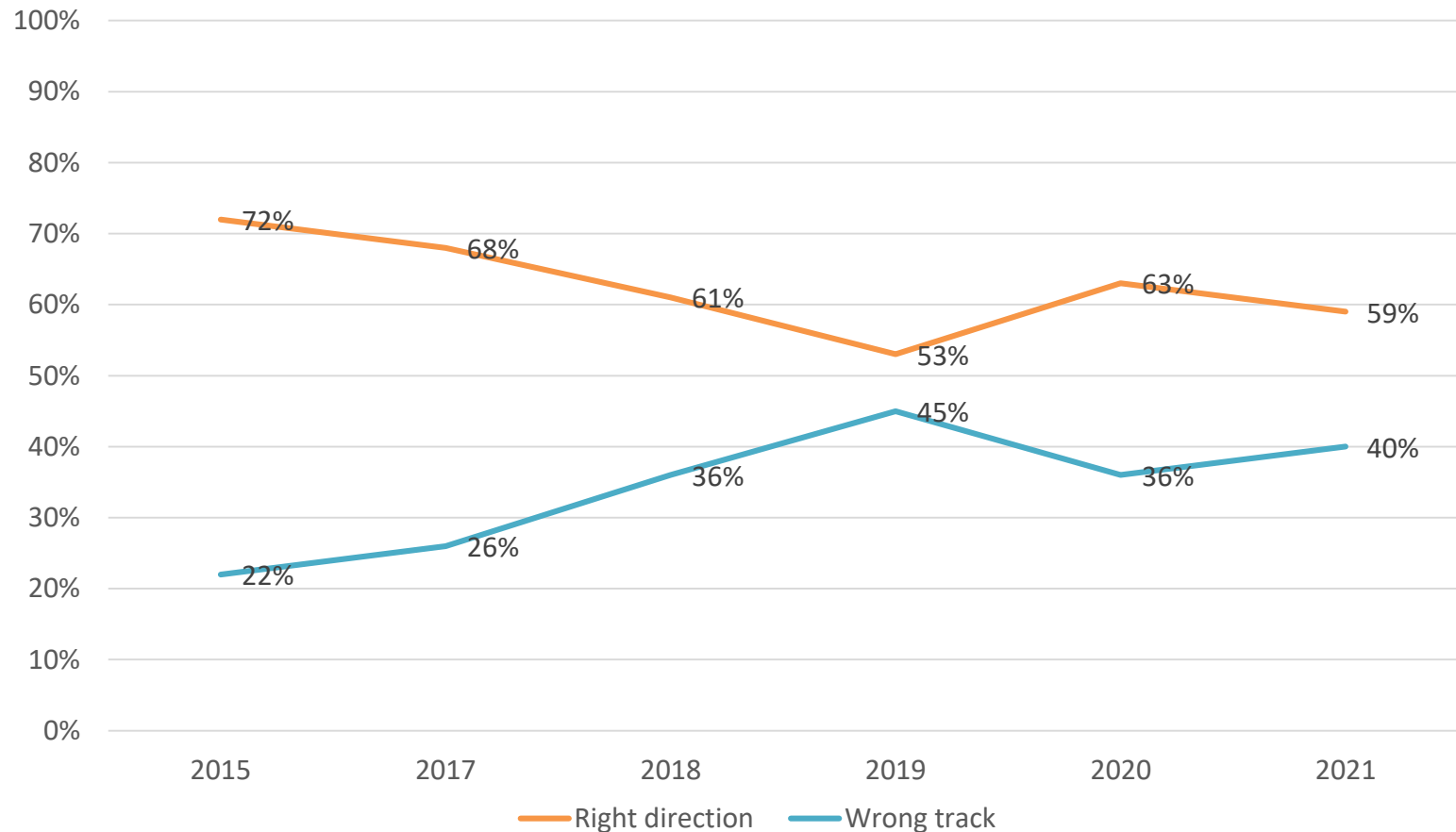


Approval of Mayor John Cooper by Party ID 2020-2021

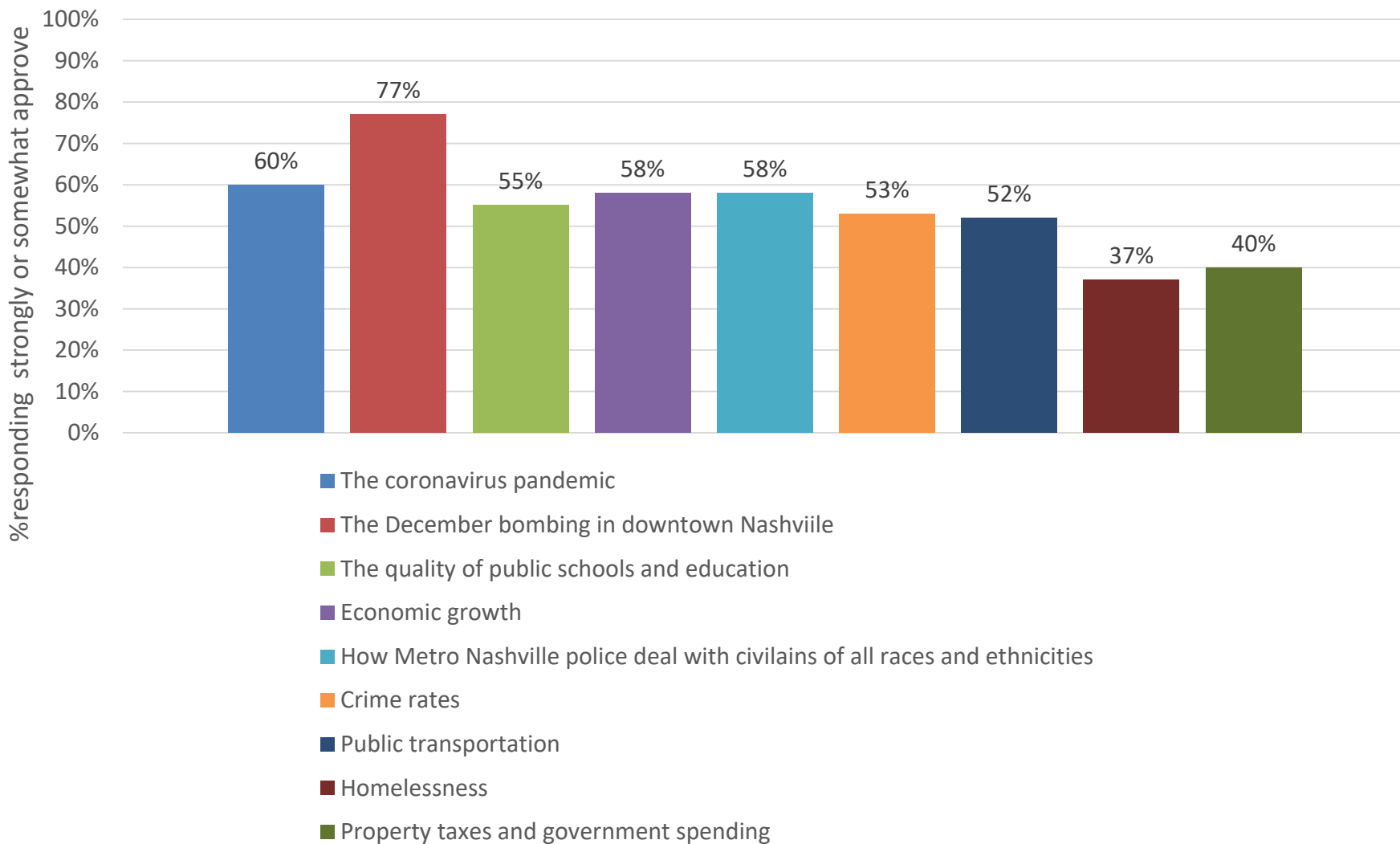


Nashville, Right Direction or Wrong Track over Time

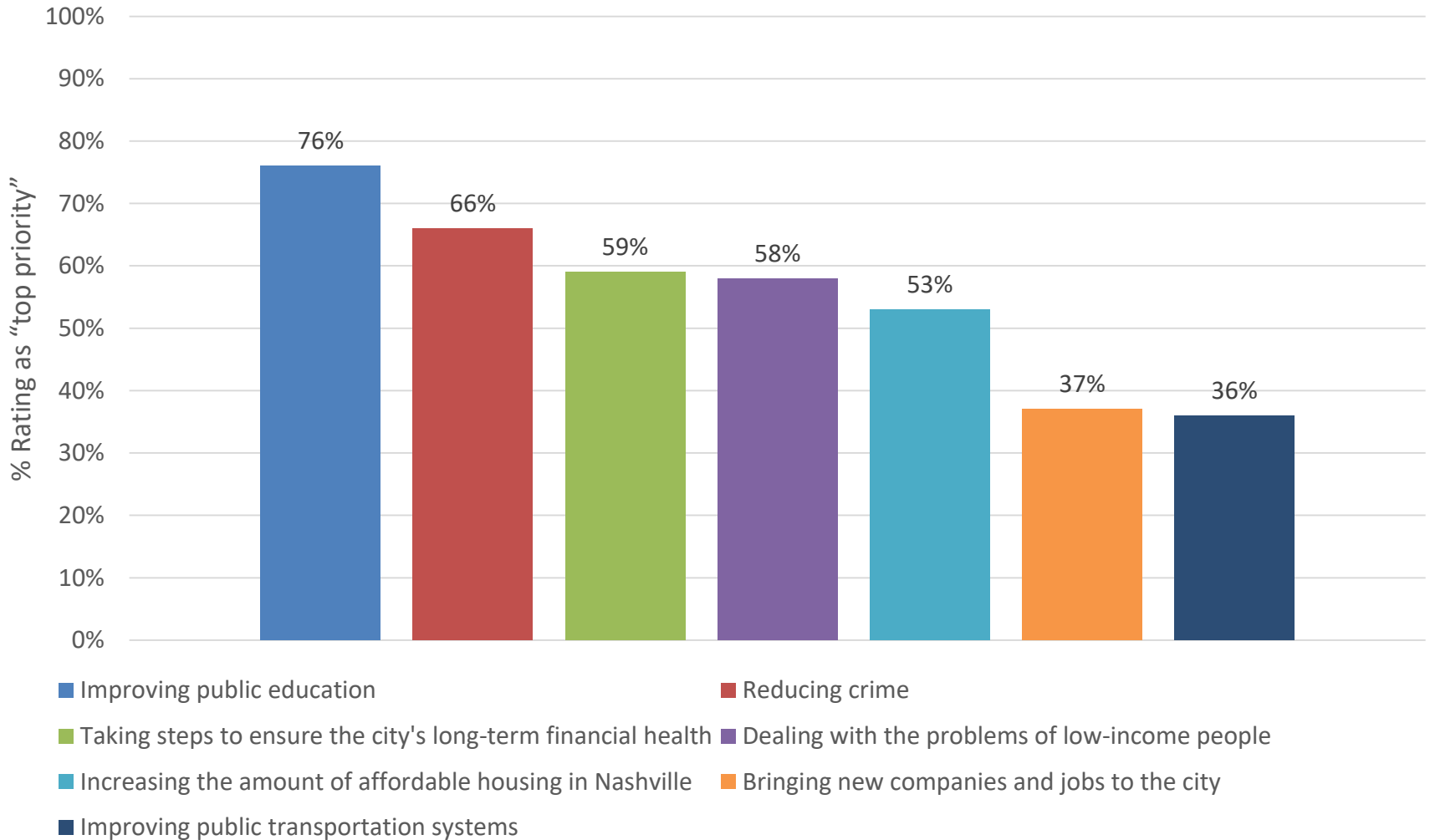
