This data was collected from face-to-face, in home interviews, conducted in Costa Rica in 1985. The data come from an unweighted probability sample, using quotas for gender and age at the household level. It contains information collected in the greater Metropolitan and San José area as well as the cities and towns of the Central Valley. The sample framing was the 1984 national population census. The interviews were conducted by the Universidad the Costa Rica, and the sample designer and field work supervisor was Miguel Gómez Barrantes of the Escuela de Estadística.

The questionnaire gathers data on system support, tolerance, political participation and a variety of democratic values.
