



The Political Culture of Democracy in Guatemala, 2004

This survey was carried out in 2004 as part of Central America, Mexico and Colombia Project of LAPOP. The fieldwork was carried out by Asociación de Investigación y Estudios Sociales (ASIES) under the direction of Juan Pablo Pira and Max Eduardo Lucas. The overall coordinator of the Guatemala effort was Dinorah Azpuru, with scientific direction being provided by Mitchell A. Seligson.

The survey was a national probability design, with a total N of 1,708. The sample was stratified by region (metropolitan area, northeastern, southeastern, southwestern and northwestern) and by urban/rural and respondents were selected in PUSs of 6-8 in urban areas and 10-12 in rural.

The complete sample of 1,708 is composed of 51% male respondents and 49% female, all of them over 18 years old and its estimated margin of error is ± 2.9 . The sampling frame was the same used in the population and housing census of 2002. Containing data gathered in 2004, this national survey report analyzes the attitudes of Guatemala’s citizens towards local government, support for stable democracy, corruption, local government, social capital and civil participation.