Do you think things in the Nashville area are generally headed in the right direction, or do you feel that things are off on the wrong track?



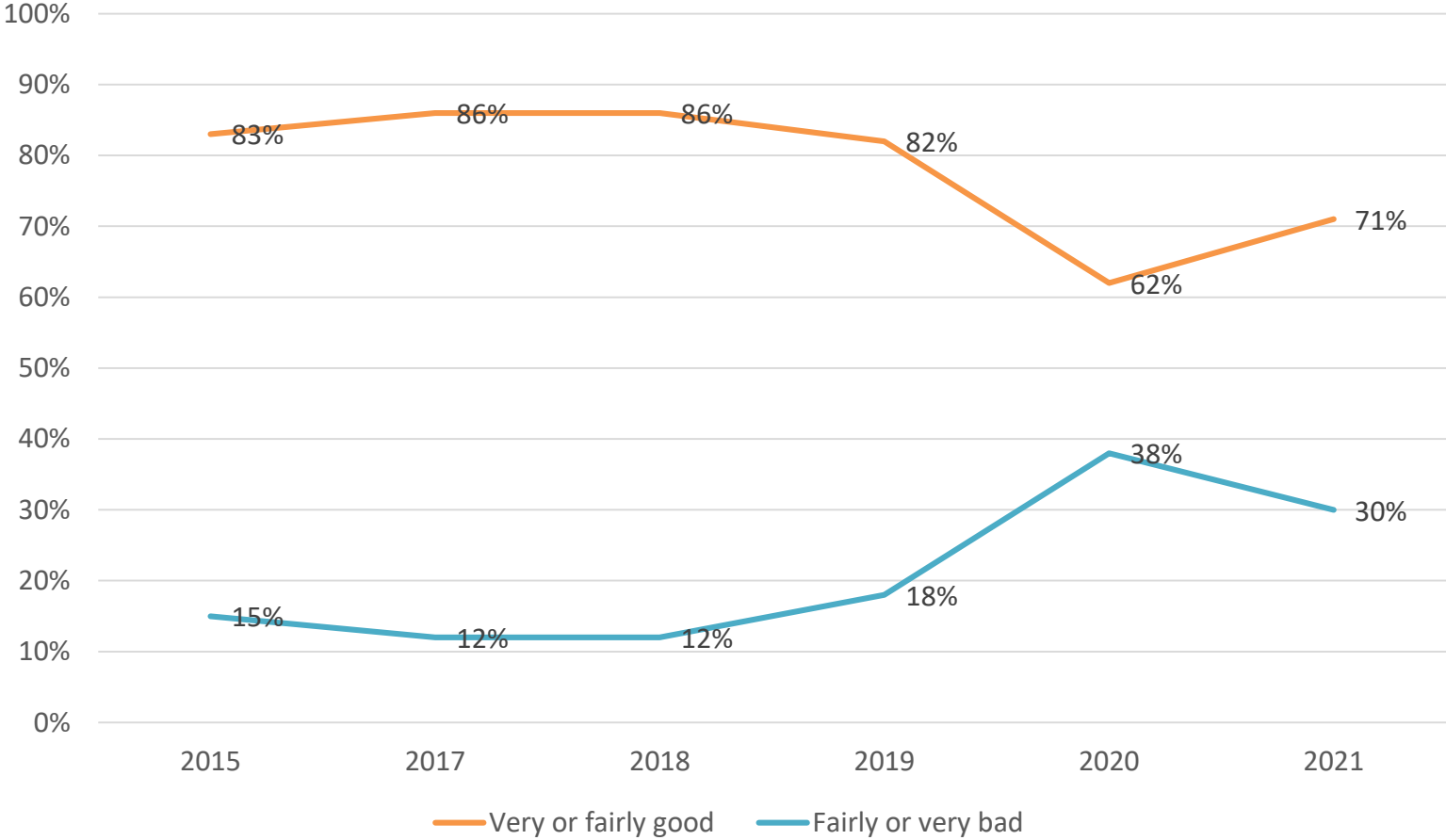
Opinions on How Mayor Cooper is Handling Specific Issues



