CID Investigaciones, the Costa Rican Gallup associate, ran an omnibus survey in El Salvador. This sample was gathered in September 1991. Mitch Seligson included the following items on municipal governance and partisan preference in this survey: v36, v41-43, v45-46, and v60. This Omnibus survey also covers a number of additional topics such as the 1991 elections, opinion on prominent politicians, and the peace negotiations between the government and the FMLN. The study was conducted nationally, including the following strata: main metropolitan area (the capital city of El Salvador and its surroundings), other Salvadoran cities, and the rest of the country. The first stratum comprises 33.1%, the second one comprises 29% and the third comprises 37.9%, respectively, of the sample observations.

Total number of observations is 1,240, 49.2% female and 50.8% male.
