



The Political Culture of Democracy in Colombia 2004

This survey was conducted in 2004 as part of the Central America, Mexico and Colombia project of LAPOP. It was conducted by Vanderbilt University and Colombia's CNC (Centro Nacional de Consultoría)

The survey was a national probability design, with a total N of 1,479. It was stratified in 3 stages. The first was cities with more than 300,000 inhabitants and cities with less than 300,000 inhabitants. The second stage strata was by region and finally by urban/rural. Respondents were selected in PSUs of 6-8 respondents in urban areas and 10-12 in rural.

The complete sample of 1,479 is composed of 49.9% female respondents and 50.1% male, all of them over 18 years old and its estimated margin of error is ± 2.6 . The data corresponds with the distribution of adult population obtained by Colombia's National Department for Statistics, DANE. Containing data from 2004, this national survey report analyzes the attitudes of Colombian citizens towards corruption, the rule of law, support for stable democracy, local government, voting behavior, social participation and a special section on human rights and the Colombian armed conflict.

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