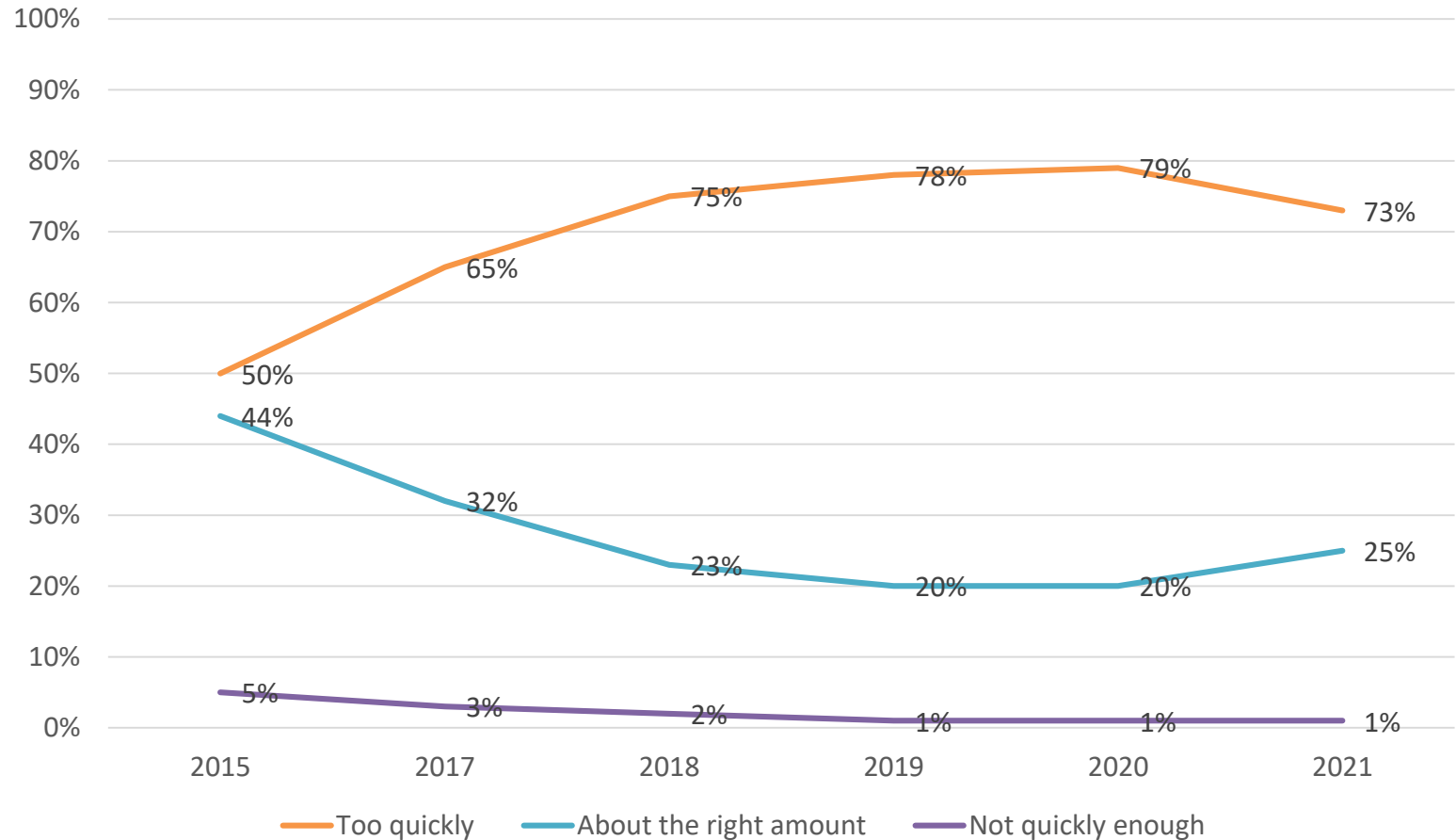

Opinion on Nashville's Economy Over Time



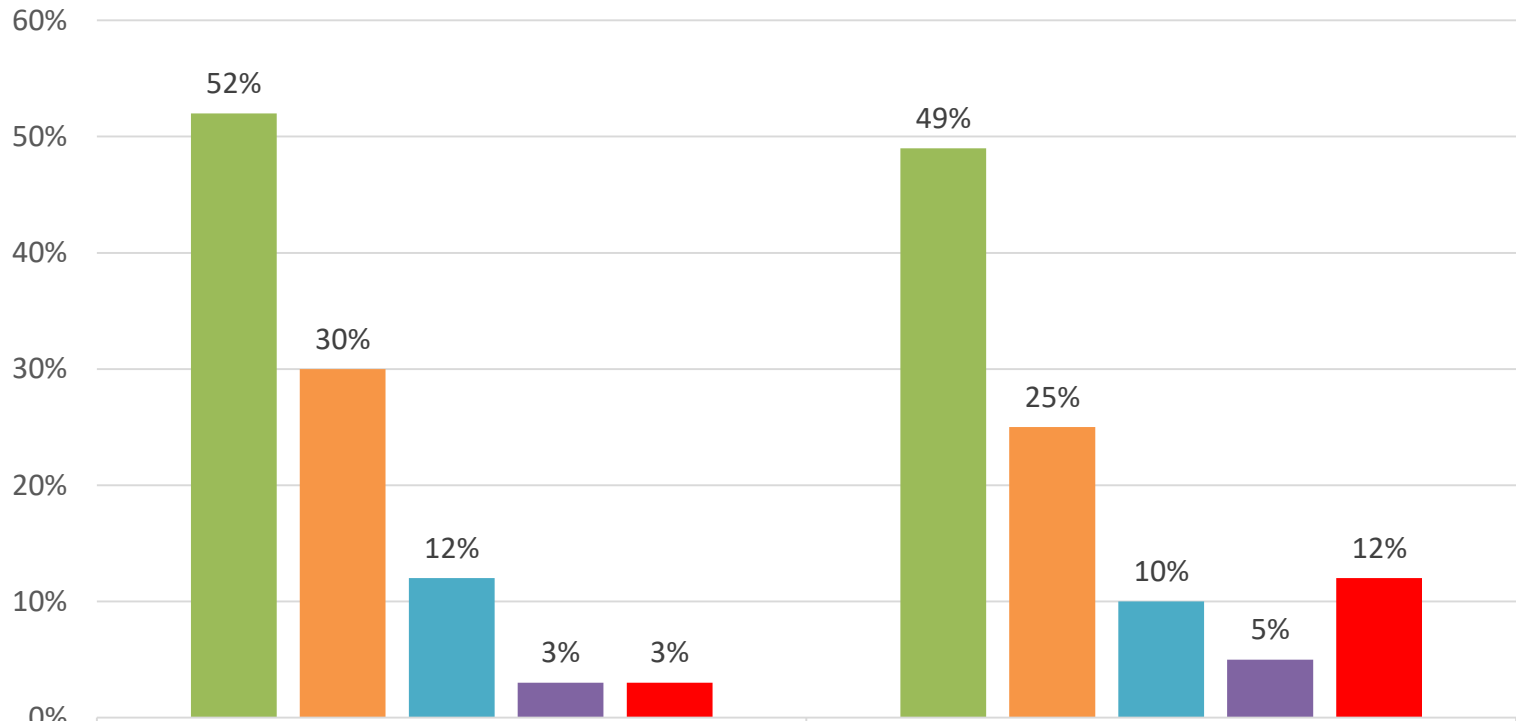
Opinion on Nashville's Population Growth Over Time

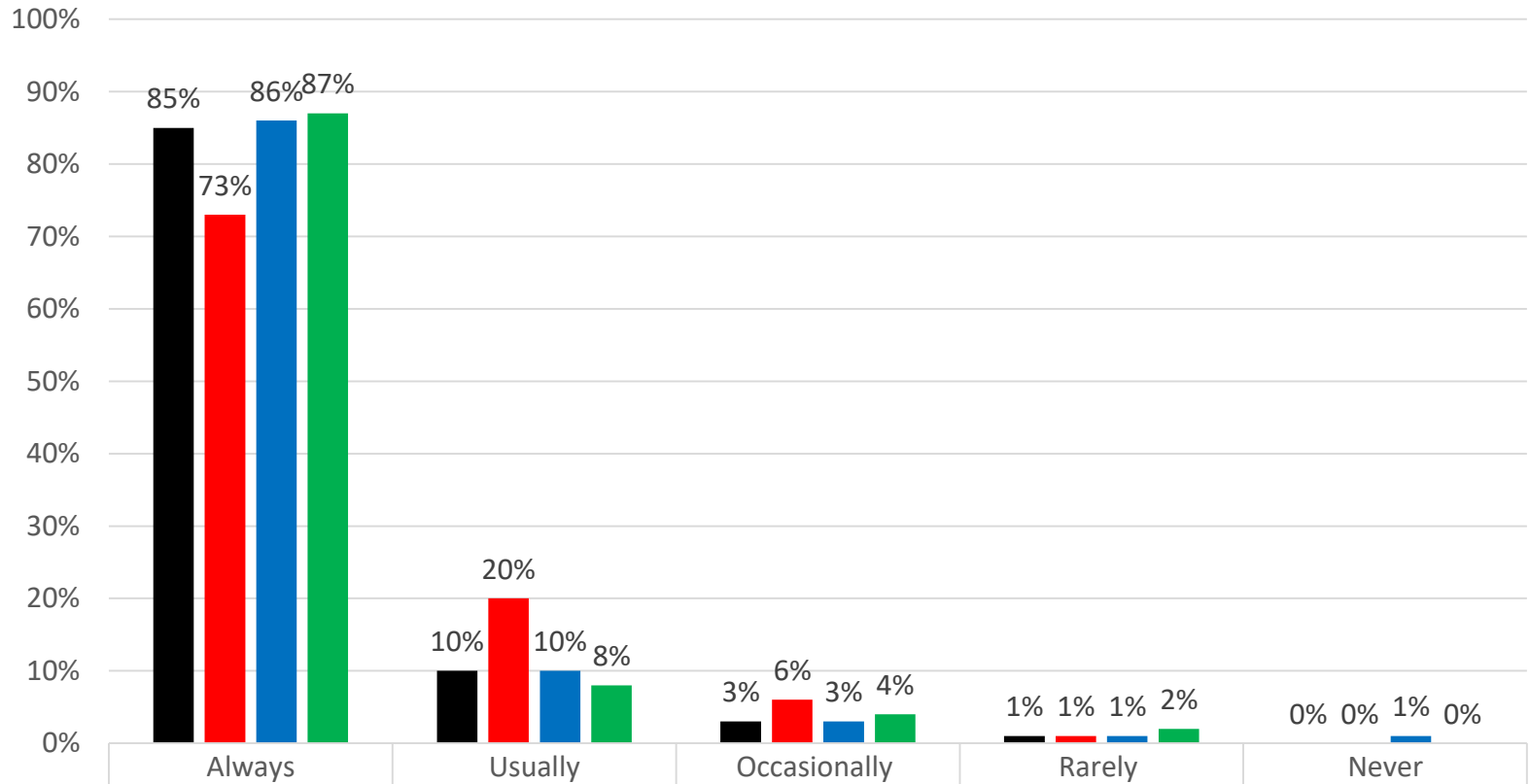
How concerned, if at all, are you that you or someone you know will get sick from the coronavirus?

