This survey was carried out in 1996 as a part of the Latin America Public Opinion Project of LAPOP. It was funded by The United States Agency for International Development (USAID) and carried out by CIRD (Centro de Informacion y Recursos para el Desarrollo del Comit e Paraguayo-Kansas).

The survey was a national probability design, with a total N of 1,450. The sample frame was the Population and Housing census conducted in Paraguay in 1992. It was carried out in Spanish and Guaran ı.

The interviews were conducted in 56 municipalities of the 15 departments of Paraguay. The sample was not designed to proportionally represent each department’s population, but to represent the major regions of the country.
