




2004-2014: ~232,000 interviews



- The only household survey that includes North, Central and South America, and key countries in the Caribbean
- Minimum of 1,500 interviews per country
- Nationally representative, including rural and urban areas
- Face-to-face interviews, conducted in at least 8 languages
- Multiple pre-tests conducted over the course of a year



#### World-Wide Release of 2014 Data: December 1, 2014






















### Life satisfaction has increased in Guyana





# Perception of national economic situation worsened sharply in 2014







Declining political system support (legitimacy) and decreased satisfaction with the way democracy works










# Confidence in "politics" is a key challenge for Guyana

Percent responding "politics" (corruption, poor government and politicians) has increased from less than 15% in 2006 and 2009 to more than 25% in 2014









## The public holds decreasing and low levels of *external* efficacy: government is not perceived to be listening



Those living in the interior and Indo-Guyanese are more likely to say that the government is interested in people like them.





#### Trust in judicial institutions declined, 2012-2014






## Trust in institutions vary in Guyana (2014): Police are trusted the least







#### Trust in the police has decreased over time





# Trust in the police has declined among all main racial/ethnic groups in Guyana, but principally among the Afro-Guyanese









### Summary / Conclusion

- There are some important positive indicators with respect to crime, corruption, life satisfaction in the Guyana AmericasBarometer surveys.
- Yet, economic pessimism has increased significantly and the country scores low on domestic violence and gay rights norms.
- Confidence in politics and political institutions, and satisfaction with the way democracy works, have declined since 2012.
- Indo-Guyanese and the young give better evaluations, on average; those
  in the Georgetown area give lower evaluations, on average.
- Support for judicial and rule of law institutions (esp. the police) has declined, despite bribe solicitation by police remaining constant.