Mask Usage by Party ID

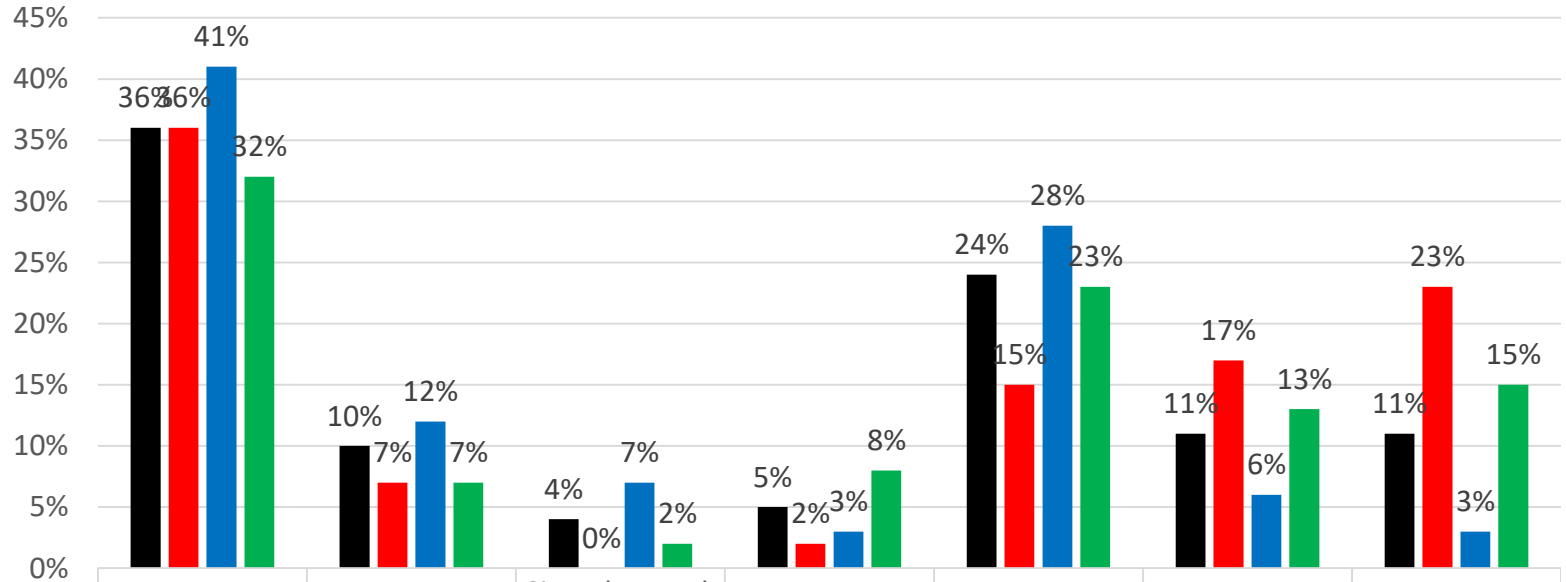
When you go to a store or public places where you encounter other people, how often do you wear a mask or face covering?

