



Peru 1997: National Study

A sample of 1533 respondents was drawn from the adult population through a national multistage probability sampling method. Apoyo, Opinión y Mercados, S.A, among Peru's best known survey research organizations conducted the interviews in a face-to face mode. Funding was generously supplied by The United States Agency for International Development (USAID).

The sample was self weighted and was designed to be representative of the voting population in terms of gender, age and geographic distribution. The complete sample is composed of 49.4% male respondents and 50.6% female, and its estimated margin of error is ± 2.5 (at the 95% level).

Unlike most of the other LAPOP surveys, there is no country report presenting the results of this study. However, results were analyzed in a research study, "Democratic Participation in Peru", written by Julio Carrión, Martín Tanaka, and Patricia Zárate.
