



The Political Culture of Democracy in Brazil, 2007

This survey was carried out in 2007 as part of the LAPOP AmericasBarometer 2006-2007 wave of surveys. It was conducted by Universidade Federal de Goiás (UFG), with scientific direction being provided by Mitchell A. Seligson.

For the purposes of this survey, the population of interest consisted of all Brazilian citizens, 18 years or older residing in the country. The sample was self weighted and was designed to be representative of the voting population in terms of gender, age and geographic distribution.

The survey was a national probability design, with a total N of 1,214 and the country was stratified into five (5) regions: north, northeastern, mid-west, southeastern and south. The interviews were conducted in 122 sampling units and the respondents were selected in PSUs of 6-8 in urban areas and 10-12 in rural.

The complete sample of 1,214 is composed of 49.5% male respondents and 50.5% female, and its estimated margin of error is ± 2.8 (at the 95% level). The complete questionnaire can be found at www.AmericasBarometer.org.

The 2007 national survey gathered the attitudes of Brazilian citizens towards support for stable democracy, corruption, crime, local governments, social capital and voting behavior.