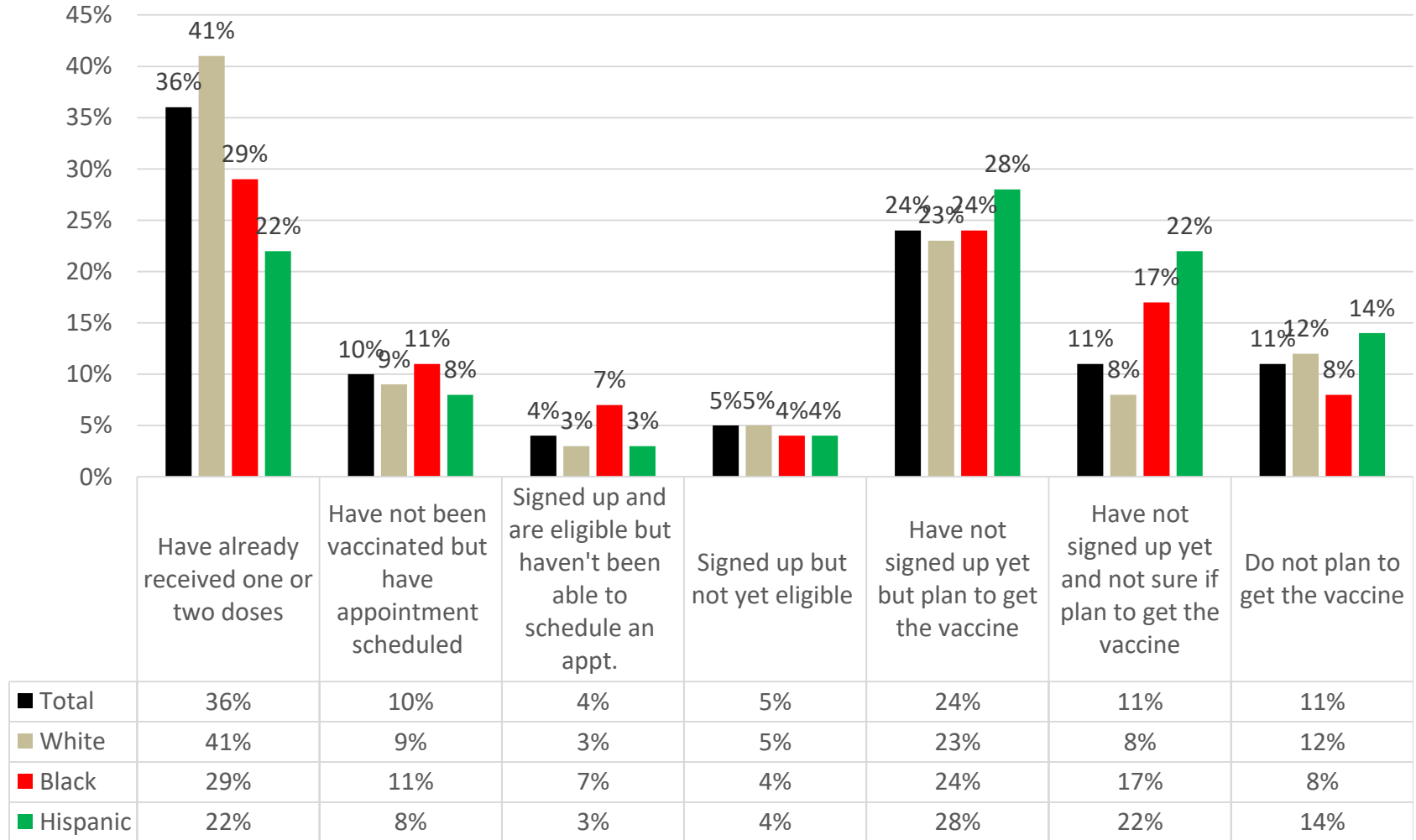

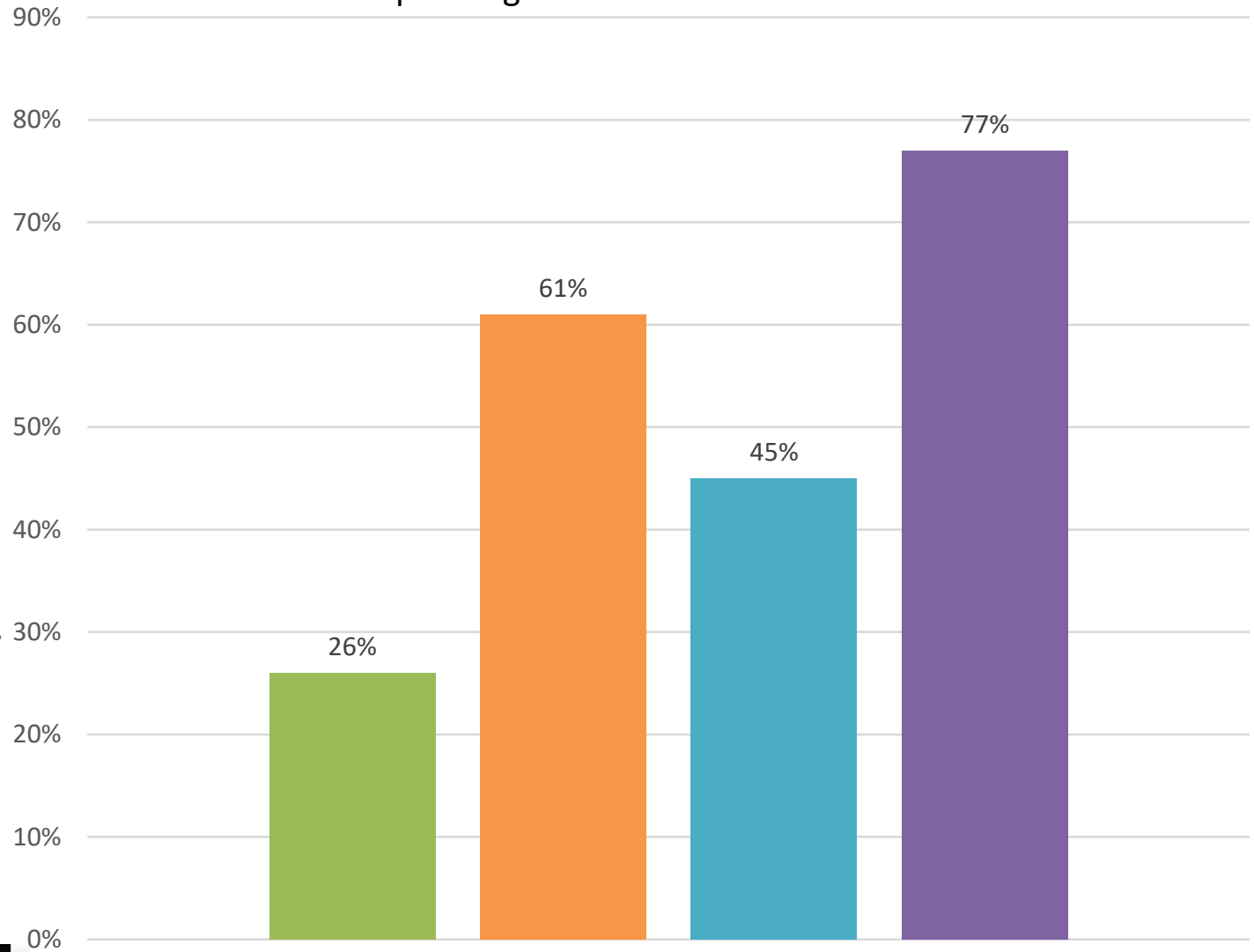

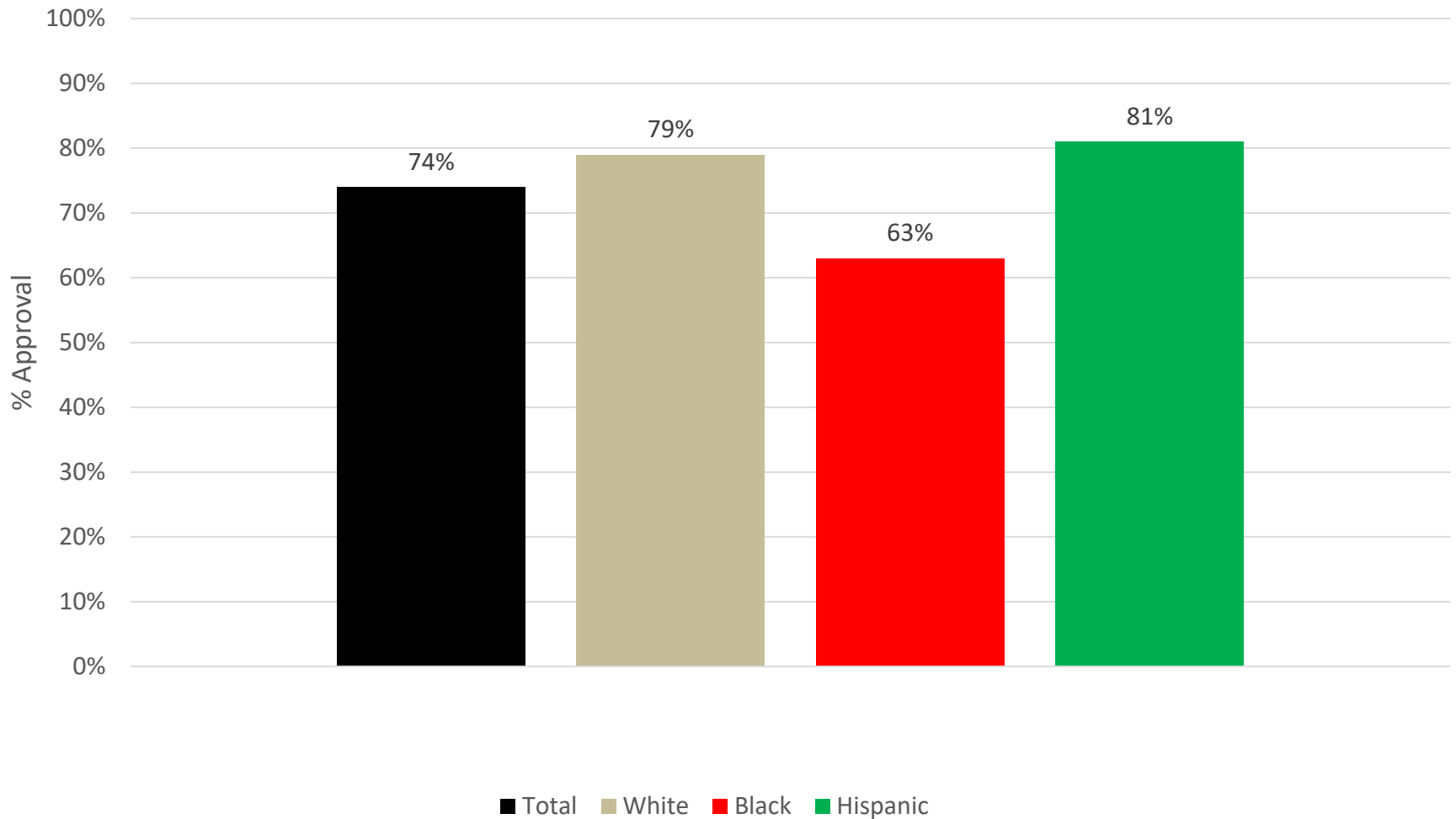

- Regardless of whether or not you plan to get vaccinated, do you know how and where to sign up to receive the coronavirus vaccine?



