VWC Fall Lecture:

Update on Memory Loss and Alzheimer's Disease: Keep a Twinkle in your Wrinkle

Dr. Katherine Gifford is a clinical neuropsychologist and an Assistant Professor in the Department of Neurology at Vanderbilt University Medical Center. Dr. Gifford sees patients within the Cognitive and Behavioral Clinic at Vanderbilt University Medical Center. Dr. Gifford's research focuses on disorders of aging, dementia, and developing tools for early detection of cognitive impairment. Her research includes a specific emphasis on understanding subjective cognitive decline in older adults, or when people start to notice changes in their own memory and thinking. She is involved in independent and collaborative research projects within the Vanderbilt Memory & Alzheimer's Center.

Patti Harris - our first Associate Member

I was born in Pecos, TX, because there was no hospital in Wink. The next four years our family moved to Oklahoma, Illinois and Wyoming; as my father was part of the drilling crews on oil rigs. By the age of five we were back in Texas. I went through school in Houston, where I eventually started my higher education. All those early years prepared me for a life full of raising five children. Following that began a career in academia from Rice University (3 years) and the University of Chicago (16 years). During this period, I worked in the travel industry and opened my own agency. I am lucky to have visited every continent. Don't ever ask me which was my favorite. I am so glad to be a part of such a vibrant organization. Amen!!!

In all of this I did not mention that I attended classes at Wheaton College (Billy Graham's alma mater) and the University of Iowa. I could have graduated at some point if all my credits would transfer; but, why? I was doing what I loved. All I did in Dallas was volunteer at a Food Pantry and play a lot of tennis....and travel, as I continued to work at a friend's agency.
