

Transfer Credit Course Review

Process facilitated by the Office of the University Registrar

Evaluators:

- 1000- and 2000-level courses offered through the College of Arts and Science; 1000-level courses in all other schools: Credentials Analysts in the URO evaluate these courses per the faculty regulations concerning transfer credit
- All other courses: Directors of Undergraduate Studies in the relevant academic department evaluate these courses per the faculty regulations concerning transfer credit in their schools

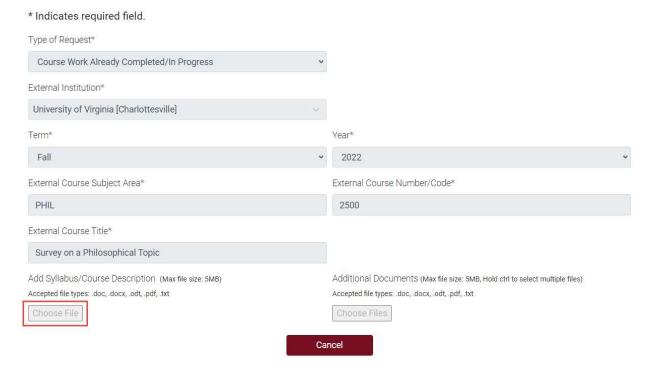


Course Review

YES Transfer Credit Application

- External Education Team verifies course meets faculty transfer credit policies (qualifying grade, accredited institution, etc.)
 - Requires official transcript reflecting qualifying grade
- External Education Team enters course information into YES Transfer Credit application
 - Team will contact you if there is not sufficient information for the transfer credit review process
 - You may be asked to enter or edit course information in YES Transfer Credit application (usually to provide a course syllabus)

Equivalency Determination

- Syllabus/course description review to determine credit equivalence
 - Equivalent credit means the course is comparable to a course offering at Vanderbilt
 - Non-equivalent credit:
 - Departmental non-equivalent; counts toward the major or minor
 - Departmental non-equivalent; does not count toward the major/minor
 - General Elective credit
 - Non-equivalent credit is also reviewed for CORE attributes; equivalent credit carries the CORE attribute(s) of the Vanderbilt course
- Evaluation information entered into student information system and visible in YES Transfer Credit Search Tool
 - You will receive an email with the evaluation information
 - CORE attributes are not listed in the Search Tool
- Evaluations remain on file for five years unless there is a significant change to the course at Vanderbilt or the other institution

Transfer Credit Search in YES



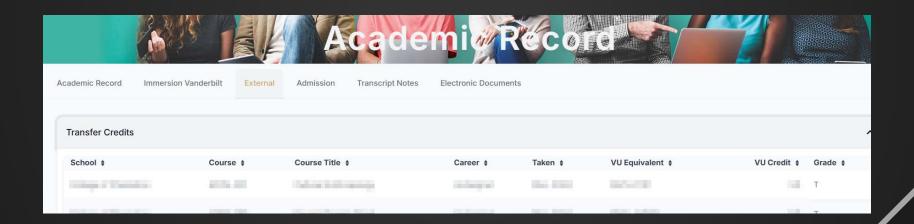
NOTE for Current Vanderbilt Students: If you wish to earn transfer credit for a course taken elsewhere, you will need to submit the course for review through the Transfer Credit application in YES even if it is listed in the Transfer Credit Search tool.

Credits Posted to the Student Record

- Upon posting, transfer credit is viewable in YES in the Academic Record application and appears in the Degree Audit application
- Process is iterative; credits are bundled together and posted as we are able—that is, not all credits will be posted at the same time



Additional Reviews

- As credits are posted, the URO also reviews for changes to expected graduation term and class standing
- Class standing rules vary by student's school and may not be related only to the number of credit hours you have earned
- Updates happen throughout the posting process—what you see today is not necessarily what your final standing will be

Change of Major/School

- Students can utilize the Major/Minor Declaration/Change form. See https://registrar.vanderbilt.edu/registration/forms.php.
- Students who wish to transfer into a new school at Vanderbilt can submit an application for Intra-University Transfer: https://registrar.vanderbilt.edu/intra-university-transfers/index.php.
 Applications are reviewed at the end of the semester. Per the undergraduate catalog:
 - Students who transferred to Vanderbilt from another institution are eligible for intra-university transfer after having completed at least one full semester at Vanderbilt and having achieved sophomore standing.
- For both forms, I recommend waiting until classes start before submitting.