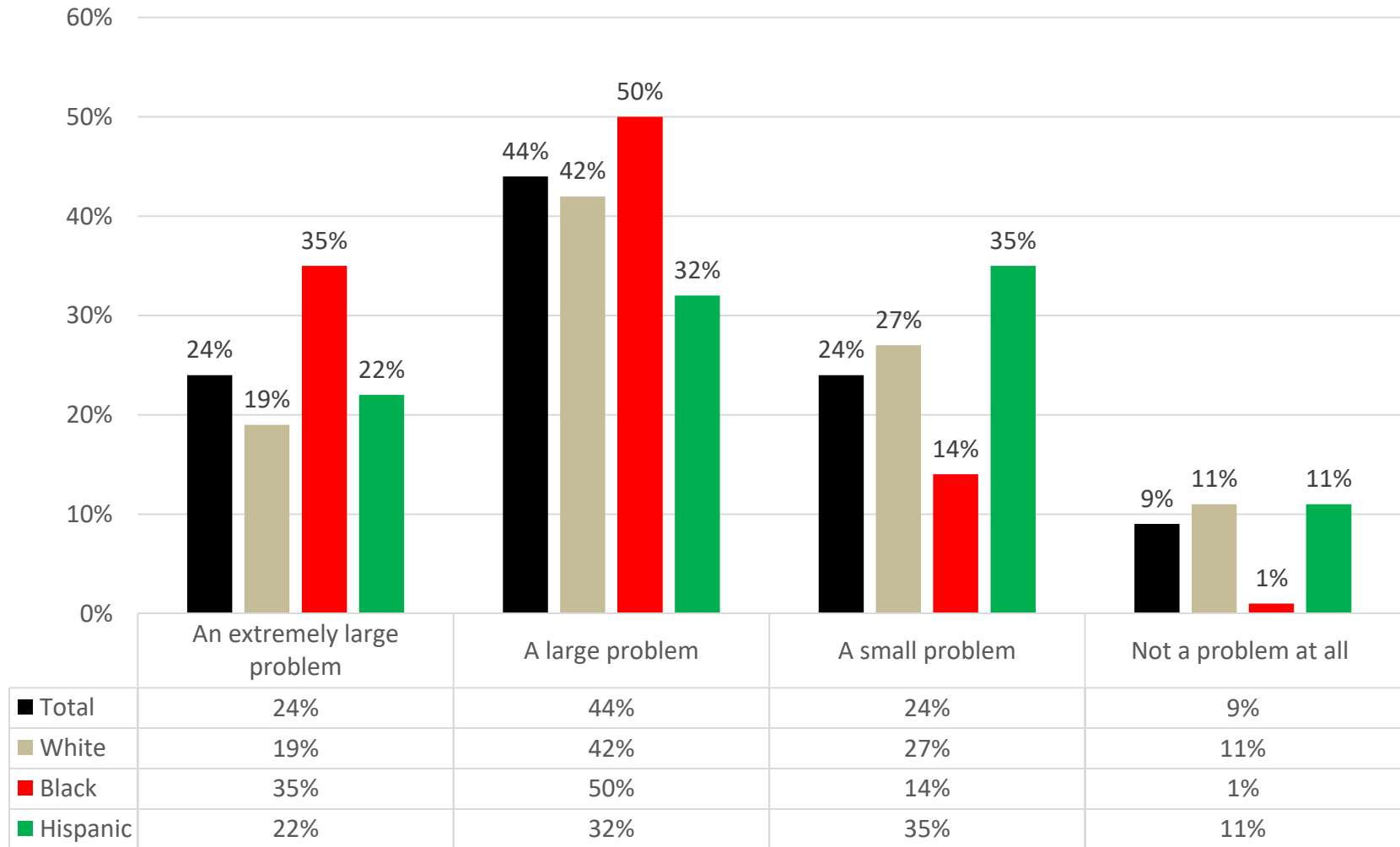

Approval of Metro Nashville Police Department by Race



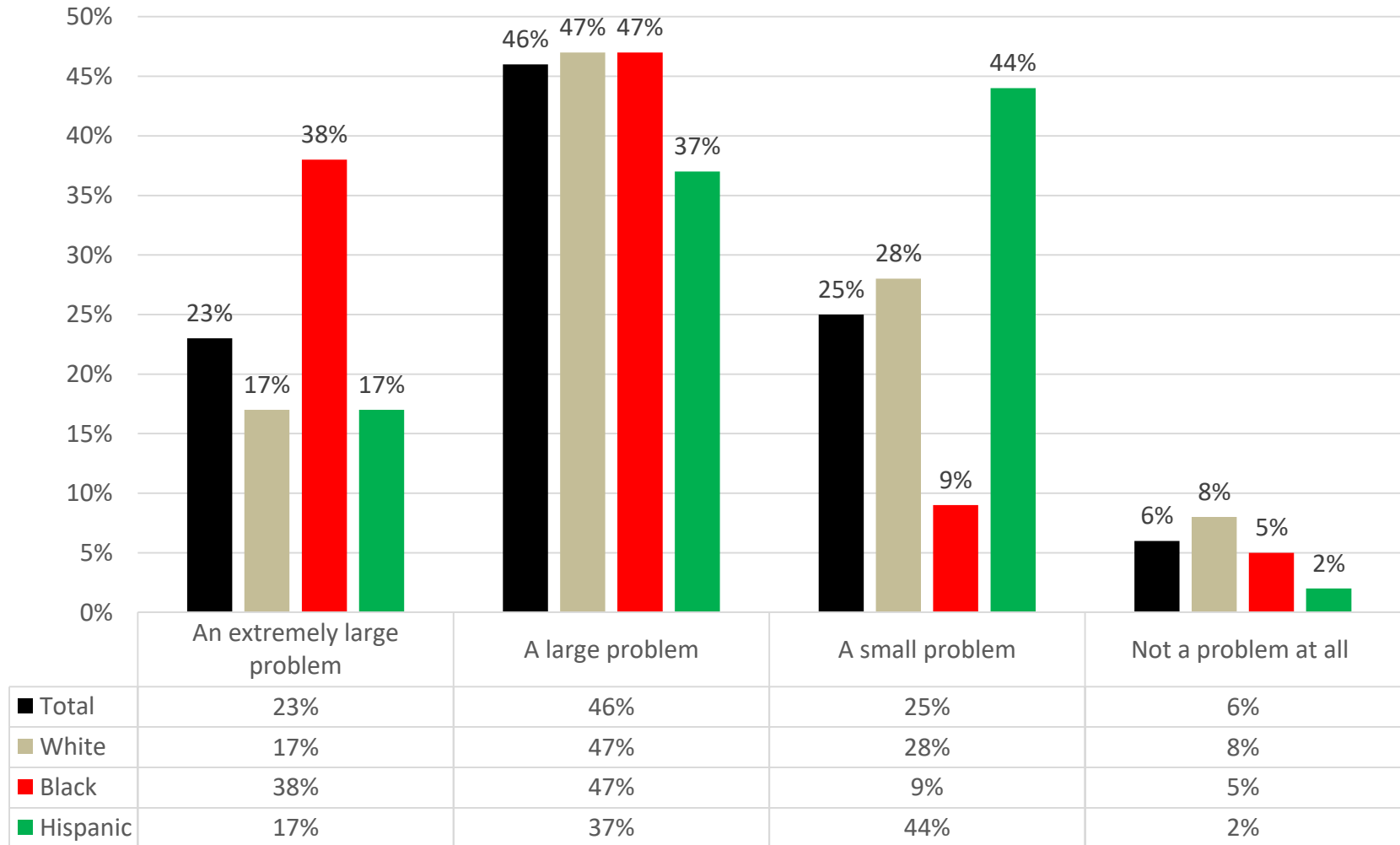
Opinions on Systemic Racism by Race

How much of a problem, if at all, do you think the issue of systemic racism is for the city of Nashville?



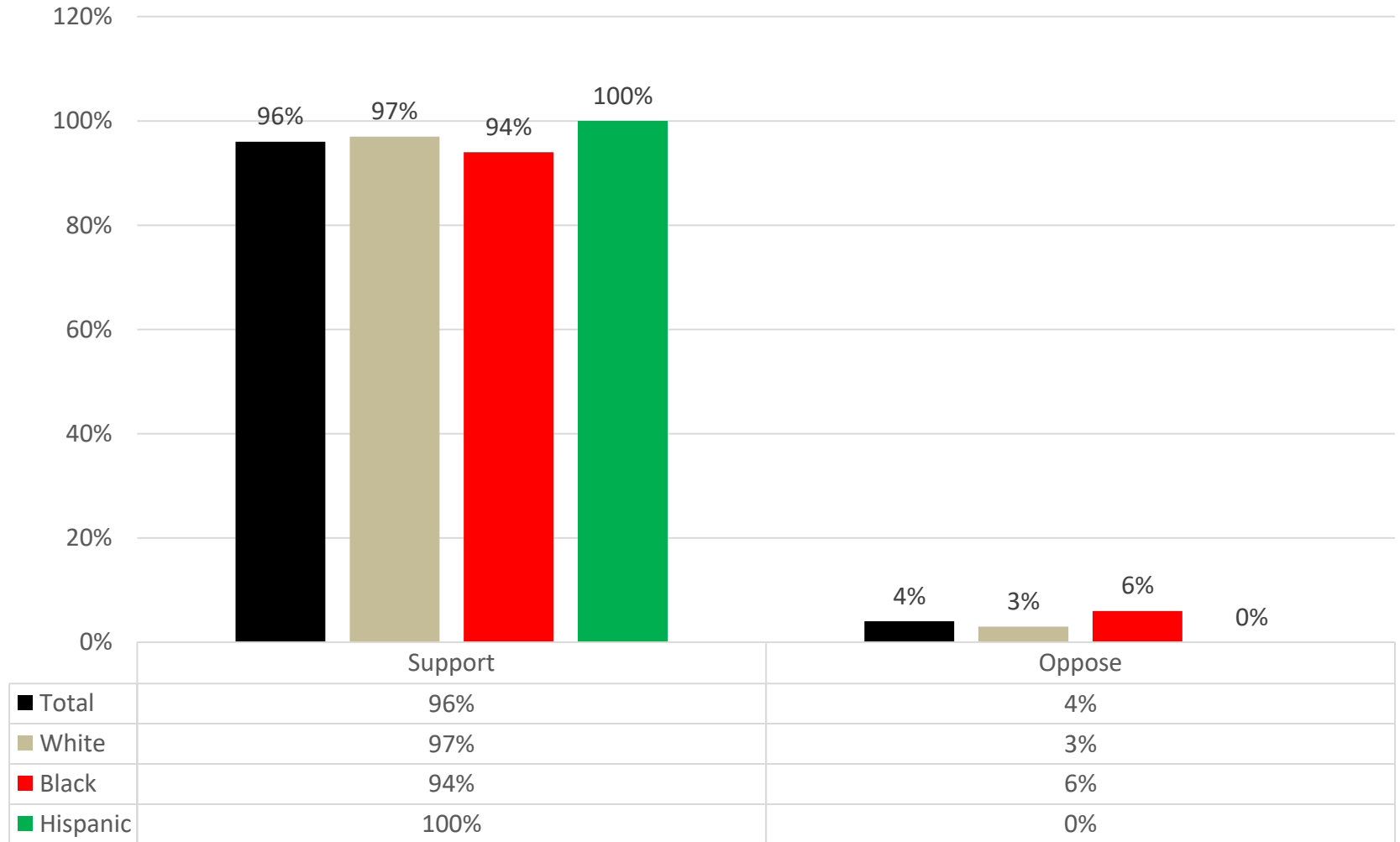
Opinions on Race Relations by Race

How much of a problem, if at all, do you think the issue of race relations is for the city of Nashville?



