



Dominican Republic: Encuesta Nacional de Cultura Política y Democracia (Demos 2004)

This is the fourth of a series of studies carried out in 1994, 1997, 2001 and 2004 respectively. However, the present is a study that differs from the others not only substantially (by covering new themes), but also in perspective: in contrast with its predecessors, Demos 2004 had a regional perspective so that findings could be compared with a group of Latin American countries. For this purpose, the questionnaire that was applied before 2004 was modified to allow the comparison with the other Latin American countries (Costa Rica, El Salvador, México, Colombia, Panamá, Honduras, Guatemala, Bolivia, and Ecuador).

Carried out by El Centro Universitario de Estudios Políticos y Sociales (CUEPS) of the Pontificia Universidad Católica Madre y Maestra and the Centro de Estudios Sociales y Demográficos (CESDEM), this study was based on a national probability sample of 4,460 adults interviewed in a face-to-face mode. The interview lasted about 45 minutes each.

Results of this study are reported in two monographic publications, *Resultados de la IV Encuesta Nacional de Cultura Política y Democracia Demos 2004* and “Apoyo al Sistema Tolerancia y Corrupción en al República Dominicana Perspectivas Comparativas,” by Ramonina Brea, Isis Duarte, and Mitchell Seligson.
