

The mission of the **Vanderbilt Woman's Club** is to bring together the women of Vanderbilt University; provide an opportunity for intellectual, cultural and social activities within the community and the University; support and assist the mission of the University; and sponsor the Vanderbilt Woman's Club Stapleton/Weaver Endowed Scholarship through fundraising. The late Margaret Branscomb, wife of Chancellor Harvie Branscomb, was responsible for the major plantings of the magnolia trees on campus. The naming of the newsletter honors her.



Did you know?

Vanderbilt Woman's Club has supported students from the club's inception in 1893. In the beginning by giving students loans and now scholarships. Our scholarship fund was officially named in 1954 after Ada Bell Stapleton, Vanderbilt's first official female faculty. She was hired in 1925 to be Professor of Literature and Dean of Women. (See the letter from our archives.) During our centennial year in 1993, Blanche Henry Weaver's name was added to the fund. She was also a Dean of Women, a past VWC President and professor of History at



Vanderbilt. Thus, the Stapleton Weaver scholarship was born. In January 2015 the club voted to award \$5,000 per year for four years giving our recipients \$20,000 over 4 years. Our current goal is to be able to give 4 scholarships and have a recipient in each year. *Joy Allington-Baum*