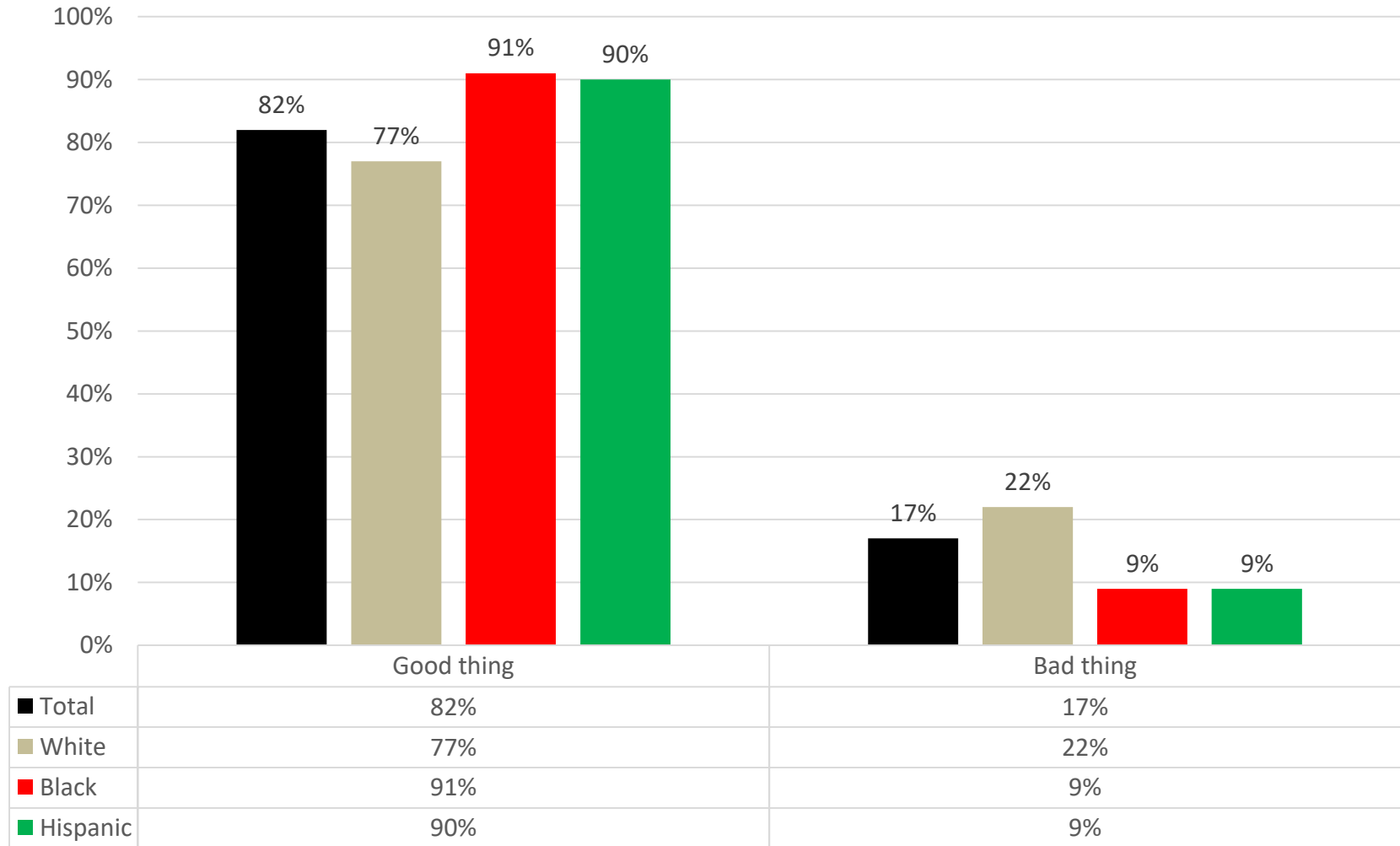
Opinions on Body Cameras by Race

Do you support or oppose the use of body cameras by police that record their interactions with the public?



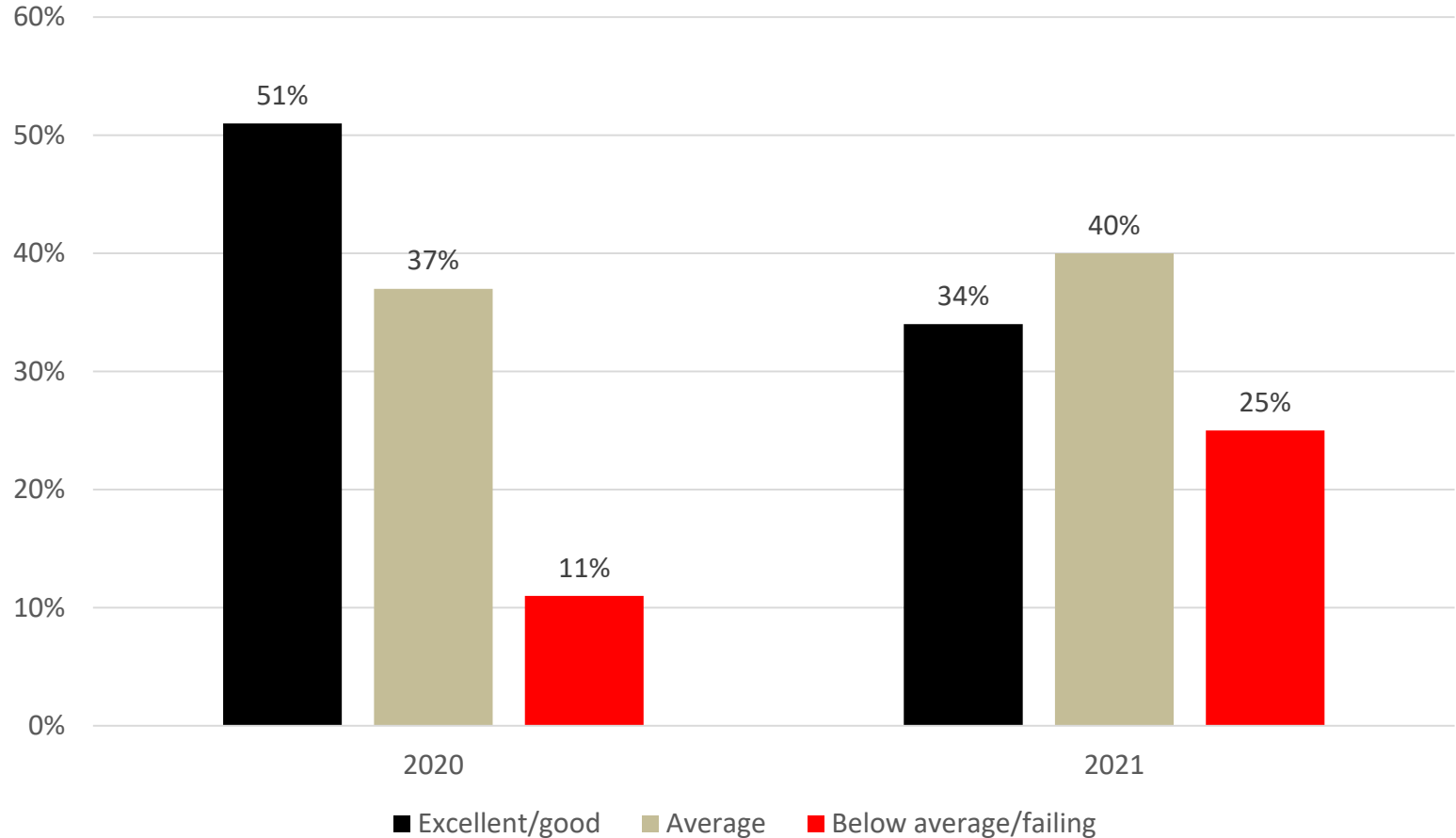
Opinions on a Public Commission to Oversee the Metro Nashville Police by Race

In general, do you think having a public commission to oversee the Metro Nashville Police Department is a good thing or a bad thing for the city?

