This telephone survey was carried out in 2006 as part of the LAPOP AmericasBarometer 2006 wave of surveys. The field work was conducted by the University of Pittsburgh. Funding was generously supplied by the Center for the Americas.

Because of the high costs of face-to-face interviews in the United States, the survey was conducted via random-digit-dialing phone calls with a total N of 609. Interviews were conducted in Spanish among the Spanish-speakers. The complete questionnaire can be found at www.AmericasBarometer.org. Readers should note that the phone survey format necessarily limited the number of questions that could be included compared to the standard AmericasBarometer survey for 2006.

Unlike most of the other AmericasBarometer surveys, there was no an individual country report presenting the results of this study. However, for the purposes of comparison with the Latin American and Caribbean countries, data from this phone survey were taken into account in the comparative volume, *Challenges to Democracy in Latin America and the Caribbean: Evidence from the AmericasBarometer 2006-2007*.
