

2001 Bolivian Military Survey

This survey was carried out in several waves: the first wave was in May 25-August 17, 2001 as part of the Latin America Public Opinion Project of LAPOP. This survey was conducted by the University of Pittsburgh and Encuestas y Estudios under the direction of Dr. Luis Quiroga.

The 2001 survey consisted of face-to-face interviews with members of four respondent groups: air force, army, navy and police members of all ranks. These interviews were evenly conducted across the 3 major Bolivian departments (Cochabamba, La Paz, and Santa Cruz). This special survey has 276 cases.

This survey tackles important subjects such as attitudes toward support for stable democracy, political tolerance, justice administration, the rule of law, corruption, local government, social participation and the national political system among members of the Bolivian armed forces and the national police.