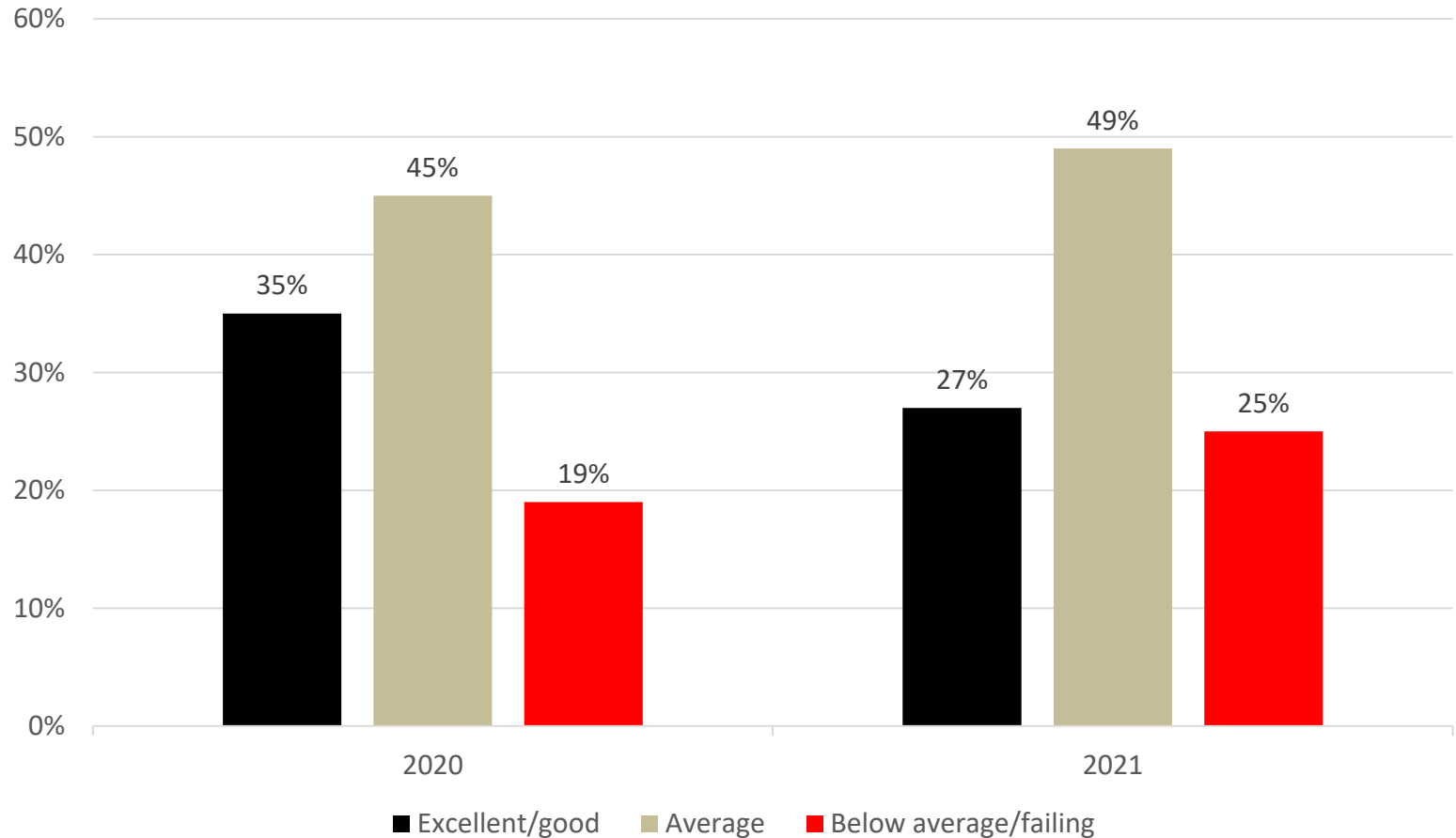

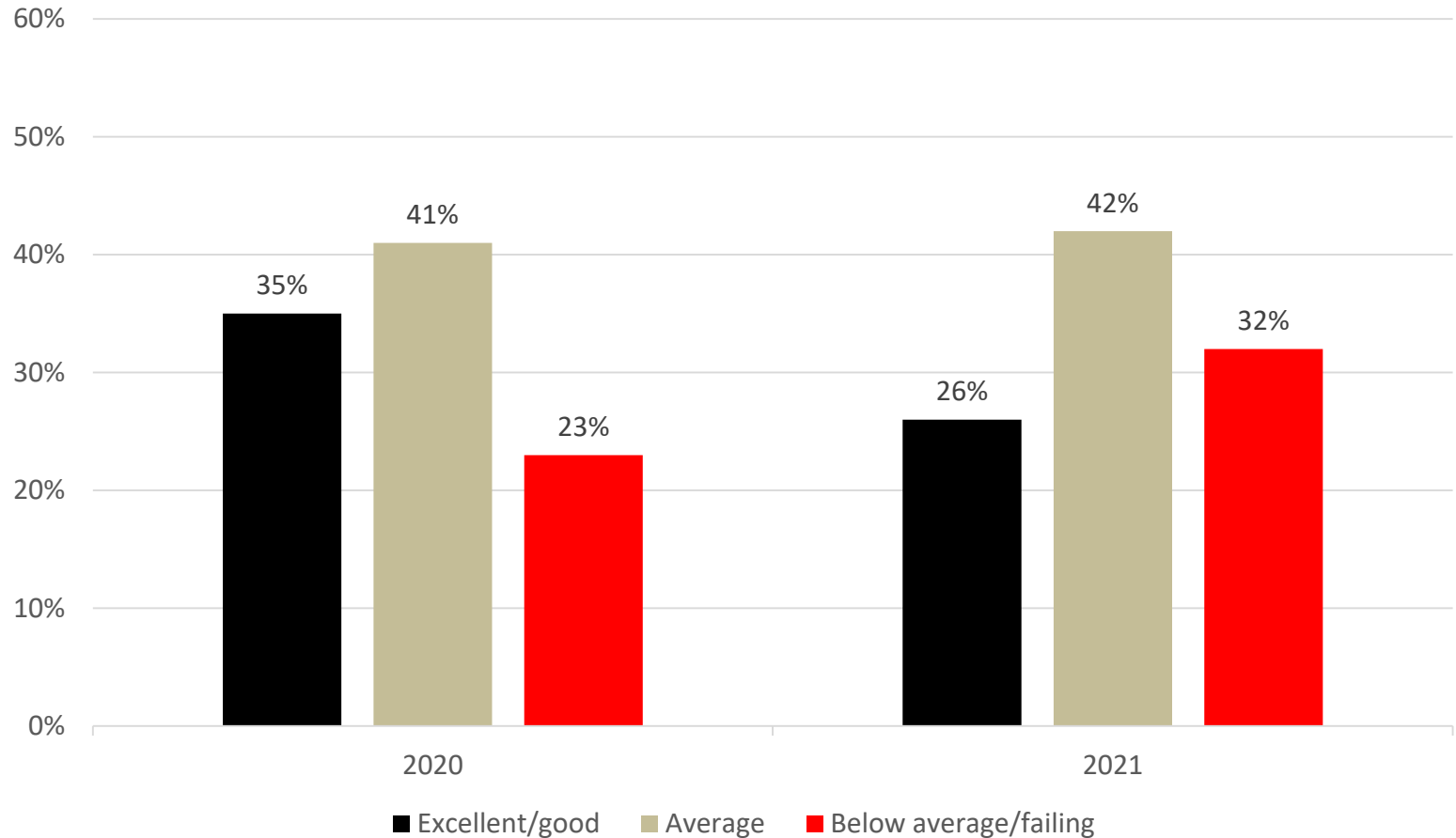
Opinion on Performance of Nashville Public Preschools, Kindergartens & Elementary Schools 2020-2021



Opinion on Performance of Nashville Public Middle Schools 2020-2021

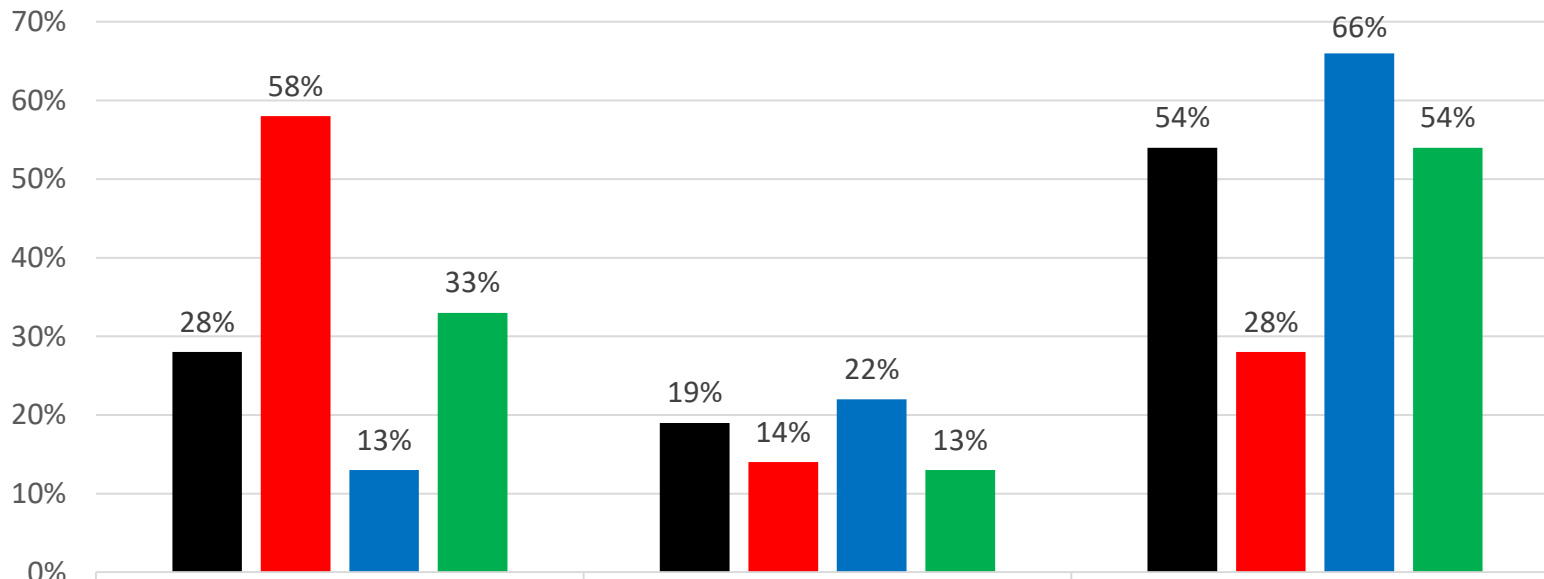
